ELLIOTT NATHANSON RECOGNIZED



Surrounded by members of the Veteran's Committee, long-time member Elliott Nathanson was recognized for his service to our country. Elliott served in the U S Navy from 1965 to 1969. During that time he did three tours in Vietnam where he earned a Purple Heart medal. He was also the recipient of the following awards: Vietnam Service Medal with One Bronze Star, Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medial with Device, Secretary of the Navy

Meritorious Unit Command Combat Action Ribbon, Meritorious Unit Commendation Medal, and National Defense Service Medal.

On this special evening, February 16, Elliott was presented the Eagle Head Cane on behalf of the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post in Windham. He was also presented with a Quilt of Valor made by the Quilts of Valor Foundation. The Foundation's mission is to cover all combat service members and veterans touched by war with comfort and healing. As of December 31, 373,394 Quilts of Valor have been awarded to veterans and service members across the country.




