Legal Empowerment


Collaboration with lawyers and civil society organisations to raise legal knowledge and enable communities to exercise their rights.

The Drishti Project aims to bridge the gap between prosperous and impoverished children by equipping them with critical life skills. Through this programme, we are committed to empowering children from marginalised groups, allowing them to take key opportunities for a better future. Our focus goes beyond academic education to include personality development, ensuring each child has the confidence, resilience, and skills needed to flourish in an increasingly competitive environment. By closing this gap, we provide the groundwork for a more equal society in which all children can reach their full potential and live a life with equal opportunities.



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Vear at Glance With SOcial

- Hamari Pahchan NGO organised an event in Bhanwar Singh Camp to raise awareness about air pollution's causes and effects, attended by approximately 20 children. Expert speakers discussed pollution sources and health effects, urging action like carpooling and using energy-efficient appliances. Interactive exhibits and workshops engaged attendees in learning about pollution prevention and proper waste disposal
- Hamari Pahchan NGO conducted a practical class teaching children to craft useful items from waste. Emphasizing the three Rs—reduce, recycle, and reuse—participants learned to create reusable goods for a sustainable future.
- We hosted a workshop on waste segregation for underprivileged children in Bhanwar Singh Camp. The session aimed to educate them about waste management's importance and its environmental benefits.
- An intern led a workshop on the five human senses, facilitated by Hirdiya. It aimed to explain the functions of sight, hearing, taste, smell, and touch through interactive methods.
- Our team conducted a weekly class on India's map for underprivileged children at Bhanwar Singh Camp. With 18–19 attendees, we engaged them with interactive learning activities.
- Verb class was held at Arjun Camp, Mahipalpur for underprivileged children. They learned about verb types, forms, and sentence integration, emphasising fluency and accuracy. Activities included 'dumb charades' and discussions.
- We hosted a workshop on innovation and creativity for underprivileged children at Bhanwar Singh Camp. Through brainstorming sessions, design activities, and inspirational stories, we aimed to foster their creativity and problem-solving skills.
- A class was conducted in Arjun Camp, Mahipalpur for underprivileged children, teaching them English introductions. It's vital for communication, social interaction, and professional and travel experiences.



Vear at Glance With SOcial Enterpreneurs

- Hamari Pahchan NGO hosted a "Stress Management" workshop for students aged 12-15 at Bhanwar Singh Camp. Facilitated by intern Ananya, it provided insights and techniques for effective stress management.
- Science and Technology Workshop: Introducing children to advancements in science and technology to broaden their knowledge and possibilities.
- Sports Education Workshop: Encouraging physical activity and sports participation for overall health and wellbeing.
- Meditation Workshop: Providing tools for relaxation and mindfulness to promote emotional and mental balance.
- Art and Craft Workshop: Fostering creativity and self-expression through artistic endeavours.
- Guitar Lesson was held to teach children how to play the guitar. During the event, children expressed interest in music, enthusiastic about learning something new.
- We organised a Karate workshop for underprivileged children in Vasant Vihar's slums, aiming to teach selfdefence, discipline, confidence, and fitness through Karate. Facilitated by trained instructors from our organization, the workshop began with a warm-up session, followed by structured lessons in basic Karate techniques. The children enthusiastically engaged in the activities, showing a keen interest in mastering the martial arts. The workshop proved transformative, equipping children with self-defence skills, discipline, and confidence. It also fostered camaraderie and mutual respect among participants, creating a supportive environment for growth and empowerment.

Year at Glance with Social Enterpreneurs

- Our team hosted a workshop at Bhanwar Singh Camp, empowering underprivileged women for independence. Activities included financial literacy, entrepreneurship guidance, and self-empowerment sessions.
- Renu led the sewing program, teaching Croatian techniques. A dedicated trainer expands their skills. Participants learned felt wool cutting and bag making. They improved coaster quality and crafted corporate kits. Ongoing training continues, with remuneration.
- our organisation hosted an empowering session for women at Bhanwar Singh Camp. Led by professionals and volunteers, the session fostered collaboration and support. Participants were left equipped with valuable skills and insights, ready to navigate challenges and pursue their goals with confidence.
- Hamari Pahchan NGO conducted a women empowerment workshop led by intern Simra at Bhanwar Singh Camp, promoting gender equality and nursing as a rewarding profession.

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The initiative, launched in 2020, aimed to destigmatise menstruation and enhance menstrual hygiene through the distribution of sanitary pads and kits. Over time, it expanded to include educational sessions for underprivileged girls and women on maintaining intimate hygiene and introducing eco-friendly alternatives like menstrual cups. These sessions also focus on raising awareness and debunking myths surrounding menstruation. However, our commitment doesn't stop there. We're dedicated to ensuring the sustainability of this project and providing women with livelihood opportunities. Currently, we're developing a pad-making machine to economically empower women while addressing menstrual challenges. This endeavour seeks to produce more eco-friendly and user-friendly pads, furthering our mission of menstrual health and empowerment.

SOCIAL ENTERPRENEURS EXTENDING THE PROJECT IMPACT

- Our interns, Niyamat and Mansa, conducted sessions on menstrual hygiene, taboos, and stigmas. The beneficiaries of these sessions were girls aged 13 to 15. The sessions were well-attended and served to educate and empower the participants.
- The "Educating Male Teenagers about Menstrual Hygiene" event was a significant step towards breaking the taboo. Positive outcomes included increased awareness, empathy, knowledge, and behaviour change.



ERADICATING MALNUTRITION

Our objective for the Eradicating Malnutrition initiative at Hamari Pahchan NGO is threefold: first, to entirely end hunger; second, to secure national food security; and third, to eradicate malnutrition in all forms. To achieve these goals, we have developed a thorough and multidimensional action plan. We hold frequent ration distribution campaigns to deliver needed food to individuals in need. Furthermore, we perform regular surveys in partnership with dietitians to determine nutritional needs and modify our actions accordingly. In addition, we organise frequent handouts of healthy meals to combat malnutrition and boost general health and wellbeing.

- The food drive, with 10 dedicated volunteers and locals, we distributed nutritious meals to 1000 individuals, including AIIMS patients and families.
- With a sense of camaraderie, we distributed meals and celebrated Lohri with beneficiaries.
