Oxford Convergence 2025: "True Companionship – Solitude and Belonging" March 29-30, 2025 | Corpus Christi College, Oxford Free and Open to Everyone



Oxford, UK – The second edition of Convergence, a cultural initiative fostering dialogue among people from diverse backgrounds, is set to take place on March 29-30, 2025, at Corpus Christi College in Oxford.

With the theme *True Companionship: Solitude and Belonging*, Convergence 2025 addresses one of the most pressing issues of our time: the epidemic of loneliness permeating modern society.

A recent study by The Guardian revealed a significant "happiness recession" in Europe, with the UK ranking lowest in life satisfaction among teenagers. This year's event aims to explore the roots of this phenomenon and its far-reaching effects on individuals and communities.

Convergence 2025 invites participants to reflect on questions of companionship and belonging in a polarised world. Cardinal Pizzaballa, echoing Rabbi Abraham Heschel, recently called for the recognition of others as part of our shared human journey, a message central to this year's discussions. **The two-day event will delve into how loneliness shapes experiences** of climate change, economic inequality, and mental health, while uncovering paths toward meaningful connection.

Through panels, free exhibitions, and collaborative dialogues, Convergence creates a unique space where diverse perspectives can converge into shared understanding.
