He helped to put Tucson on the national bowling map with his work with the PBA Tucson Open, held at Golden Pin Lanes, making it a staple on the PBA tour from the 70's through the 2000's. Pete also helped to secure the WIBC Championships and Queens Tournament to be held at Golden Pin Lanes as well. With the various leagues, including the Citizen Classic League to name one of many, as well as the junior program at Golden Pin Lanes, Pete helped to build our Tucson bowling family. In 2023, Pete was the proud father, to see his son Mike inducted into the Tucson Metro USBC Hall of Fame.

Pete is up there in Heaven, bowling with the Budweisers and other famous bowling teams, with members such as Don Carter, Dick Weber and Ray Bluth and running Heaven's bowling center. Our condolences to the Tountas family for their loss.
