

SASKATCHEWAN Day

An official holiday on the first Monday in August was first proposed in Saskatchewan on 17 March 1975, by Gordon Snyder, Saskatchewan's Minister of labour, at the time. The holiday was already celebrated by businesses across Saskatchewan, but **Snyder wanted it to be a recognized statutory holiday known as "Saskatchewan Day".**

In the legislative document, Snyder said he wanted Saskatchewan residents to have more than day off, but one that was paid.

In the document, Synder goes on to propose why an additional holiday would be needed. "Our prairie winters are usually harsh and long; our summers, while lovely and warm, are unfortunately quite short" Synder said. He hoped we would use Saskatchewan Day to appreciate the people who worked together to build the province and "continue building a way of life of which we can all be proud".

As to what people of Saskatchewan are supposed to do on the holiday, Synder said no special celebrations are needed.

"Saskatchewan Day instead will be another occasion on which Saskatchewan families can gather to enjoy our great outdoors"

FEATURE ACTIVITY OF THE MONTH

MAHJONG

Mah Jong is a tile-based game that originated in 19th century China and has spread throughout the world. It is typically played by four players, though some regional variations can involve three. The game involves matching tiles to form sets and pairs, aiming to be the first to complete a winning hand.

Tiles: Mahjong uses a set of 144 tiles (though some variations may differ) with various symbols, including numbered tiles (Dots, Bamboo, Characters) honor tiles (Winds and Dragons) and sometimes bonus tiles (Flowers, Seasons).

Players draw and discard tiles, aiming to form sets (melds) and pairs to complete their hand.

Common sets include chow (sequences) pongs (triplets), and kongs (quadruplets).

The first player to form a complete hand of 14 tiles (four sets and a pair) and call "mahjong" wins the game.

Mahjong has numerous regional variations, including American Mahjong, which uses racks and a score card, and Riichi Mahjong, a Japanese variant.

Studies suggest that playing Mahjong can enhance cognitive abilities, short term memory, and potentially relieve depressive symptoms.

Stuffed Tomatoes

Ingredients

- 4 tomatoes
- 1/3 cup shredded parmesan cheese
- 3 Tbsps. Plain Panko breadcrumbs
- 2 ½ Tbsp Italian seasoned breadcrumbs
- ½ c minced onion
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 Tbsp + olive oil
- 2 tsp. fresh basil, chopped
- 2 tsp parsley
- 1 tsp. oregano
- 1/4 tsp ground pepper
- Grated mozzarella



Instructions: Preheat your oven to $400^{0 \text{ F.}}$ and spray an 8 x 8 inch dish with cooking spray. In a medium bowl combine Parmesan cheese, breadcrumbs, onion, garlic, 2 tbsp. olive oil, basil, parsley, oregano, salt and pepper. Cut the tops off and hollow out the tomato by removing the pulp and seeds with a spoon. Dice the pulp and add to the bread crumb mixture. Gently mix the ingredients until well combined. Fill each tomato with stuffing and place in the baking dish. Drizzle with olive oil. Sprinkle with mozzarella cheese and bake for 10-12 minutes.

A piece of Eaton's History by Ross Leighton

Shortly after we moved into Timothy Eaton Gardens, Mr. Bill Gardner, who was then one of our Board of Directors, insisted that we record a history of the formation of our group – explaining how we came to be located in our present centre. He felt this information should be available for future generations and for posterity. I'm beginning to see for myself, after reviewing the History, how important that was since I would not have remembered it all had it not recorded. For that reason, I think it equally important that we provide a record of the development of the lower level as well. Since I am the last of the original board of Directors, who is still involved in the affairs of the Association, here is my effort to accomplish that feat.

The original plan was to complete both levels at the outset, but it soon became apparent that the \$663,000.00 of funding could not be spread that thin and so the lower level development was restricted to the electrical room, the boiler room and the stairwell.

During the four years, while the building was unoccupied and without power, the sump pumps weren't functioning as the water seeped up through the floor tiles. When we occupied the building, the sumps had been put into service, but the accumulation of filth was very much in evidence – in fact, I was not aware that there were tiles on the floor. It was only after we bought the Clark scrubber that our caretaker, Dave Englesman, through persistence, was able to bring the area back to respectability.

The only activity that was taking place in the lower level was horseshoes. TO BE CONTIUED
