We explained that the funding would support much needed improvements to our kitchen. We are pleased to announce that Moose Jaw Co-op has approved \$50,000.00 for our kitchen upgrade project. These upgrades will include a new stove and hood to meet current safety codes, as our existing equipment is only in use under a grandfather clause. Following these major updates, we plan to purchase a new meat slicer, toaster and other essential kitchen items.

As part of this partnership and sponsorship, Moose Jaw Co-op has recommended exploring naming and partnership opportunities. These initiatives will help strengthen community connections, encourage intergenerational engagement, increase awareness and enhance community use of the Centre.

We look forward to sharing more updates as this exciting project moves forward!







CHRISTMAS GOOEY BUTTER COOKIES

Ingredients


8 oz. full fat cream cheese softened

1 large egg

1 box (15.25 ounce) yellow cake mix

½ c powdered sugar

½ c unsalted butter, softened
1 tsp vanilla extract
½ c holiday sprinkles



DIRECTIONS:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees and line two baking sheets with parchment paper.

In a large bowl, beat together the softened cream cheese, butter, egg and vanilla extract until smooth.

Stir in the cake mix until a thick dough forms. Gently fold in holiday sprinkles, being careful not to overmix so the color doesn't bleed into the dough.

Chill the dough for at least 30 minutes to make it easier to handle.

Scoop out dough into 1 ½ inch balls and roll them in powdered sugar until fully coated.

Place on cookie sheets 2" apart and bake for 10-12 minutes until edges are set but centers still look soft. Cool slightly before transferring to a wire rack. Store in a single layer in an airtight container at room temperature.

A piece of Eaton's History by Ross Leighton continued

In November, 1994 we were approached by Mr. Frank Ulm, who is President of the Sask. Shuffleboard Association. He expressed a desire to hold a first-ever Provincial Shuffleboard Tournament in the city. We agreed to work together with him in this regard. In order to accommodate this event we had to increase the number of courts in our centre. Since this was a two day event and would attract people from outside the city, we were able to obtain a Sask. Lottery grant, through Parks and Recreation in the amount of \$640.00, to upgrade the centre. This event was co-hosted by the Cosmo Senior Centre and while the number of entries was not as high as had been anticipated, it was deemed a success, and another tournament has been planned for 1996.

I have, if memory serves me correctly, covered all the major changes that have taken place. If I have omitted anything or failed to credit anyone for any volunteer work, I apologize for that omission.


In conclusion, may I make this personal comment: When we discovered that the original funding would not cover any development of the lower level, I felt a sense of urgency to get the job done. It has taken two and a half years. Last fall the architect, who worked on the Eaton Centre, attended a function at our Centre and was taken on a tour of the lower level. He was very impressed at what we had done and wanted to pass along his congratulations. Coming from Mr, Sherle, I consider this a pat on the back for all who participated. While there may still be room for further improvements, I'm personally pleased with our accomplishment. I feel our Centre stands as evidence of what can be accomplished where there is a desire to work towards a common goal and where there is a spirit of co-operation., I think our Board, regardless of its personnel over the years, has taken a visionary view of things. The Board and I in particular have been pleased with the support, encouragement and assistance given us by our Program, Coordinator, Pat Bohonos.

It is my hope that this history of our Centre will instill a sense of pride in future generations of seniors and will be a source of encouragement to them should future changes be needed.
