2025 ANIMAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

To limit disease introduction into the Navajo Nation, the following are the current health requirements for all livestock prior to entry and upon travel. Unless otherwise stated, requirements are for all states and Navajo Nation. Check with your veterinarian for any changes.

HORSES

1. Current Health Certificates within thirty (30) days of shipment.
2. Health Certificate statement, "All animals identified on this certificate of veterinary inspection were inspected and found to be free from clinical signs of vesicular stomatitis."
3. Current Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) test with negative Coggins within the last 12 months (date, lab name with test results, and lab accession number).
4. Navajo Nation seasonal hauling permit OR state issued hauling permit from Arizona, New Mexico, or Utah.

CATTLE

1. Current Health Certificates within (30) days of shipment.
2. Health Certificate statement, "all animals identified on this certificate of veterinary inspection were inspected and found to be free from clinical signs of vesicular stomatitis.
3. Trich test negative of breeding bulls (national requirement).
4. Must have electronic (RFID, EID) ear tags.
5. Navajo Nation seasonal hauling permit OR state issued hauling permit from Arizona, New Mexico, or Utah.

SHEEP/GOATS/LLAMAS

1. Current Health Certificate within (30) days of shipment.
2. Health Certificate statement, "The sheep is/are not infected with bluetongue, nor exposed to scrapie or originated from scrapie-infected of source flock."
3. Navajo Nation seasonal hauling permit OR state issued hauling permit from Arizona, New Mexico, or Utah.
4. Must have electronic (RFID, EID) scrapie ear tags.

SWINE

1. Current Health certificate within thirty (30) days of shipment.
2. Health Certificate statement "These animals have not been vaccinated for pseudorabies or fed garbage."
3. Navajo Nation seasonal hauling permit OR state issued hauling permit from Arizona, New Mexico, or Utah.
4. Must have electronic (RFID, EID) ear tags, Permanent ID, tattooed, or ear notched.
