American Playwright Katori Hall's The Mountaintop, which fictionally depicts Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s last night on earth in room 306 of the Lorraine Hotel in Memphis will be presented by APTCo in May.

She was awarded the Pulitzer Prize for her drama, *The Hot Wing King*, was nominated for Tony Awards for her work as Co-Book Writer for *Tina: The Tina Turner Musical*, and *The Mountaintop* won The Olivier Award for Best Play. I encourage folks to see her take on what might have happened on the eve of Dr. King's assassination."

The show features Kyle Javon Blocker as Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. who has just returned from Titusville Playhouse in Florida where he performed in *The Mountaintop* and *Beautiful: The Carol King Musical*. He has also been seen regionally in such shows as *Dreamgirls, The Color Purple, Into the Woods, Rent, The Wiz, Shrek* and *Ain't Misbehavin'*. Playing the role of Camae is Natalie Hayes-Scott. She was last seen on the APTCo stage as Kendra in the gripping drama, *American Son*. She has also performed in many local and regional theaters in such shows as *A Chorus Line* and *Dreamgirls*.
