#### **POLICIES**

- 1. Open to Society Members who have an oversupply of plumerias in their private collections. ONLY ROOTED CUTTINGS and bagged seeds will be permitted to be sold.
- 2. Sale participant must be an ACTIVE MEMBER, i.e. min. of one (I) year membership w/current paid dues and have worked on a Society committee, scheduled or have worked at the Botanical Gardens Exhibit during 1997.
- 3. All sales go through the Plumeria Society of South Texas cashier table. Sales revenue distribution: 80% Member, 20% Plumeria Society - payable to participant no later than (2) weeks after the sale. (No exceptions)
- 4. Sale participant must reserve and purchase his display table from Plumeria Society for \$15 no later than August 9, 1997. Should participant fail to show up for the sale, he shall forfeit the \$15 cost previously paid to the Society. Coordinate reservation with Chairman prior to August 9, 1997.
- 5. Sale participant is responsible for his own income taxes.
- 6. Sale participant is responsible for his cleaning up of his area. Please bring broom, dust pan, and paper towels for housekeeping. (Bagging each pot with recycled, plastic H.E.B. bags, etc. will minimize cleanup)
- 7. REQUIRED: Provide plastic bags for bagging at customer's request. White and Colored tags for pricing and identification (tagged prior to sale) as noted below.
- 8. All sale participants are required to volunteer a minimum of (1) hour per Chairman's decision. (Assistance with Cashier's station, cleanup, sales assistance, etc.)

#### PHOTO CONTEST TAKING SHAPE

Recently, Mary Jane Crull, Public Relations Coordinator with the Botanical Gardens, set aside November, December 1997 and January 1998 as months for Plumeria photos to be exhibited within the Botanical Gardens Visitors' Center. Photo sizes should be mounted on foam board and be no smaller than 8" x 10". Larger sizes are even more welcomed. Those wishing to enter photos in the contest will need to bring their photos to the October meeting for viewing as selection shall be made then by the present membership. Prizes shall be determined by the Board of Directors prior to the October meeting. As a suggestion, you may wish to photograph flowers at the Botanical Gardens Collection or buy a roll of film for a friend who has a super camera, borrow his camera, or coerce him to take the photos. As a foot note: These dates were suggested due to maintaining "exposure" of Plumerias during the winter months when Plumerias drop their leaves, hibernate, and recharge for the Spring. Judging will be based on artistic and creative ability, color, sharpness, uniqueness, etc. Photographer and variety name shall be placed on the back of the photo so later credit can be given with common labels made by the Chairman (Jocko Taylor). About 15 to 20 photos will be needed for the exhibit.
