

## **FFA SHOP EXHIBITS**

1. All projects must be constructed under the supervision of a Vocational Agricultural teacher.
2. All exhibitors of shop projects must be a member of an FFA chapter within Live Oak County.
3. No student can enter more than two (2) individual projects.
4. All projects will be graded on merit, quality, and workmanship according to score sheet.
5. Each exhibitor is responsible for the care of their project during the fair.
6. Each project will be graded as follows:

A.	90-100 Blue ribbon	<b>\$30.00</b>
B.	80-89 Red Ribbon	<b>\$25.00</b>
C.	70-79 White Ribbon	<b>\$20.00</b>
D.	60 or less – No Score	
7. All projects must be checked in on **Wednesday, February 26, 2025, between 3:00 - 6:00 p.m.** No late entries will be accepted. An Ag Science Instructor from each chapter must be present at check-in.
8. Entry fee of \$3.00 per exhibit will be deducted from the grade money.
9. Must be the work of the individual exhibitor or designated group only. Each group will consist of no more than five students. No chapter projects to be allowed.
10. Exhibits not in auction must be removed from the fairgrounds no earlier than **12 p.m. and no later than 2 p.m. on Friday, February 28.**
11. Shop projects will be divided into two classes - Wood and Metal. Students will classify their projects as they enter them, but the judge will have final say on classifications. Grand Champion & Reserve Champion Metal and Wood shop projects will receive a belt buckle & banner.
12. All participants may choose to participate in the silent auction.
13. All FFA shop exhibits will be judged **Thursday, February 27, 2025 at 1:00 p.m.**
14. **Each exhibitor must be present during the judging of their shop project. If the exhibitor is sick, death in the family, at a major show or UIL event, the exhibitor can have an eligible FFA shop project substitute exhibitor for the judging of his/her interview.**
15. All shop exhibits must be constructed within one calendar year of the exhibition date.
16. Silent Auction **will start on Saturday, March 1 at 8:00 a.m. and conclude on Saturday, March 1 at 1:00 p.m.**
17. All Silent Auction shop projects must go through the Live Oak County Fair with 5% commission deducted from the project.
18. Projects must be sold as shown during the judging. No changing or altering of parts.
19. Each project must be accompanied by a scrapbook. Projects that do not have a scrapbook will be disqualified.
20. Only judged/ribboned projects may enter the silent auction. Disqualified projects may not enter the silent auction.
21. There will be one overall showmanship award given at the conclusion of the shop show. The winner will receive a belt buckle and be acknowledged during the parade of champions.
