Hagarayü! Good afternoon from Chemehuevi Environmental! It has been a busy month for EPA as we have had several training courses this July and August, we had R.C.R.A. (Resource Conservation and Recovery Act), D.O.T/E.P.A. (Department of Transportation and Environmental Protection Agency), and then the 24 Hour HAZWOPER (Hazardous Waste Operations and Emergency Response) training, in addition to being made aware of multiple sightings of the California State Protected Mountain Lion (Tükümümünts).

HAZWOPER Training

HAZWOPER (Hazardous Waste Operations and Emergency Response) is a training designed to teach the trainees the various ways in which they would be able to identify a hazard and the proper protocol for keeping people safe from that hazard, to mitigate and prevent the possibility of worker and community injury and illness resulting from potential exposures to hazardous substances. Our training lasted from the 3rd of August to the 5th of August. Our trainer, Perry Hoskins, trained us on a 24-hour HAZWOPER course mostly centered around chemical identification, how to identify chemicals from Placards and Labels, how to read the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA 704) Diamond Hazard Rating System, how to identify what level of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) is needed according to the level of hazards in a situation, and much more. It was very informative and very helpful for our department and other departments that attended.



Here in these pictures, we can see Perry Hoskins dressed in Level B PPE as employees mimic a decontamination station, wherein a worker that has been in an area filled with contaminants goes through this decontamination process so that any contaminants contained on the workers body are washed away with soap and water, ensuring the

worker **does not leave the contamination zone spreading any further** contaminants. Chemehuevi employees will most likely never go through a situation that would require this level of PPE, but it is better to be overprepared rather than underprepared.

Mountain Lion Sightings

Over the past two months, there have been multiple reports of Mountain Lion sightings. One sighting at the Chemehuevi Agricultural Area, one sighting at Vista Del Lago, and another on E street at Havasu Landing, Thunderhead “1” area. About a year ago, EPA trail cameras sighted multiple Mountain Lion kittens in catfish bay with what appeared to be their mother and father. A couple months after that, two kittens were sighted on the doorstep of a local Tribal Member Elder’s home. EPA suspects that these recent mountain lion sightings might be those kittens caught on the trail camera last year or a second set of kittens. We urge our local community to act with caution, particularly at night. Walk in groups if possible and considering the backside of Catfish Bay is the area where the most Mountain Lion sightings have occurred, it might be wise to refrain from going into Catfish Bay without having a couple of people accompanying you, if at all.

The Mountain Lion is and can be a terrifying and dangerous creature, and it is wise to proceed with caution in any area known to be inhabited by Mountain Lions. Mountain Lions are a State protected species. If you see a Mountain Lion coming too close to your home, if possible please refrain from any fatal reaction to the Mountain Lion as much as for yourself, make your presence known to the Mountain Lion to avoid startling it, and contact the local Animal Catcher, California Department of Fish and Wildlife, and or the San Bernardino County Sheriffs. Always remember, we are in their territory. Not the other way around.

Specially Protected Mammal:

Statewide, all California mountain lions are designated as a “specially protected mammal” under the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW). This status stems from Proposition 117, passed by voters in 1990.

Tükümümünts (Mountain Lion in Chemehuevi) was present at creation, when the world was just water, before Ocean Woman made the earth with the help of Coyote and Wolf. Coyote, Wolf, and Mountain Lion have been here since the beginning of creation, according to Chemehuevi oral history.

The TERO program enforces tribally enacted American Indian preference law, which ensures American Indians gain their rightful share of employment, training, contracting, subcontracting, and business opportunities occurring on or near reservations.

The Chemehuevi Tribal Employment Rights Office (TERO), by virtue of a contractual agreement with the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC), is authorized to interview and counsel individuals with potential employment discrimination charges. The TERO employees address draft charges of alleged violations of Title VII, file complaints with the EEOC and attempt to resolve the charge by mediation within 30 days.
