Hello Tribal Members/Community Members,

Monsoon season is here in Chemehuevi Valley California. Microburst with 75 mile per hour winds have been reported. A lot of damage to our community was seen the next day. The light house in the Havasu landing Resort on the Jetty was hit hard. It was ripped from the foundation and ended up in the water. Bleachers from the campground were mangled. Numerous awnings and shade canopies were bent and damaged. And aluminum carports destroyed. Mother Nature showed her fury on this day. With bad days, comes beautiful sunrises. Don't be outside too long because the humidity will get to you. You've got to rehydrate or suffer the consequences of heat exhaustion, or heat stroke.

The Bureau of Land Management has removed 136 head of burros from our area. We should start seeing the effects of the round up soon. Less burros in the roads, and definitely less droppings in your yards.

Watch for Rattlers their still out and about. With the recent rains everything that lives in the ground is on the move.

Realty Department Newsletter
July 2022

The Realty Department collected over \$257,990.00 in sales commissions and Transfer fees thru July 14,2022.

Realty has only 4 listings available and 1 open escrow.

Realty is currently working on the following projects:

Complete survey of the Tribal Subdivision, Survey is complete. Realty is waiting for the final survey map from the County of San Bernardino. Realty now has addresses for all buildings on the Reservation and is working with San Bernardino County to place the addresses in CommFire and the Thomas Brothers Guide.

Realty has several projects in the preliminary planning stage with site plans and proposals to complete the final engineering for 5th street mobile home park, K street park model park, new storage area located out of the Resort, Enterprise condominium proposal, Mills Road subdivision and the Ranchettes subdivision. Realty has proposals for construction documents on K street, 5th street and the storage area. The cost proposal is being prepared for the Mills Road subdivision.

Realty is reviewing methods and financing to increase the cash flow available to Realty. Tribal Realty is pursuing private Capital Partnership with the Tribe to bring needed Capital to the Projects being planned. Preliminary contacts have been made by Realty.

Realty is also reviewing a "Man Cave facility" to be located behind the overflow parking for the Casino. The Ranchettes large land subdivision is being reviewed and a site plan is being created.

Realty continues to review methods and projects that will increase Tribal cash flow and net income.

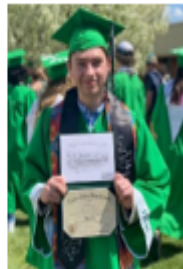
Congratulations to Jordan Camille Hoover 2022 graduate of Lake Dallas High School in Corinth, Texas.

Kaitlyn from the Cultural Center gave a tour of the Cultural Center and presented about petroglyphs and how to protect them. Mitchell from the Water Department demonstrated the layers of gravel and sand that filter water that makes different types of water tables and presented a slide show, prepared by Lex of the Water Department, on well water aquifers and how water gets to our homes. After the presentations, the participants traveled to Hawaio where we went on a scavenger hunt prepared by Johnny of the Education Department. We listened to Bird Songs and stories by Matthew Leivas and were given a tour by Daniel Leivas. It was a great event with 35 participants.





The weight room is open from 8:00 am to 7:00 pm for community members. All participants must sign the Weight Room Consent & Acknowledgement waiver that is newly implemented as of August 8, 2022. To use the weight room, all participants will need to sign in. Youth ages 16 and up must also check in with staff before using the weight room.

The Community Center had raised \$1000 in fundraising from events and sales. On July 30, We took a trip to the Lake Havasu City Aquatic Center. We had 28 youth, 4 parent volunteer chaperones and 4 staff members. It was a fun time for all ending with a shaved ice from Burgers by the Bridge.

Community Announcements Emergency Broadband Benefit

The federal Emergency Broadband Benefit can help you pay for your broadband internet costs.

Benefit details

The Emergency Broadband Benefit provides:

- \$50 a month off your broadband internet bill
- \$75 a month if you live on Tribal lands
- \$100 discount towards the purchase of a laptop or tablet

Who's eligible?

You are eligible if someone in your household:

- Gets Medi-Cal
- Gets EBT (CalFresh or CalWORKS) benefits
- Gets Tribal TANF or Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations benefits
- Lost a job or was furloughed
 - And your income is below \$99,000 if filing taxes individually or \$198,000 if filing jointly
- Gets lunch through the free and reduced-price school lunch program this year or last year
- Got a Pell Grant this year
- Qualifies for Lifeline phone benefits
- Qualifies for an internet provider's existing low-income (or COVID-19) broadband program
- Has an income of less than \$12,880 for a family of 1 and up to \$44,660 for a family of 8.


This is a temporary program and should end sometime later this year.

Before the program ends:

- Your internet provider will tell you it is ending.
- Your internet provider will provide options for other low-cost broadband programs if they are available.
- Your service will end unless you tell your broadband provider that you want to continue paying for a plan without the discount.
