WHAT DO WE DO?

The TERO program enforces tribally enacted American Indian preference law, which ensures American Indians gain their rightful share of employment, training, contracting, subcontracting, and business opportunities occurring on or near reservations.

The Chemehuevi Tribal Employment Rights Office (TERO), by virtue of a contractual agreement with the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC), is authorized to interview and counsel individuals with potential employment discrimination charges. The TERO employees address draft charges of alleged violations of Title VII, file complaints with the EEOC and attempt to resolve the charge by mediation within 30 days.

Tapitsap: Lit. trans., *that which is knotted or tied*.

Messages were delivered to designated persons, usually heads of other clans, by runners carrying knotted strips of yucca. Once the message was delivered, the recipient untied it and the runner returned the string to the sender, often carrying a new knotted string with a new message. Members of “runner societies” were most trustworthy and it was understood that their journeys were not to be impeded. Due to their tirelessness, they were deemed other-worldly.

Casting culture forward

Growing up on reservations can bring a person close to not only nature, but also their native culture. Isac Ochoa grew up as part of the Chemehuevi Tribe in Havasu Lake, California and founded Indigenous Anglers after kayaking with cousins growing up.

"Indigenous Anglers started with a couple cousins raised on their reservation. That love of the outdoors and our native culture and fishing happened to be the hot topic and the moment, I took advantage of my resources and realized what great opportunities I have in front of me and collaborated with my culture and what I love to do," he said. "Fishing also brings light and recognition to the Native American/Indigenous communities and people involved in the Fishing world by representing who we are as proud Native American/Indigenous Anglers."

Ochoa has used different kayaks over the years, originally just to go out and have fun. Now, he competes in tournaments after coming across a group that invited him to compete for the first time. Ochoa came close to earning

Angler of the Year that series and it lit a fire under him that resulted in a love for tournament fishing.

"I started off in an ocean kayak. I fished just about every day just out there having fun as I ran across a group of guys fishing a southwest kayak outfitters monthly tournament they had invited me to join for the following month so I did and fell in love with the tournament kayak fishing," he said. "I finished the rest of the series with that group and came just a few points short of Angler of the Year."

"I came that close with just two rods and some tackle thrown together lit my fire and I was hooked on Kayak Fishing so I purchased a Hobie outback and competed in that kayak from 2018-2023 I qualified for a West Coast

ampionship (WCC) and won
ew tournaments in those few
ars. I fished in the WCC at the
lifornia Delta and realized
ere I needed to adjust my
ing game and purchased an
dTown Autopilot.”

By creating Indigenous Anglers,
hoa’s mission is to get across to
: youth and inspire them to stay
ie to who they are and that in-
genous anglers are still around.
“My message to get out there
ve are still here, stay proud of
o you are and what you do,” he
d. “My mission is to get across
the youth and the troubled. To
them know there’s more to life
n life on the reservation.”

Throughout this journey,
hoa has gotten to not only
vel to new places and lakes, but
o meet a great group of people
h the same passion.

“Everybody in this world of
rak fishing are great people,
y all have been so welcoming
l it’s just a great time seeing
rybody come together with all
great stories along their road
becoming a kayak angler at
ie Campfire” as we like to call
he said. “I would like to give



big thanks to my wife and family
for supporting me through this
journey and give thanks to the
Chemehuevi Tribe and Havasu
Landing Resort and Casino for
sponsoring me to help me fulfill
this dream.”

The biggest piece of advice
Ochoa gives for all up and coming
kayak anglers is about water
safety.

“The advice I would give some-
one wanting to get into kayak
fishing, tournament or not is to
make sure you are getting into a
kayak that will best suit and fit
your needs for the style of fishing
you plan on doing, always be
prepared on the water, safety first
whether you are kicking, paddling
or motor always remember to
have a PFD (vest) on or on board
at all times and always let a family
member or loved one know a
general area where you expect to
be and what time you expect to be
off the water.”

Ochoa didn’t give up on his
dream when he created Indige-
nous Anglers in 2020 (didn’t get
released until 2021 due to covid)
and now encourages others to
follow theirs.

Hello Tribal Members,

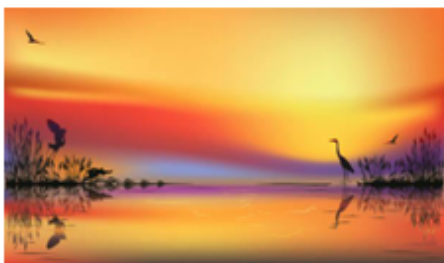
The weather here on the Rez, cool mornings with warm afternoons. Low 60s and 90s. Almost time to bust out the PJs and the fluffy blankets. The garden plants/flowers are starting to look better. Enjoy our second bloom. It is our last vegetable/flower season of the year (Fall Garden) As our desert plants are starting to go dormant.

The burros are still around, so watch for them. The Code Enforcement Department along with the Executive Committee have been trying diligently to get a round up here on the reservation. BLM states that funding is scarce. The department has been sending pictures of the burros and the damage they cause to Amy Dumas out of Sacramento California. She is the one that creates the final report that is sent to Washington to receive funding. Please do not give water or food to the burros. This creates a neuisense. The burros will start to congregate around your property expecting handouts. Your neighbors will get piles of presents on their property. I know their cute, especially the babies. But burros will get comfortable and will not eat the healthier food they find naturally in the desert.

The Conservation Department would like to thank the Chemehuevi Water Department. After the recent monsoons they had the back hoe out on the roads clearing areas that were washed out. I would also like to thank the EPA Department. They have dropped what they are doing to use their back hoe to remove a dead burro. They have also assisted with getting burros out of the cemetery. A big shout out to Steven Escobar and Abraham Ochoa for helping remove the burros from the cemetery as well.

“Team Work makes Dream Work”

The department has been working closely with the executive committee and council members to tackle issues on the reservation. I can vouch for this team of leaders they are working really well together. We all have a common goal. We all want to better the tribe. Make the reservation a better place to live. So that everyone can enjoy this place we call **“Paradise”**

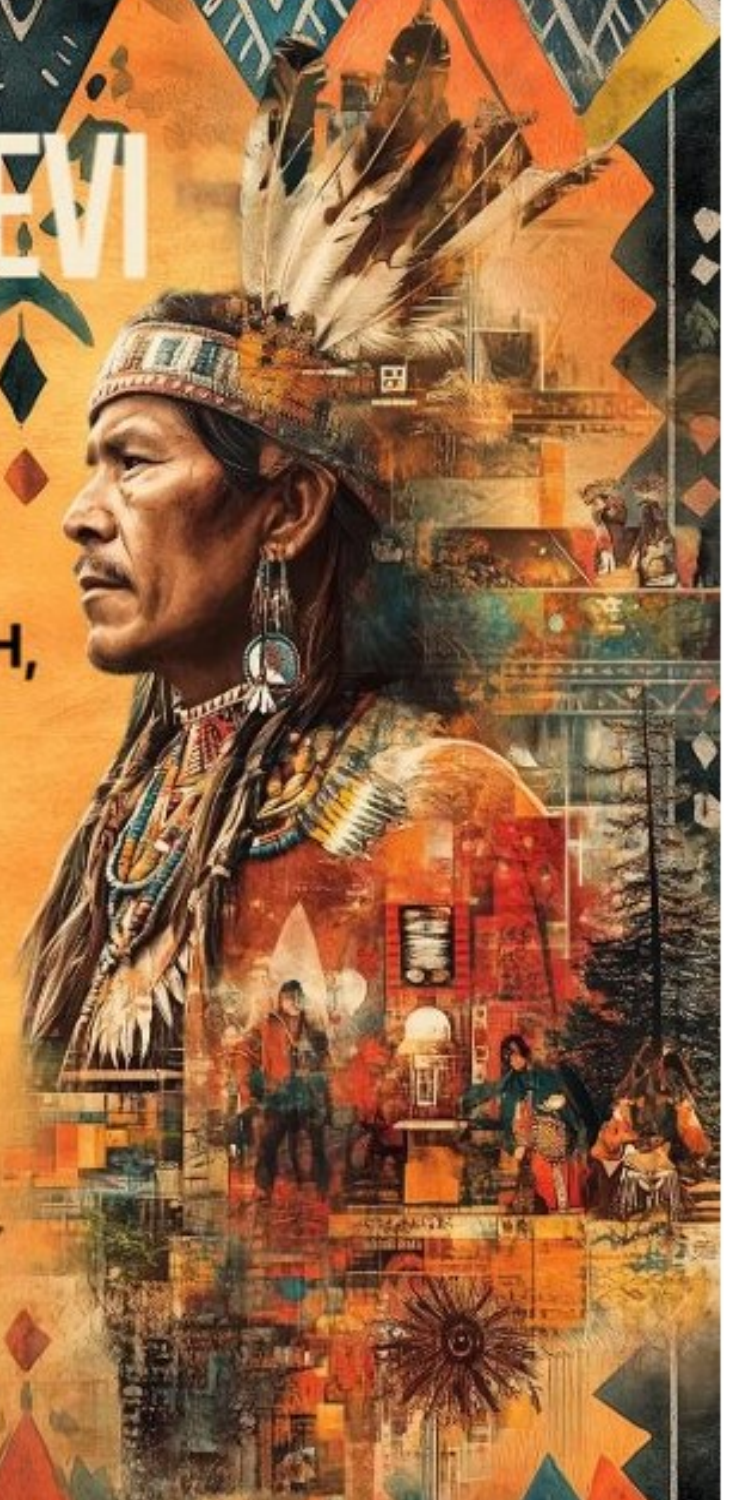

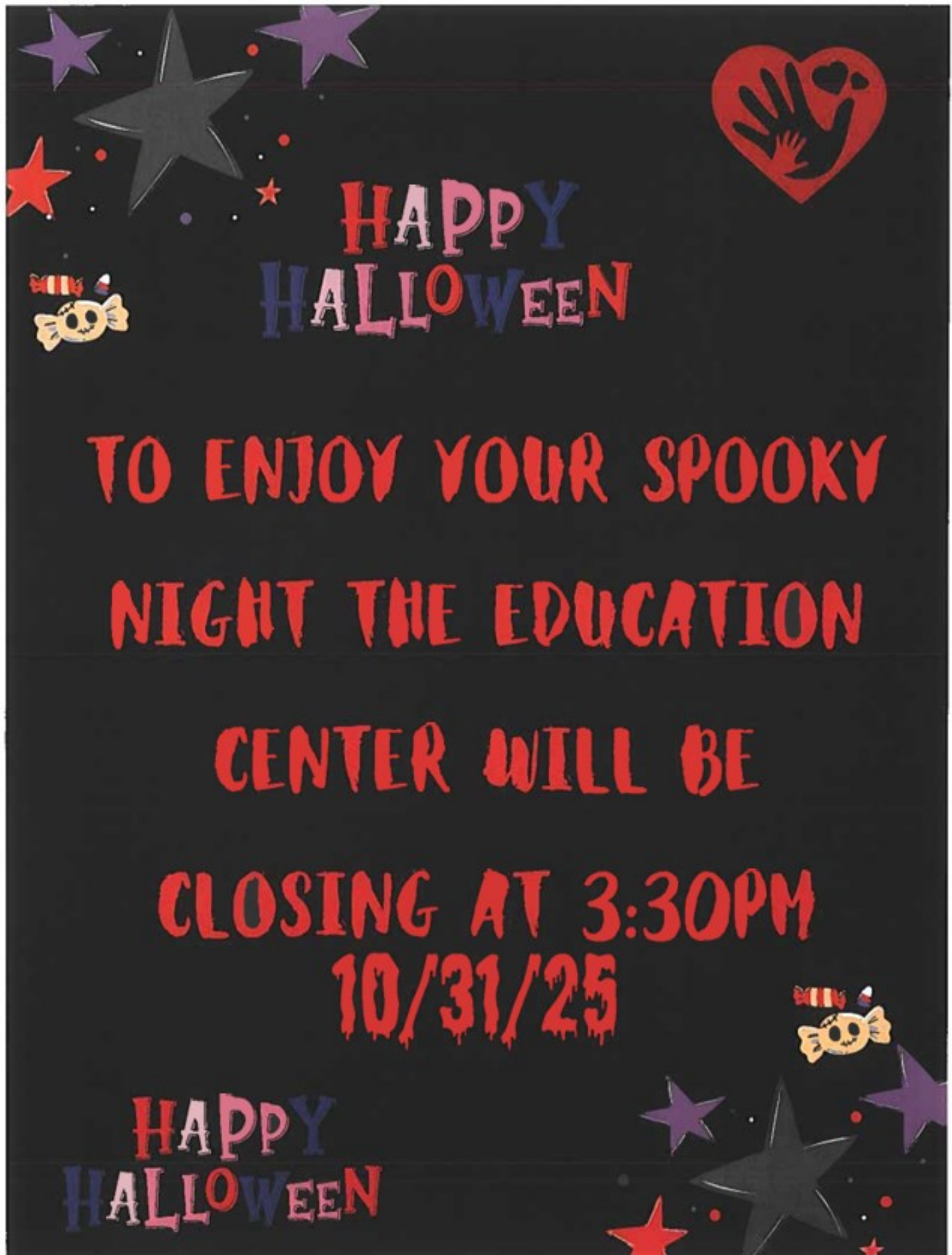


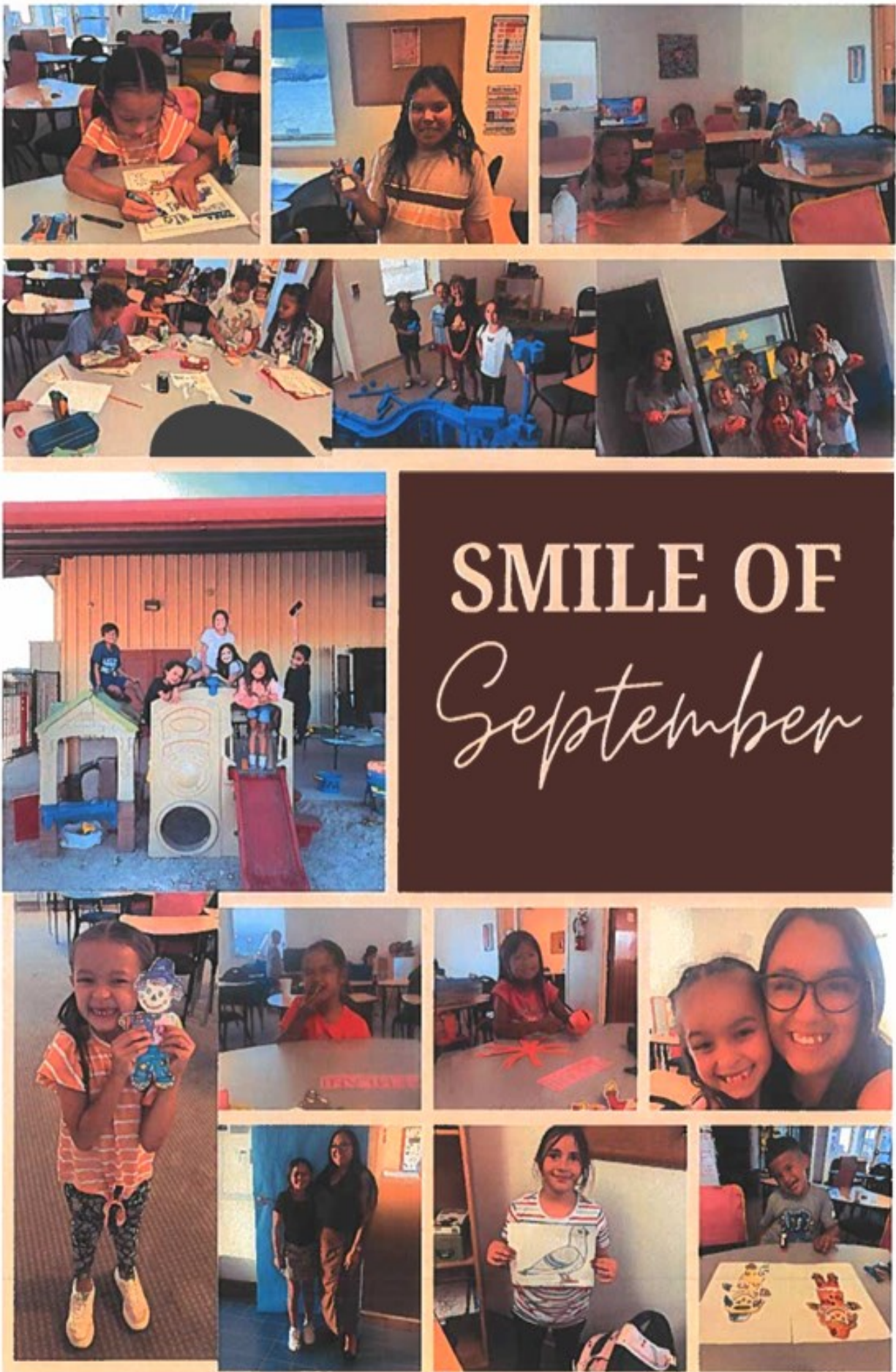
