
Welcome to 3-A



Welcome to Our Classroom

I would like to take this opportunity to welcome you and your child to our classroom. This year we will continue to adhere to all safety and cleanliness practices. We will continue to sanitize toys and practice social distancing throughout the day.

In our room we work hard to create a structured environment. Routine and structure is very important to a young child. It allows them to learn about expectations and what comes next in their day. Since our day is routine oriented, we ask that all children arrive to school no later than 9:00.

Here in our classroom, we strive to teach independence. We allow and encourage the children to try tasks and activities on their own. Examples of this are: art activities are completely done by the child, cleaning up after all activities: including meals, art time and center clean up. We also teach proper handwashing procedures, teach the children how to make their cots and help guide through bathroom trips. We are there to gently show the children how to do the task and guide them through the process. This helps them become confident in their own abilities. We also ask that this practice also take place at home.

Circle time is one of my favorite times of the day. It is when we come together to meet as our class family. During circle time we do: Who's here, calendar, weather, jobs, and talk about the upcoming day. There is also the question of the day. This is where we ask a question to the class pertaining to the weekly lesson. We will write them down and share them with you.

We will learn one letter a week and all of our activities will focus on that letter. Monday we introduce the letter. Tuesday the class will learn some words that start with that letter. Wednesday and Thursday we will complete letter activities. Friday we will review and trace the letter. Each child will have a pencil box in their work cubby. The box contains a glue stick, crayons, a pencil and a pair of scissors (cutting will be done with supervision). These will be used during table activities.

Each week we will focus on a Bible Story. There will be activities and a Bible Verse to go along with the story.

Other things that we will work on this year are: number recognition, patterns, counting, tracing, correct pencil grip and so much more.

I am all about the "teachable moments" that happen throughout the day. If the children can learn an important lesson from something in the classroom, we will stop what we are doing. It can be anything as small as a bug or a big as a disagreement in the room.

Our days are so busy it can be difficult to answer the phone. We will be changing over to a new platform eventually during the school year, we will keep you updated with that!
