

A Day In Infant A

Upon arrival, parents will drop off their child with all necessary belongings. At this point you will be asked to inform us of your child's last feeding, diaper change and wake up time. This helps us determine how to start our day with them. Also, please be sure to have filled out the Infant/Toddler Needs Summary Sheet prior to your child's first day. This form helps us to understand what kind of schedule he/she is on and ensures that your child continues a routine while in our care. This chart will need to be initialed every 30 days to ensure that it is up to date, as infant routines change frequently. Throughout the day, we will document diaper changes, bottle feedings, activities and more in our app, Brightwheel. You can send notes through this app to communicate questions or concerns to your child's teachers but do keep in mind that we check it as the baby's schedules allow us to do so. At pick up, we will gather your child's belongings and send all soiled items home. Any untouched bottles and food will be returned to you as these can not remain in the refrigerator over night.

Supplies needed

- Premade Bottles, labeled with first & last name along with contents and date
- Sleep Sack- optional, however no blankets are permitted.
- Any labeled food/snacks
- Pacifier- if needed (no clips or animals attached)
- Extra Clothes- Preferable three sets
- Bibs
- Burp Clothes
- Five Pack and Play Sized Sheets (all to be brought in every Monday)
- Diapers and Wipes
- Diaper Cream
- Three to four family photos for our family wall.
- One ream of printer paper
