

You will cross pond dams and experience occasional rocks going up hills. A running creek, that services a hand dug well 22 feet deep that once filled wagons with water, pulled by teams in the 1930s will be on the path as well. Some beautiful photo ops in a June morning setting. Experience the environment the setters did as they came through on the Oregon Trail. Our 6-generation ranch is filled with history as it sits between two historic trails, the Oregon Trail and the Santa Fe Trail.
