2023 Lenten Season

March is the season of Lent, one of the most critical seasons in the church calendar. What is Lent? Here is an explanation of Lent taken from the UMC Book of Worship. "Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent comes from the Anglo-Saxon word lencten, which means "spring." The season is a preparation for celebrating Easter. Historically, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparation for baptism by converts and then became a time for penance by the Sixth Sunday (Passion/Palm Sunday), Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem and his subsequent passion and death. Because Sundays are always little Easter days, the penitential spirit of Lent should be tempered with the joyful penitential of the Resurrection." (UM Book of Worship, p320)

Lent 2023 begins on Ash Wednesday, February 22, and ends on April 8, the eve of Easter. Lent is a precious time to celebrate Christ's love and justice for us and the hope of the resurrection. Through this 40-day journey, we grow in our faith in who we are, our reconciliation with Christ, God's kingdom mission, and our resurrection hope of eternal life. The love, sacrifice, and reconciliation of Christ towards us is a historical event and, at the same time, a current event that transforms our reality today. This is because God's love for you has never ceased from the beginning of time and is with you even now.


Total Households served by the Pantry in February: 54


