
Thursday, April 17th, we received our dairy delivery from Highland Dairy and we got a little vacuuming done.

## Psalm 126

When the Lord restored the fortunes of Zion, we were like those who dream.

Then our mouth was filled with laughter and our tongue with shouts of joy;

## Today's Devotional

Drive into the rural areas of the Midwest, and you will see farm equipment and structures slowly rusting away. I don't see it as simply junk; it is a relic of a past era. It witnesses to the middle of the twentieth century, a time when there were more farmers on smaller farms. But it has no use on larger modern farms.


I had to stop when I came across this John Deere 95 combine near Liberal, Kan. Introduced in 1957, it was the largest self-propelled combine in the world. It was state-of-the-art, but now it's minuscule compared to modern combines. If you could wave a magic wand and restore it to mint condition, its only value would be as a showpiece in a museum.

We often pray for the restoration of what once was in our lives and communities. We long for the time when churches had more members, more money, and more influence in society. But our prayer for restoration is a prayer for a romanticized version of the past.

During the final weeks of Lent, I have been reflecting on a line from Rev. Kimberly Clayton's commentary on Psalm 126 in "Feasting on the Word": "From our Easter perspective, we know that if we pray only for God to restore life as we have known it in easier or better times, our prayer has fallen short of the hope – and future – God intends."


Praying for the restoration of the life we have known feels safer than following God into an unknown future. It's one of the essential challenges of being human: the urge to resist change while living in God's ever-changing creation.

As you pray, instead of asking for what was, I invite you to listen to how God is calling you to new things in the future.

We invite you to experience the rolling beauty of the native grass and even stop and smell the wildflowers as you run/walk the course through the pastures. You will cross pond dams and experience occasional rocks going up hills. A running creek, that services a hand dug well 22 feet deep that once filled wagons with water, pulled by teams in the 1930's will be on the path as well. Some beautiful photo ops in a June morning setting. Experience the environment the settlers did as they came through on the Oregon Trail. Our 6-generation ranch is filled with history as it sits between two historic trails, the Oregon Trail and the Santa Fe Trail.

The cost is \$35 if signing up by May 31st or \$40 after that date.
