"Come to Jesus Through Prayer"

"Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light." (Matthew 11:28-31)

By the Numbers...

The October food pantry assisted **52 families**, equal to **148 individuals**. The Cruising Cupboard assisted **14 families**, equal to **33 individuals**.

The Harvesters delivery on October 5 brought us 254 pounds from the Topeka shopping floor and 732 pounds from our Kansas City order. On October, 12, Harvesters delivered 1000 pounds from the Kansas City warehouse and 217 pounds from the Topeka shopping floor.

Saturday morning: Thank you to Mary Jane, Mary Sue Sledd, Linda Smith, Robin Sayler and Heather Schneider for getting an early 6:30 a.m. start to set up shopping items for families, making copies, and making sure everything was ready to go. We had a busy morning and were able to provide a nice selection of dairy and meat items for the families. Blessings to all.

The November pantry will be on November 19th. We will have some turkeys and whole chickens, but we received a limited allocation from Harvesters. Mary Jane is working with Just Food to try to avoid duplications of holiday meat allocations if a family has already signed up with them. We have such a limited amount that we don't want to give out a turkey or whole chicken if a family has already received one.

Clothes Closet

The October Clothes Closet was open for business and Karmell Thacker and her crew were busy organizing an abundance of clothing donation. We had several groups visit the closet this month. We are still accepting donations of clothes. We are still in need of men's and young men's clothing.

Cruising Cupboard

The Just Food Cruising Cupboard comes the 1st Thursday of each month to the LUMC parking lot. They are here from 4:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m.. This month's date is November 3rd. We usually have around a dozen families each month.

Adopt-A-Family

The Nurture and Outreach Team is hoping to receive names from the school in the next few week. We hope to have the tags on the tree by November 13th. Any tags left on the tree after Sunday, November 27th will be pulled to allow the team to complete shopping, wrap gifts and sort for the pick up day on December 17th.
