















Origin of the

Rustin/Lorde Breakfast

he Rustin Lorde Breakfast was founded in 2002 by Craig Washington then executive director at the Atlanta Gay and Lesbian Center and Darlene Hudson who was a Board member. Darlene and Craig were members of the Martin Luther King, Jr. March planning committee and knew that the March was very welcoming to LGBTQ attendees. Given this receptivity to lgbtq people and the



Center's proximity to the line- up site, they decided that a breakfast event would resonate well with many. They felt that attendees would appreciate the opportunity



to share a warm meal and learn more about the roles of women and lgbt people in the Civil Rights movement. They named the community breakfast after the most well known gay activist associated with the civil rights movement, Bayard Rustin, principal organizer of the 1963 March on Washington and a mentor/advisor to Martin Luther King Jr. In 2008, at the suggestion of Mary Anne Adams, Audre Lorde's name was added to symbolize the indispensible roles of women in

social justice movements. The event would not have been possible were it not for the support of key founding sponsors Atlanta Gay and Lesbian Center, AIDS Survival Project, AIDS Treatment Initiatives, Congregation Bet Haverim, EM Designs Group, Human Rights Campaign, In The Life Atlanta, Positive Impact, Radial Café, Southern Voice, Unity Fellowship and ZAMI.








Welcome to your Homecoming

We needed to assert our place as Black LGBTQ people in the historic and continuing human liberation movements. The Breakfast evolved from that response to our need for location ensuring that we would no longer be erased from Southern Black and queer histories. Our sister Paulina Helm-Hernandez remarked that this event is a gift from Black LGBTQ community to Atlanta and the world. This gift is extended so that you and I may embrace our differences. We know that as marginalized peoples we are often dislocated from family, displaced from our homes, denied shelter, and considered unworthy of a place of our own. We need unity, not uniformity, to achieve justice. We cannot dislodge our cultivated self hatred and distrust unless we build coalitions beyond identity. We cannot be truly free until we recognize the blessing of desire, our primal drive toward joy and fulfillment.

This year we receive the Bayard Rustin-Audre Lorde Breakfast as our Homecoming, the family reunion for we who believe in freedom and will not rest. Look before you at the diverse cultures and generations represented in this hallowed space. We extend a special greeting to our visitors from India, Nepal and Pakistan and all others from abroad. We are a splendored people. Today you are invited to tell others why you returned or why you came for the first time. Let us use this moment to teach each other the importance of our traditions and our values. We are glad you are here. Welcome Home!

Through grassroots efforts over the years in many communities throughout this country, including this Breakfast, we have made sure that Rustin's and Lorde's work has not been forgotten. Personally I believe all of these efforts contributed in some way to Bayard Rustin being awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom by President Obama in 2013, our nation's highest civilian honor.

We should all feel good about the work we're doing yet recognizing there is always more to be done. Let's take this time to break bread, reflect, and fellowship and then continue the struggle. As Rustin reminds us, "The proof that one truly believes is in the action." Hey Leader!
