BYLAW 3/88

VILLAGE OF EARL GREY

A BYLAW TO PROHIBIT THE BURNING OF RUBBISH OR WASTE MATERIAL WITHIN THE VILLAGE BOUNDARIES.

The Council of the Village of Earl Grey, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

- The burning of rubbish or flammable material is prohibited in the Village of Earl Grey unless a permit is obtained from the clerk/administrator or Fire Chief.
- 2. The permitted burning shall be done in a properly constructed brick or metallic burner covered with a suitable 1/8 inch wire mesh or in an incinerator of a design approved by the Fire Chief or a member of Council.
- 3. No person shall start the burning of straw, weeds, grass or fire a stubble field until a permit has been obtained from clerk/ administrator or Fire Chief of the Village. No such permit will be issued unless the applicant undertakes to see that the fire is kept under complete control at all times by the following methods: (a) attendance of fire truck and at least two(2) fire fighters.
- 4. A person who contravenes the provisions of this bylaw is quilty of an offence and upon conviction, shall be liable to the Penalty provided for by the General Penalty Bylaw of the municipality.
