

Introduction

Westbourne Investment Advisors, Inc. is an Investment Adviser registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (“SEC”). We believe it is important to for you to understand how advisory and brokerage services and fees differ to determine which type of account or service is right for you. In addition to what we’ll describe below, there simple, easily accessible tools available free-of-charge for you to financial professionals and their firms at www.investor.gov/crs, which also provides educational materials about investment advisers, broker-dealers, and investing.

What investment services and advice can you provide me?

As an investment advisor we offer independent investment advisory services to retail investors which includes investment management services. If we are providing investment management services to you, we will discuss your financial situation, your near and long-term financial objectives, including but not limited to, time-horizon, liquidity needs, and risk tolerance. We will monitor your investments on a continuous basis, as part of our standard service. Please refer to Item 4 of our Form ADV Part 2A for further information.

We manage accounts on a discretionary basis, which means we do not need to call you when buying or selling investments in your account. You will sign an investment management agreement and limited power of attorney giving us this authority. This agreement will remain in place until you or we terminate our relationship. Please refer to Item 16 of our Form ADV Part 2A for further information. We do not limit our advice and services to proprietary products or a limited menu of products or investments. We do not have a minimum account size requirement. Please refer to Item 7 of our Form ADV Part 2A for further information.

Questions You may want to Ask Us:

- *Given my financial situation, investment objectives, and time horizon, what is the correct investing strategy in the near-term and over the long term?*
- *Given my financial situation, should I choose an investment advisory service? Why or why not?*
- *How will you choose investments to recommend to me?*
- *What is your relevant experience, including your licenses, education, and other qualifications? What do these qualifications means?*

What fees will I pay?

Fees and costs affect the value of your account over time. Our fees vary depending on certain factors and are negotiable. Please ask our representative to give you personalized information on the fees and costs you will pay. For our investment management services, our maximum fee is 1.25% of the market value of the portfolio, paid in advance on a quarterly basis. Our incentive is to increase the value of your account over time, which will increase our fees over time.

The broker-dealer (“custodian”) that holds your assets can charge you a transaction fee when we buy or sell an investment security for you. These transaction fees are in addition to our advisory fee. You could also pay fees charged by the custodian for certain investments and maintaining your account (for example pensions, Donor Advised Funds.) Some investments, such as mutual funds and exchange traded funds charge additional fees that will reduce the value of your investments over time.

You will pay fees and costs whether you make or lose money on your investments. Fees and costs will reduce any amount of money you make on your investments over time. Please make sure you understand what fees and costs you are paying. Please refer to Item 5 of our Form ADV Part 2A for further information.

Question to Ask Us:

- *Help me understand how these fees and costs might affect my investments. If I give you \$10,000 to invest, how much will go to fees and costs, and how much will be invested for me?*

What are your legal obligations to me when acting as my investment adviser? How else does your firm make money and what conflicts of interest do you have?

When we act as your investment adviser, we must act in your best interest and not put our interest ahead of yours. At the same time, *the way we make money creates some conflicts with your interests*. You should understand and ask us about these conflicts because they can affect the investment advice, we provide you. Here are some examples to help you understand what this means.

Our revenue is only from the advisory fees we collect from our clients' accounts each quarter. We have an incentive to increase the amount of investments we manage which could bias our advice towards investing more rather than paying off debt or recommending you not have investments that we do not manage. Question to Ask Us:

- *How might your conflicts of interest affect me, and how will you address them?*

How do your financial professionals make money?

Our financial professionals are owners, employees, and/or consultants of the firm are paid a fixed salary and discretionary bonuses. Ownership also receives, on a quarterly basis, a portion of the advisory fees above and beyond costs. This compensation structure creates an incentive for our financial professionals to recommend that you increase the size of your account with us.

Do you or your financial professionals have legal or disciplinary history?

No, our firm and/or financial professionals do not have legal and/or disciplinary history. Visit www.investor.gov/crs for a free and simple search tool to research our firm and our financial professionals.

- *As a financial professional, do you have any disciplinary history? For what type of conduct?*
