



Kelli is also a Walnut Valley USD alumna who attended Castle Rock Elementary, Suzanne Middle School, and Walnut High School.






This last month marked the final chapter as Public Information Specialist as she joins the District's Class of 2024 retirees.

Migraine Headaches

The increase in work can lead to heart attacks to circulate blood to keep cool and allow sweating and evaporation and other heart problems in people at risk. Chest pain or pressure needed to keep body temperatures from getting elevated, as can is the most common heart attack sign. Other signs are arm pain, happen in heat stroke. High blood pressure can be asymptomatic shortness of breath, nausea and light headedness. If you are expebut could also trigger headaches and dizziness. riencing these symptoms, you should immediately call 911 and get How to stay safe and cool in the heat out of the heat if possible.

Stroke

Extreme heat puts stress on the body, especially for the elderly, which can lead to a stroke. Those with high blood pressure should be very careful in extreme heat. Stroke symptoms include weakness of arms or legs, vision changes, facial droop, slurred speech and difficulty walking or feeling off balance. Call 911 if you have these symptoms. Time is of the essence when having a stroke.

Heatstroke

Heat increases the risk of stroke both through causing 'regular' strokes through dehydration, but also in causing Heat Stroke by elevation of body temperature.

If you're feeling dizzy, weak, have a headache or are nauseous, get Like strokes, heatstroke is a medical emergency. The signs of heatout of the heat, drink lots of fluids, and use a wet cloth or an ice stroke are confusion, altered behavior, a change in speech, and even pack. If you or someone you know is experiencing an altered menseizures. Heat stroke is not the same as heat exhaustion, but the tal status, call 911 and seek medical attention. two are related.

Heat exhaustion is your body's warning sign that it's overheating. Symptoms such as headache, dizziness, and nausea signal the need

- Know your risk for heat-related health issues

- Take breaks in the air conditioning
- Watch for signs of illness
- Seek medical care promptly if you are concerned









