










Diamond Bar Mourns the Loss of a Legend: Mack Lawrence Kuykendall





iamond Bar bids farewell to a local legend, Mack Lawrence Kuykendall, who passed away on July 29th at the age of 81. Known as the "First Black Bonus Baby," Kuykendall made history in 1960 by signing a groundbreaking \$100,000 contract with the Chicago Cubs at just 17 years old. The term "Bonus


Baby" refers to high school players who receive substantial bonuses in addition to their contracts, and Kuykendall was the first Black player to achieve this distinction.

Born and raised in Holdenville, Oklahoma, Kuykendall was a remarkable athlete in baseball, basketball, and football. He earned All-State honors in football, All-Conference accolades in basketball, and was named Player of the Year in baseball. His exceptional skills caught the eye of coaches at Oklahoma State University, who offered him scholarships to play both football and baseball. However, Kuykendall chose to pursue a professional baseball career instead.

Throughout his career, Kuykendall played alongside baseball greats such as Willie Mays, Ernie Banks, and Mickey Mantle. His groundbreaking contract not only highlighted his immense talent but also set a precedent for future generations of Black athletes in professional baseball. Kuykendall played nine seasons with the Cubs as a first baseman and outfielder. He later spent three seasons with the Los Angeles Angels in the early 1970s. After retiring from baseball, Kuykendall earned an MBA from Pepperdine University.

Kuykendall's influence extended beyond the field; he started a non-profit organization to emphasize the importance of education

for families and children. He dedicated himself to mentoring young players in Diamond Bar and beyond, hosting baseball camps sponsored by the Los Angeles Angels Organization.





amond Bar. Kuykendall's passing leaves a profound impact on all who knew him, and his legacy will be remembered for both his groundbreaking achievements and his dedication to inspiring and supporting future generations.



Nicole has made a fantastic impact on the educational community in Diamond Bar by serving multiple roles in the community clubs at both Maple Hill and Chaparral. 
























When Kids Need Help Making Friends in School

Priends enrich our lives, boost our self-esteem, and provide the moral support we need when we're memorizing multiplication tables. Developmentally speaking, making a friend in school is every bit as important as getting an A. Learning how to form successful peer relationships is a critical skill for kids, and one that they will be using, and refining, all their lives.

But some kids have a harder time fitting in. Skills of childhood interaction, like sharing a toy or engaging in make-believe, might elude them. While parents can't make friends for their children, they can help them develop and practice key social skills. If you see your child struggling to make friends or getting rejected by other kids, here are some steps you can take to help.

Social skills don't come naturally to all kids. Impulsive and hyperactive children often act in ways that hinder their strong desire for friendship. They often have trouble taking turns and controlling their anger when they don't get their way.

If you notice that your child is struggling to interact with their peers, try some coaching at home. Emphasize taking turns and sharing

during family playtime and explain that friends expect the same good behavior. Impulsive children will also benefit from practicing different strategies for resolving conflicts with others. Role playing can be very helpful. As a parent you should also be careful to model good social behavior yourself when talking to family members and your own friends.

For kids who need more intensive guidance, experts suggest using "social scripts," or simple everyday conversations that kids can practice with their parents. Social scripts are especially helpful for children on the autism spectrum who need to deliberately learn key social skills, such as establishing eye contact and responding to the moods of others.

Finally, if your child has been having a hard time making friends, schedule a meeting with their teacher. Kids often say 'everyone hates me' but they may not be able to describe what's going on. Teachers can give a better sense of your child's interactions with other students and suggest more positive classmates for after-school playdates.

Diamond Bar Soccer Star Alex Morgan Announces Retirement



lex Morgan, Diamond Bar's amazing soccer legend and one of the greatest players in U.S. Women's National Team history, has officially announced her retirement from professional soccer. Alex is one of the most popular women's soccer stars in the history of the global game.

Alex grew up in Diamond Bar, playing soccer for AYSO. She played high school soccer at Diamond Bar High School, graduating in 2007. After attending UC Berkeley, where she excelled on the California Golden Bears soccer team, she was drafted number 1 in the 2011 WPS draft. In 2012, Morgan made her Olympic debut winning a gold medal.

Morgan concludes a legendary 15-year professional career in which she scored an outstanding number of important goals for the U.S. Women's National Team and rose to become one of the most famous female players in the world due to her prolific scoring exploits, dynamic personality, off the field work for women's sports and equality and non-stop winning. Her cultural impact on women's soccer is matched by only a select few players in sports history and her inspirational interactions with her fans were second to none.

She finished her USWNT career with 123 goals (fifth all-time), along with 53 career assists (ninth all-time). The USA's record in matches in which Morgan played stands at 177W-15L-32D. She scored in 86 of her 224 international appearances (ninth alltime in U.S. history), while making 158 starts, and she captained the USA 23 times during that span. In the 86 matches in lost, going 76W-0L-10D.

Morgan reflected on her long career, stating "I grew up on this team, it was so much more than soccer," Morgan's first USWNT training camp was at the end of 2009 when she was 20 years old. "It was the friendships and the unwavering respect and support among each other, the relentless push for global investment in women's sports, and the pivotal moments of success both on and off the field. I am so incredibly honored to have borrowed the crest for more than 15 years. I learned so much about myself in that time and so much of that is a credit to my teammates and our fans. I feel immense pride in where this team is headed, and I will forever be a fan of the USWNT. My

which Morgan scored the USWNT never desire for success may have always driven me, but what I got in return was more than I could have ever asked and hoped for."

The Regional Chamber of Commerce San Gabriel Valley (RCC-SGV) has unveiled an ambitious plan to balance economic growth and community needs, marking a significant step forward for Diamond Bar. With a renewed focus RCC-SGV is poised to lead the region into a new era of prosperity, as highlighted in their Fiscal Year 2023-24 report and strategic plan presented to the City Council and City Staff.

Under the theme "Pivot, Evolve, Flourish," RCC-SGV has identified key customer segments, problems, and solutions, crafting unique value propositions and a high-level strategic concept. 

Looking ahead to the upcoming major events, such as the 2026 FIFA Soccer Games, 2027 Super Bowl in 2027 and the 2028 LA Olympics, the SGV plans to optimize economic opportunities in leisure, hospitality, and retail segments. By promoting Diamond Bar as a "Gateway to Bliss," the Chamber aims to enhance its marketing campaign to attract both local and global visitors. Diamond Bar's assets, including easy access to tri-county destinations, airports, major transportation corridors, mass transit options, and

nearby colleges with world-class athletic venues, is positioned as a prime location for visitors.

The Chamber's strategy includes forming a Hospitality and Tourism Committee, hiring a Digital Marketing Manager, and collaborating with local hoteliers, restaurateurs, educational institutions, and transportation authorities. This collaborative approach aims to improve member revenue generation, expand market reach, and generate global marketplace revenues.

RCC-SGV's comprehensive plan reflects a commitment to fostering a healthy, resilient local economy. The Chamber invites all stakeholders—city officials, community members, and businesses—to join in this effort to ensure Diamond Bar's economic and residential growth is harmonious and inclusive. 
