Over 782+ Lehigh County Special Olympics Athletes will compete in Track & Field events on Thursday May 9. Athletes from all the schools in Lehigh County arrive from 7:45 – 9:15. As each athlete enters the stadium they are matched with a buddy from the participating schools. Thus 1500+ students arrive and have to be safely unloaded and escorted into the stadium. 85-90 buses to be unloaded. The loading takes on another complexity as all the buses have varying departure times till 2:15. Needed helpers to escort students to and from buses. Over lunch time the bus crew assists with serving lunches for the 1500+ students and 300+ volunteers.

## Val d'Isere, France – Trip Report by Catherine Chrapacz

Val d'Isere, France is located in the Majestic French Alps. Hotel Altitude is a Ski-in/Ski-out Chalet style hotel located near the de Bellevarde Ski Slope and the Olympic gondola. The village was a three-minute walk across the slopes to shopping in the village centre. The owner of the hotel, Nicolas and his staff were a wonderful host. He went out of his way to make our stay quite comfortable. Dinners were delicious at Hotel Altitude. The most memorable was definitely the raclette cheese and fondue night. Each table had an electric raclette melter machine and fondue pots to share. Lots of melted cheese and potatoes that night.

Val d'Isere Ski Resort has an old world charm with chalet architecture in the western and central area and newer mountain style ski-in/ski-out hotels. Today Val d'Isere Resort is known for the 1992 Albertville Winter Olympics and Alpine Skiing World Championships in 2009. Val d'Isere also produced the legendary Jean-Claude Killy for his three medals at the Grenoble Olympics Games in 1968.

Val d'Isere is the oldest resort and has the best skiing in the French Alps with 186 miles of groomed pistes, 2 glaciers, 78 lifts, 153 pistes and 2 snowparks. The ski area starts at 5000 feet to 11,318 feet. The weather and ski conditions were great, with sunny skies. There is a variety of easy, intermediate to expert skiing trials. Here are few noted memories from our group.

Trina & Roberts' day at Tignes provided blue skies and wonderful conditions. They had the opportunity for some fresh lines on the Grande Motte Glacier. Visibility was a little challenging during the snow events, but they were able to make the top to bottom run on the Bellevarde Olympic Downhill Course. What a real thigh burner!

Holly, Reggie, Carol & David scheduled an off-piste ski tour for a two days-4 hour guide. They had great conditions with plenty of fresh snow. The guide took them mostly to untracked powder runs that they would not have known without a guided tour and offered ski lessons to improve their skiing techniques. The group took the instructor for a late lunch on the mountain at Le Panoramic, a gourmet restaurant, located just below Grande Motte glacier in Tignes which they all enjoyed. This group skied so much they had no energy to enjoy the night life.

Several women took a day off downhill skiing and enjoyed some cross-country skiing. They had fun and found a beautiful sightseeing trail. The course and weather were challenging, but the après' lunch and drinks made up for the challenges.

Entertainment in the village was plentiful. Ice sculptures were placed throughout the village. On Thursday, the streets are blocked in the village and the town provides a laser show with street entertainers; musicians, dancers, drinks and food. What a great night of entertainment!

Val d'Isere's Aquasportif is an Aqua Spa which is constructed of glass, wood, and stone situated at the foot of the pistes. The spa had a huge leisure pool, with swim lanes, aqua bikes, several water jets, wave machine, wet and dry saunas, steam baths, and massage therapy. I enjoyed another leisure day off to relax those sore muscles from skiing.

The hotel in Geneva was located within a short walk to some beautiful sightseeing sites and great restaurants. One of the most famous landmarks Jet d'Eau, the largest fountain was a view across the street of our hotel. Several went out to a traditional Switzerland restaurant that had a band and an authentic Alphorn, approximately 8 feet long. The horn lay from the top of the staircase and reached down to the, floor. The musician invited any patron to test their lungs. Quite the experience.

Everyone enjoyed Val d'Isere Resort, meeting new members and reconnecting with the old. We look forward to seeing you all again in 2020.

# 2019 Powder Highway Trip
