## Val Thorens Club Ski Med Trip – 3/5/22-3/13/2022 by Catherine Chrapacz

Traveling to Europe has been a challenge for the last two years. This original trip was rescheduled from 3/16/21 because of the surge of COVID cases. A total of 21 traveled on 3/5/22, from the original of 47 originally scheduled to travel in 2021. Since I was unable to travel with the group, Tim White had agreed to coordinate the group to Val Thorens and back home safely. I want to thank Tim for his leadership. It was a group consensus; he did a great job. This summary is compiled from Val Thorens facts and Tim's summary of the groups' weeks' experiences.

Travel requirements changed daily for many months prior to departure. A PCR test was not required to get into France on 3/5/22, but a vaccine pass was required once entering France at a cost of 50E/person. Club Med arranged for the PCR test that was required upon returning to the U.S. The Test was conducted at the bar of the hotel the day before departure, i.e. swabbing the nose and then a beer.

Club Med ski trips are inclusive with ski lift tickets, ski lessons, meals, alcohol and entertainment. Val Thorens is known as the world's biggest ski area. Les 3 Vallees is known as the 3 Valleys connected by 3 mountains and eight ski resorts: Courcheval, La Tania Meribel, Brides-Les Bains, Les Menuires, Saint-Martin-de-Belleville . The 3 Valleys are between 4265 and 10,499 feet high, 373 miles of ski slopes and has a 5-6 months of snow season. Per Tim, the ski area was HUGE. It took five of the members to ski all day from one side of the trail map, Orelle to Courchevel-Morond and return.

Snow conditions improved all week, starting out firm, but softening up as the weather warmed, No snow accumulation during the trip. Val Thorens Club Med Sensations Resort location was great, i.e., Ski in/Ski out, walking out the hotel, click in and go.

The Val Thorens Club Med experience was great for all. Everyone loved the Ski lessons that were included, some continued and some decided to go on their own after a few days. Who does not like French Food in France? The Club Med food experience and service was fabulous, with all you can eat and drink. The Oysters and the French Beer were a great hit.

The other non-skiing activities were also included. Gwen enjoyed the nordic/cross country skiing in Les Menuires for 2 days. Trails and snow were good. Craig, Ross, Eric & Tim had their butt kicked on the CosmoJet at Meribel. Per the website, this is a toboggan ride, which you lay on your back and go. It is a 3km racing run which apparently gives you an "adrenaline and thrill ride with twists and turns. Per Tim, "you did not have much control, it looked easy, but they will stick to skiing". For Tim to say that he must have experienced more than a "thrill".

Tim gathered everyone for group party on Thursday at one of the Club Med bars, to recap the week's experience. Everyone enjoyed themselves. Of course, inclusive means you have the opportunity to try many "libations". Some tried and enjoyed the local French Genepi (zenapi), which is a herbal liqueur or aperitif which is from the French Savory region.

Traveling to Europe has been become less restrictive as the World works with the changing environment. I hope that the travel industry works out the "requirements" for a smoother 2023 Europe travel experience.
