
#### Ptarmigans Hit The Links by Mary Laronge

# EPSC Eastern Council Trip 2023 Saddleback, Maine Feb 26 to March 3, 2023

EPSC is happy to announce our Eastern Council Trip for 2023. We have chosen Saddleback, Maine as the destination since many people in our EPSC member clubs may not have skied Saddleback in the past and this will offer some new experiences for our club members. Saddleback was open for many years but closed in 2015. The resort remained closed until 2020, but, under new management and significant investment, Saddleback reopened for the 2020-21 season. Saddleback is the third largest ski area in Maine and offers a good variety of skiing for all levels.

#### Trip Information:

The Trip will be run as a Council drive-it-yourself trip that anyone from any EPSC club can participate in. Here is the key trip information that you need to plan your trip:

#### Trip includes:

- 5 Nights Lodging: Rangeley Inn
- Pizza party buffet midweek
- Lift tickets (\$50/day) see options below. Same price for all ages
- All taxes and gratuities

All of the accommodations have been renovated within the last 8 years, and they have private bathrooms, individual heat control, satellite TV, free WiFi, telephones, and coffee makers. Rooms are located on the first or second floors of the historic inn, and the Inn does not have an elevator. The following rate is per person, based on double occupancy, for rooms with one queen bed OR one king bed OR two queen beds. Tax is included. Meals are additional. Trip Pricing for various packages:

- 5-day Lift/Lodging Option = \$756.00 per person
