

Code of Conduct – Parents, Careers and Spectators 2025-2026 Season

We all have a responsibility to promote a high standard of behaviour in the game. Here at Doveridge Football Club and Doveridge Juniors Football Club it is essential that our parents/carers and spectators play their part and adhere to our codes of conduct to provide a safe and positive environment.

Remember children's football is a time for them to develop their technical, physical, tactical, and social skills. Winning isn't everything.

To play your part in, I will:

- Remember that children play for FUN
- Applaud effort and good play as well as success
- Respect the Referee's decisions even when you don't agree with them
- Appreciate good play from whatever team it comes from
- Remain behind the touchline and within the Designated Spectators' Area (where provided)
- Let the coach do their job and not confuse the players by telling them what to do
- Encourage the players to respect the opposition, referee and match officials
- Support positively. When players make a mistake offer them encouragement not criticism
- Never engage in, or tolerate, offensive, insulting, or abusive language or behaviour

I understand that if I do not follow the Code, any/all of the following actions may be taken by my club, County FA or The FA I may:

- Issued with a verbal warning from a club or league official
- Required to meet with the club, league, or CFA Welfare Officer
- Required to meet with the club committee
- Obliged to undertake an FA education course
- Obliged to leave the match venue by the club
- Requested by the club not to attend future games
- Suspended or have my club membership removed

In addition:

- The FA/County FA could impose a fine and/or suspension on the club
- The FA believes that Referees and Assistant Referees should be able to officiate free from the threat of violence or intimidation Any physical assault on a Match Official will result in a lengthy or permanent exclusion from football and possibly a criminal prosecution
