

- If possible, prepare your Australian-themed Crock-Pot and Dessert Challenge entries using locally sourced fresh food.





Since 1967, Allan has delivered a message of hope, driving the inner-city streets of the Twin Cities between 9 PM and 10 AM, to help those most in need.

Allen also responds to calls for help 24/7

Minneapolis Recreation Development, Inc. (LoveOneAnother363.org) is a 501(c)(3) organization.

Who is Allen Law?

Allan was a teacher in the Inner-City Minneapolis Public School System for 32 years, and founded Minneapolis Recreation Development, Inc. 1967. Since its founding the Mission of MRD has been: "Love One Another" and the Guiding Principle: "Judge our society by how we care for our children and the disadvantaged."

In 1996 Minneapolis Recreation Development, Inc. was granted 501(c) (3) Nonprofit Status which has helped offset the increasing needs in the community and ongoing expenses. MRD is an all-volunteer non-profit with no salaries serving the homeless, poor, vulnerable, disadvantaged youth, and their families in the Twin Cities every day with food assistance, and a variety of other emergency needs through Three Core Programs.

All donations are used for general operating expenses, or program specific funding. MRD does not have an office but is based out of Alan's apartment where he maintains 10 freezers to store sandwiches, and other program items. Additional sandwich storage freezers are located at a few volunteer drop sites in the Twin Cities.
