Allen Law "The Sandwich Man"

Greetings fellow Lions,

For the past 57 years, Allan Law has been on the city streets and under the bridges feeding the homeless in our communities.

Because he has been handing out approximately 900,000 sandwiches each year, he has become nationally known as "The Sandwich Man."

Working 15 to 18 hours a day, seven days a week, with only two or three hours of sleep each night has finally caught up with him. Allan will be 80 years old in December, and is suffering with both prostrate and bladder cancer, and uses a wheelchair.

But Allan is still very enthusiastic about feeding the homeless, so he has hired a very dedicated individual, Trace Masse, to continue his mission.

This past month several Lions from both the Eden Prairie and Bloomington Lions clubs have been helping Allan's "Love One Another" Charity sort and donate items from his storage facilities, and sell some of the shelving, which is an ongoing project.

Allan's medical bills have been piling up, and this, along with the need to pay Trace for continuing to deliver food and clothing to the homeless, has Allan down, but not out. Allan is hurting.

Allan has been a friend of the Lions for many years and has spoken to most of our 5M5 clubs. He would really appreciate a card and has asked us to pray for him.

• One of our MD5M Lions experienced a health issue while participating in an MD5M convention activity. He was taken to a Winnipeg hospital for evaluation, but ultimately wanted to get back to Minnesota for care. Two Lion said yes to driving him, his wife, and their vehicle to Fargo where they were met by two Lions who left a long-awaited concert 10 minutes after it started to drive to Fargo. They transported the Lion, his wife and vehicle to St. Cloud for the care needed. Arrivals to St. Cloud and back to Winnipeg were in the middle to the night. All ended well. The Lion who was hospitalized was treated and discharged to home a few days later. As noted during a convention update about all the Lions involved, "That's what Lions do."

• Lions have connections that make a difference. 5M5 Lions were recognized by IP Lion Patti for helping a family and their infant who desperately needed specialty medical care. One phone call led to another phone call and connections were made. The infant received the needed care. *"That's what Lions do."*



MINNESOTA LIONS DIABETES FOUNDATION, INC.



Founded by members of Lions Clubs, Minnesota Lions Diabetes Foundation (MLDF's) dream is to be a part of finding a cure for diabetes.

MLDF

- raises funds to support research to find a cure for diabetes.
- provides funding for diabetes education, diabetes screening, and programs and services related to diabetes.

Supporting Diabetes Research

MLDF has provided more than \$2.3 million in financial support for research, including:

- Finding a cure for diabetes
- Human islet transplantation
- Generating organs for transplant
- Development of anti-rejection drugs following transplants
- Stopping body's immune system from attacking pancreas islet cells

What is Diabetes?

- Diabetes is a chronic health condition that affects how the body turns what a person eats or drinks into energy.
- The body breaks down food and drinks into sugar (glucose) and releases it into the bloodstream.
- When blood sugar rises, the pancreas releases insulin. Insulin regulates the amount of glucose in the body.
- More than 38 million people in the US have diabetes. 1 in 5 of don't know they are diabetic.

Prediabetes

- About 98 million US adults are prediabetic. More than 8 in 10 do not know it.
- Blood sugar levels are higher than normal.
- With changes in lifestyle, pre-diabetes can be reversed.

Main Types of Diabetes

Type 1 diabetes is an autoimmune reaction that stops the body from making insulin.

- Symptoms develop quickly.
- Type 1 is usually diagnosed in children, teens, and young adults.
- Type 1 requires insulin every day.
- Currently there is no cure for Type 1 diabetes.

Type 2 diabetes does not allow the body to use insulin well.

- Blood sugar (glucose) is not maintained at normal levels.
- Type 2 usually develops slowly and is diagnosed in adults.
- Type 2 can be prevented or delayed with healthy lifestyle choices.

Gestational diabetes develops in pregnant women who have never had diabetes.

- Puts baby at risk for health problems.
- Usually goes away after the baby is born.
- Can increase risk for mother and baby for developing Type 2 diabetes later in life.


VOLUNTEERS NEEDED AT SPECIAL OLYMPICS OPENING EYES

Special Olympics Minnesota Summer Games is at the Stillwater Area High School from June 23-25.

Stillwater Area High School will host the annual Special Olympics Minnesota Summer Games! Roughly 2,500 athletes will be competing in basketball and track and field throughout the weekend. Outside of competition, there will be entertainment in Victory Village, health screenings for athletes, Celebration Ceremonies, and many other activities for everyone! Summer Games is open to the public and family friendly!

The Lions have played a major part in this competition for many years, and will once again host the Opening Eyes screening. As part of the Healthy Athletes program offerings, Opening Eyes provides a complete eye exam, conducted by eye doctors and eye care professionals. During the Opening Eyes screening, Athletes have the opportunity to receive new eye glasses, sunglasses or sports goggles, free of charge! Opening Eyes is presented by Lions Club International.

Opening Eyes in Minnesota was first undertaken by Lions Clubs of 5M5, but we need you to make this screening happen! Opening Eyes volunteers directly impact the health of SOMN Athletes! Volunteers will also have the opportunity to meet and interact with Special Olympics Minnesota Athletes, and also meet Lions from other clubs and other districts. Volunteers will receive a Summer Games Volunteer t-shirt and Volunteers working over six hours will also receive a complimentary lunch.


