It is ok to talk about Mental Health.

Lions should talk about and help raise awareness about Mental Health.

- **25 %** increase in rates of anxiety and depression since 2020.
- **1 in 7** youths age 10 – 19 experience mental health conditions, though many are unrecognized and untreated.
- **14 %** increase of adults aged 60 + live with a mental health disorder. Loneliness and social isolation are key risk factors.
- **20** countries still criminalize attempted suicide, and stigma and discrimination remain against those with mental health conditions worldwide.

Your Club Can Raise Awareness about Mental Health Lions International Week of Focus

October 4 – 12 is a Lions International Week of Focus about Mental Health and Wellness. (LCI has extended the focus timeframe to 10 days before and 10 days after the week.)

During October, your club is encouraged to join Lions clubs around the world in performing service to raise awareness about mental health. There is strength and visibility as clubs across the world talk mental health within their communities.

It is not too late to plan and perform service related to Mental Health and Well-Being. Go to LionsClubs.org/Mental-Health for ideas and resources for your club service activity. You'll find facts, stats, and access to graphics to promote on your club social media pages and website, and ideas such as donating food and toiletries to transitional living facilities for individuals living with mental health conditions. Print facts, stats and resources flyers and take to food shelves for insertion in food bags / boxes during distributions.

October Challenge By October 31, take the lead:

- Ask new club and all club members for their ideas for service activities.
- Share community needs ideas and needs your members collected during September's challenge with your club and determine what your club will do.
- Plan and do service related to Lions International's Mental Health & Wellness Focus
- Share your club's service activities on your club social media pages, website and with your community media and community partners.

Here are some service project ideas your club can do to for Menal Health Service per Lions International:

	Find your region or country's suicide prevention hotline using the <u>International Association for Suicide Prevention's international suicide crisis hotline search feature</u> and promote the hotline at awareness events and on social media.		Volunteer at your local center for elderly care to assist with enrichment and well-being events.
	Use resources, facts and statistics from the World Health Organization and World Federation for Mental Health to create a <u>World Mental Health Day</u> social media campaign with your club, district or multiple district. Share your impact on social media with photos, videos and other assets using the hashtag #WorldMentalHealthDay.		Support <u>Lions Quest</u> social-emotional learning and well-being curriculum for youth in your community. Consider providing promotional support and curriculum delivery for Lions Quest by applying for a <u>Lions Quest Promotional Grant</u> or <u>Lions Quest Community Partnership Grant</u> .
	Donate food, toiletries or maintenance services to a local transitional living home serving disabled individuals and/or those living with various mental health conditions in your community.		Use resources from the <u>International Association for Suicide Prevention</u> to highlight <u>World Suicide Prevention Day</u> in your community.
	Host a walk or event in partnership with a local mental health organization to raise mental health and well-being awareness utilizing the World Health Organization's <u>mental well-being resources and depression infographics</u> .		Provide assistance to mental health agencies and treatment centers by hosting fundraisers, providing publicity on social media and collecting needed supplies.
			Encourage well-being and development of life skills among youth by creating a local social and mentorship group in your community. Get started by <u>watching this video</u> about Camp Conquer, a community-based youth wellness group created by Lions in Delaware, USA.

Another service idea is Meditation, which is a great practice that involves focusing the mind to achieve a state of calm and clarity. Just search the internet for all the information you need to get started!!

MID WINTER CONVENTION 2026

Convention Committee Members Needed

Volunteers are needed to help plan, promote and organize the 2026 Midwinter Convention. If you have an interest in being part of the pride that makes the convention successful, here is your opportunity to learn more about it!

Audio Visual – Coordinate the audio-visual needs and set up with the hotel and their provider AV for you. Be on site to make sure needs are met and troubleshoot as needed.

Ballroom Set-Up for Events – Be involved in the planning for events to be held in the Ballroom and on hand prior to the events to make sure everything is set up correctly.

Collection of coats, socks, eyeglasses and other items – Determine collection site for donations, make arrangements to have donations picked-up on Saturday afternoon. Coordinate promotion of the donations in Convention literature and talking points.

Contests: Crock Pot Challenge and Dessert Challenge - Organize both events, deliver needed materials to clubs, pick up vote boxes, count votes, announce winner at the Sunday breakfast.

Display Tables for Foundations and Projects – Take reservations for display tables, work with the hotel to order and set up tables, consider charging for table, manage set up and organization of tables for the event.

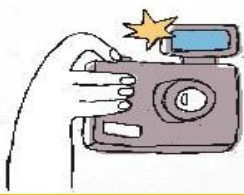
Meeting Rooms – Coordinate smaller meeting rooms with committee by attending committee meetings and determining rooms needed and when.

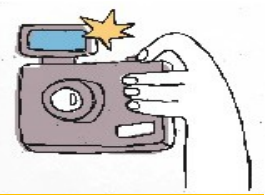

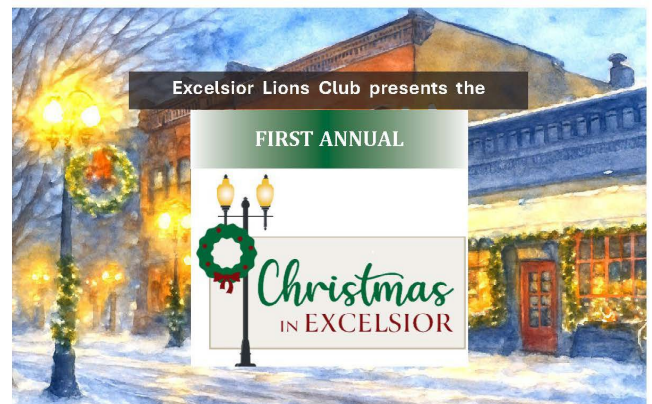

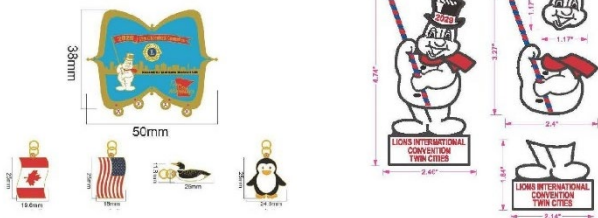
