

# MEDIA TIPS FOR CLUBS

# Quick Tip: The "Impact Tally"

**Tip:** Assign someone to tally key metrics (e.g., meals packed, glasses collected, children screened).

#### Post the Total:

Publicize the final number immediately on social media (e.g., "500 Meals Packed!"). This makes your service tangible and great for recruitment!



# PHOTO TIP: CAPTURE THE IMPACT!

Lion Sarah learned the "Rule of Two Seconds" for better photos:

- 1. Get Close: Show faces and emotion, not backs of heads.
- 2. **Show the Action:** Capture the moment of service (the screening, the delivery, the smile).

Lesson: One clear photo of impact is better than ten blurry ones of effort. Show the difference, not the dust!





#### **CLUB EXCELLENCE AWARD GUIDELINES**

#### Club Excellence leads to Healthier Clubs.

#### Club Membership Goals

- Induct a minimum of two or 20% new members, whichever is greater (not including transfer, reinstated or charter members). Eligibility is determined based on the club's membership count on June 30, 2024. Or sponsor a new Lions club.
- International President A.P. Singh challenged all 5M-5 clubs to do more than the base requirements: to increase club membership up to a minimum of 20 members, and to add across the 5M-5 District the equivalent of 1 new member each day this Lion Year (July 1, 2025 June 30, 2026) 365 new members in 5M-5 this Lions year.

#### **Club Service Goals**

- Report a minimum of 4 service activities to Lions International on Lion Portal.
- 3 of the service activities must show participation in each of LCI's three Weeks of Service: Mental Health and Well-Being, Hunger and Environment. The Weeks of Service dates have been expanded to 10 days prior to the week and 10 days following the week.
- The **purpose of having focused weeks across the world** is the visibility garnered for Lions service by focusing within those timeframes.

#### Club Leadership, and Officer and Member Training Goals

- Report newly elected club officers in Lion Portal by May 15 of each year.
- Club presidents must not serve as president more than 2 consecutive years.
- All club presidents must complete club president training in-person or online no later than December 31, 2025.
- At least 2 club officers (president, vice president, secretary, treasurer) must complete training in person or online no later than December 31, 2025.
- Club Officer Training is offered in person by 5M-5 during May of each year. Online club officer training is available 24 / 7 through Lions Clubs International (LCI) <u>Lions Clubs.org</u> website. Go the Lions Learning Center <a href="https://lci-learnonsite-app-prod.azurewebsites.net/">https://lci-learnonsite-app-prod.azurewebsites.net/</a>
- Annual club officer training (even for repeat / experienced officers) is now required by LCI to qualify your club for the Club Excellence Award.
- If your club officers attended 5M-5's club officer training on May 15, 2025, the GLT coordinator recorded the respective officers as trained in LCI's Lion Portal.
- If your club president did not attend in person training May 15, online training must be completed by December 31, 2025, to qualify your club for a Club Excellence Award. Search for club president training on LCI's website. Go to Lions Learning Center <a href="https://lci-learnonsite-app-">https://lci-learnonsite-app-</a>prod.azurewebsites.net/
- LCI is now requiring 10% of club members complete at least 3 LCI online Lions Learning Center courses no later than June 30, 2026, to qualify your club for a Club Excellence Award.
- Club members may choose which three (or more!) Lions Learning Center courses they want to complete. Go to Learn and choose / complete courses: <a href="https://lci-learnonsite-app-">https://lci-learnonsite-app-</a>prod.azurewebsites.net/

#### **Club LCIF Donations**

- Contribute to LCIF a minimum of the club's membership total on June 30, 2024, of the previous Lion year, multiplied by US \$20.
- Encourage Club LCIF Donations to be presented at 5M-5 Mid-Winter Parade of Green. Writing "Designated for 2026 LCIF Special Olympics fund" in the memo line of the check helps our district support the National Special Olympics games being held in Minnesota June 2026.

#### Succession Planning - Change Up Who is in Office / Leading Committees

Succession planning is important for your club and in providing opportunities for your club members.

- **Club members want opportunities** from club committee membership and committee leadership to officer positions and beyond. Encourage members to seek new roles.
- Encourage your club members to be on committees, lead committees, officer positions.
- Encourage club members to seek to seek into and train for different roles.
- Ask experienced officers and committee leads to serve as mentors to incoming officers and leads.




