District Snapshot (as of 5/31/26)

- **Total Members:** 1,393

Our goal was **fewer than 100 drops**, but in the last two months alone we jumped by **almost 40**. Ouch — yes. But also: **fixable**. And is absolutely **worth fighting for**.

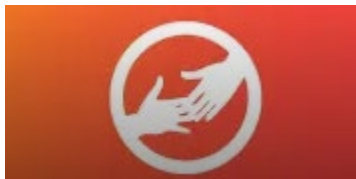

- Birthday Kits for Children: Prepare "Party-in-a-Bag" kits with supplies (cake mix, decorations) for children and donate to local food shelf.
- Make and Donate Goods: Knit scarves or blankets for families in shelters or hospitals.

Autism Assist Dog Inga Opens Blake's World

May 6, 2026

Ten-year-old Blake has autism, which his Mom, Megan, explains as being “a prisoner in his own head.” Blake is mostly nonverbal, with a vocabulary of about 20 words total. He doesn't understand boundaries and is very crafty and insatiably inquisitive. Megan says, “He will walk into anyone's house,” going through their pantry and cabinets. The potential danger of what he might find and apply his curiosity to concerned Megan.

After learning about another Can Do Canines team from the school where Blake's older brother attended, applying for an assistance dog seemed like the perfect solution for Blake. The plan wouldn't be put in place immediately, though. Megan describes the process as “this huge culmination of waiting.” She says, “Everything that you try for your kid ... you always have so much hope.”

Fortunately, Autism Assist Dog Inga, a black Lab and Golden Retriever mix, has “absolutely changed his life.”



Blake has always been especially drawn to animals, with Megan reporting that squirrels, mice, birds, and various insects have seen the inside of her home, with Blake as their escort. Inga is not just any animal that Blake wants to play with, though. “This is more important and more like a member of our team and family,” says Megan. “It's just her presence and energy around him. I think that makes him feel like he's got something that is stable other than me ... He's so much more regulated that we're able to accomplish tasks.” Megan describes Inga “like a bridge to the outside world, and [Blake] can be a part of things that he was never a part of. [She] has given us the confidence for him to be able to try to do other things.”

While brushing Blake's teeth used to require two people, these days, he brushes his teeth while Megan brushes Inga's. Megan adds, “There were times in the past where it would take three tries to get one haircut.” With Inga's calming influence, Blake now tolerates the appointments. Over the holidays, Blake was even able to sit with relatives at a table. “That's a huge improvement in our life,” says Megan. Restaurant visits are finally manageable experiences, as well. “That hadn't happened since he was maybe under 2.” A birthday party with friends over was a new accomplishment for Blake, too. Megan shares, “That was amazing for him to be able to have that kind of a connection with people and for people to be able to recognize him and see him and also that people not see him as

something to be afraid of.”

Blake's visits to unsuspecting neighbors have dropped drastically. Megan admits that she knows every police officer in her city because they had previously been called so often—sometimes multiple times a day—about the child they fondly call “Houdini” for his tendency to “disappear.” With Inga a part of their family, she says, “I don't think I've called the police in three months.”

Instead of calling 911, Megan would probably rather spend time on the phone thanking everyone responsible for Inga being in their family's life. Through tears, she says, “It gives this kind of reassurance that [Blake] can have a life beyond his internal life that he already had. It's opened up his whole world that he easily could have just stayed in. And I just don't know how that would have happened otherwise. It's just so beautiful, and I'm so appreciative.”

GET TOGETHER FOR KIDSIGHT

The Great Minnesota Get-Together, sometimes called the Minnesota State Fair, will once again include KidSight vision screening for children.

The Fair runs from August 27 to September 7, and KidSight will be screening every day. Each District in the multiple has at least one day, but 5M-5 screens on both Wednesday, September 2 and Monday, September 7 (Labor Day). We will need lots of volunteers.

Screening is from 8:30 a.m. to 9:15 p.m. in three-hour sessions. MD5M Lions KidSight Foundation pays for your admission to the Fair. Come spend three hours helping children and spend the rest of the day at the Fair.

There are three categories for volunteering: Greeter, Escort and Screener.

Vision Screener: (2 positions) This Lion will be responsible for doing the vision screening using either of our screening systems, the Welch Allyn SPOT or the PlusOptix.

Greeter: (2 positions) This Lion will be responsible for standing in front of the booth and greeting people with children asking them if they would like to have their children's vision checked. They will carry a clip board with the consent forms and will instruct the parent or guardian in the correct manner to complete the form. They will check the form for legibility and completeness. They will hold the family in the outside area until a vision screener Lion is ready for them. They will then pass the paperwork and the family to the escort Lion. This position requires standing for long periods of time, approaching people and explaining the vision screening program.

Escort: (2 positions) The Escort Lion will receive the consent form from the Greeter. They will bring the family or child to the vision screening position. Once the screening is complete, they will hand the appropriate form to the parent. Last year we screened 3800 plus.
