MESSAGE ABOUT SCAMS

Good Afternoon Fellow Lions,

In the last couple of days we have once again received reports of phishing emails where the perpetrators were pretending to be the District Governor.

The emails I was shown screenshots of, included many of the hallmarks of phishing attempts.

- 1. There were misspelled words
- 2. The email addresses when viewed were junk and definitely not from the DG
- They were trying to trick you into clicking on links or had an attachment they hoped you would open.

Please remain vigilant and review each email thoroughly before you click on something. Unfortunately, there is almost no way to stop perpetrators from pulling documents from our websites and making something the looks like it might be legit.

If you question it at all, do not click on a link and do not open the attachment. Delete the email, and I would recommend you block that email address if your email view has that option.

Scholarship Information

Professor Ken Pengally of Minnesota State University (Mankato Campus) and a Maple Grove Lion has shared some important information regarding college scholarships. For clubs with scholarship program this is great info. For the parents, grandparents, aunts and uncles of college bound youth this is also great information!

Greetings All Lions Clubs:

Here is the site explaining the North Star Promise Scholarship program. https://www.ohe.state.mn.us/sPages/northstarpromise.cfm

This is a significant program for all Lions Club to know about because it affects the awarding of scholarships.

The key point is: **family income**.

If a student's family income is below \$80,000, and, if the student is attending a Minnesota state college or university, then that student qualifies for full tuition and fees. If that student seeks a 4 year degree, the student is awarded money for 120 credits. If that qualifying student seeks a 2 year degree, the award is for 60 credits. The student must demonstrate progress each semester and requalifies each time. (see guidelines cited above)

Minnesota State University, Mankato, has annual tuition cost of approximately \$9500 for the year. That means a qualifying student would receive a total scholarship of \$38,000 over those 4 years (120 credits total). A student wanting a 2 year degree (AA) would receive half that amount for 2 years.

You can read the guidelines as to how other scholarships are handled: they are deducted from the amount the student qualifies for. You will note that the funding will apply to students currently enrolled in a Minnesota state college or university for this fall.

However, on-campus housing costs are not covered by this Promise scholarship. At Mankato housing costs would be \$10,000 a year. I have asked Minnesota State University, Mankato, for clarity on the housing scholarship option I've pointed out. I have several endowed scholarships funded and the Promise may affect how monies are awarded.

I would suggest that the Scholarship Committee discuss the awarding of the annual scholarships. If a student who applies to the Lions Club for a scholarship qualifies for the Promise, the scholarship could be a "housing scholarship" at a state college or university. My reading of the guidelines suggests that this money would then not be discounted from the student's Promise award.

If the qualifying Minnesota student plans to attend a private college or one out of state, then they don't qualify for this Promise Scholarship. They are forfeiting \$38,000 in monies for a 4 year, in-state degree.

The North Star Promise scholarship program is addressing the skyrocketing costs of higher education. Minnesota is trying to educate its labor pool for the next generation by offering students with family income limitations an opportunity for higher education. I believe we should celebrate this effort to help a significant number of Minnesota families.

- Lions do service project Recycling and Diabetes Awareness.

Recycling falls under Environment and 19 of our 44 Lions & Leos Clubs have reported doing an Environment Project.

Where we are lacking is service projects for Diabetes and Childhood Cancer. Only 10 clubs have done a Diabetes service project and 8 clubs have done a Childhood Cancer service project. Will you do a service project in these two areas before the end of the Lion Year?

Here are some ideas:

Diabetes:

- **Collect recipes** and then create a diabetic cookbook and then distribute it.
- Take the At-Risk Test with a group of people in your community.
- Start a Walking Group with club members and ask community members to join you.
- Sponsor a Healthy Eating Food Demo for people with diabetes or pre-diabetes.

Childhood Cancer:

- Drive patient along with family members to doctor visits.
- Shovel Snow or Clean Driveway for a family that has a child with cancer.
- **Baby-sit** for parents who need to take a child to treatment.
- **Deliver Meal** to family that has child suffering from cancer.
- **Donate Gas Card** to family of child with cancer to help with gas expenses, especially if they travel far for treatment.

Diabetes

- 1. Organize a "Strides: Lions for Diabetes Awareness" event.
- 2. Organize a community support group for parents of children with diabetes.
- 3. Volunteer to serve at a children's diabetes camp.
- 4. Invite a healthcare professional to speak about diabetes at your club or district meeting.
- 5. Partner with local healthcare providers to organize diabetes & vision screenings.
- 6. Distribute educational resources to increase diabetes awareness at a community health fair.
- 7. Organize a walking club for seniors with diabetes.
- 8. Provide a diabetes magazine subscription to your local library.
- 9. Sponsor a child in need to attend diabetes camp.
- 10. Donate diabetes books to your library with a bookplate to identify your club's donation.
- 11. Work with your local school to invite a health care professional to speak about diabetes.
- 12. Post monthly articles about diabetes on your club or district website.
- 13. Promote diabetes prevention through a radio public service announcement.
- 14. Sponsor a healthy cooking demonstration for people with diabetes.
- 15. Organize a school or community vegetable garden to encourage healthy eating.
- 16. Work with a community podiatrist or foot care specialist to provide foot screenings.
- 17. Partner with your local diabetes organization to offer programs & materials.
- 18. Promote community resources and online materials from LCI partners NDEP, DECA & IDF.
- 19. Promote the importance of an annual dilated eye exam to detect diabetic eye disease.
- 20. Provide educational materials to schools & physician offices.
