



**The Foundation of Service -** Our mission is to empower Lions clubs, volunteers, and partners to improve health and wellbeing, strengthen communities, and support those in need through humanitarian services and grants that impact lives globally, and encourage peace and international understanding.

**LCIF Awarded Grants** - Between July 1, 2024, and October 14, 2024, LCIF awarded 147 grants globally totaling \$2,828,653 under the cause of disaster relief. This includes refugee relief grants.

#### Global Statistics

- 90% of all natural disasters are water related.
- 25.3 million people are displaced each year by sudden disasters.
- Annual economic losses are estimated at \$250B \$300B.

**Disaster Relief in Florida -** Update on LCIF's support following Hurricane Helene's recent impact in the southeastern United States.

- Since September 27, LCIF has awarded 10 Emergency grants totaling \$150,000 for hurricane relief across Florida, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, and Tennessee. We are still working with Lions in additional districts that are assessing needs, and we anticipate additional grant funding will be awarded soon. Lions in these districts are using Emergency grants first, and then will assess if additional LCIF funding is needed.
- In addition to these 10 Emergency grants, LCIF has also awarded 2 Major Catastrophe grants. Multiple District 35 (Florida) and Multiple District 31 (North Carolina) were each awarded Major Catastrophe grants for \$100,000 each.
- As of this report, LCIF has awarded 12 grants totaling \$350,000 for US hurricane relief.
- Donations to the general disaster fund help us award these grants immediately to Lions who are impacted by natural disasters. We anticipate additional funding requests will be received and awarded to help support Lions continue hurricane relief activities.

# MINNESOTA LIONS HEARING FOUNDAION

As Reported at the October 28, 2024 Cabinet Meeting:

# **Hearing Foundation Minutes**

The Temporal Bone Lab is nearing completion and the Department of Otolaryngology is hosting a Grand Opening on Wednesday, November 6, 2024. This updated lab was made possible by the Minnesota Lions Hearing Foundation and a grant from LCIF.

On Saturday, October 5, the Hearing Foundation Board of Trustees met for our quarterly board meeting. We agreed to move forward with the purchase of portable hearing screening devices from Midwest Special Instruments as a next step to screening children at preschools, school-aged children, vulnerable adults, and seniors in senior living facilities. The Foundation has budgeted funds to purchase eleven devices, one for each district, to be owned by the Foundation.

The University of MN has asked for help in purchasing the Mobile Hearing Van and outfitting it to help with hearing testing in underserved rural and urban areas around the state. The van and equipment costs are \$450,000 with half being paid through the Otto Bremer Foundation, the Manitou Foundation and the University of Minnesota. The U of M submitted a request to the MN Lions Hearing Foundation for the remaining \$125,000. The Hearing Foundation voted to pay this in two installments over the next two years using proceeds from the Walk to DFeet Hearing Loss. Trained audiologists and MDs from the U of M Department of Otolaryngology will staff the van as it travels throughout the State of MN.

Our next board meeting will be February 1, 2025 via Zoom.

# Below is a list of the possible responsibilities for this position, as found in the LCI Standard Club Constitution and By-Laws:

- (a) Develop and implement an annual marketing plan in collaboration with the club membership chair. The plan should consider internal and external audiences, including club members, social media news media, supporters/sponsors and potential new members.
- **(b)** Collaborate directly with the Global Action Team to stay connected to all membership, leadership, and service programs, projects, and events.
- (c) Understand global brand guidelines and support proper use of brand materials in club events and service projects.
- (d) Promote the work of the club on social media. Develop a social media post calendar to follow club service, community involvement, and membership activities.
- (e) Work closely with the club membership chairperson to target and reach out to new potential club members.
- **(f)** Develop club marketing and public relations talking points for club members. Use word of mouth marketing tactics to promote the club and recruit new members.
- **(g)** Working with club leadership, submitting marketing award application for consideration for the Lions International Marketing Award.
- **(h)** Motivate members to be brand ambassadors. Encourage members to take photos, share items on social media, wear brand apparel, and share Lions messages during community involvement opportunities.
- (i) Publicize club activities, including service projects, fundraisers, donations, Lions Clubs International sponsored contests and other newsworthy accomplishments both internally and externally via the news media, social media, and other effective means.
- (j) Assist the club president in communicating information from the district, multiple district and international headquarters with the club members.
- (k) Attend the district governor's advisory committee meeting of the zone in which this club is located when appropriate.
- (I) Participate in meetings held by the district marketing chairperson. If your club currently doesn't have a marketing chairperson, you are missing opportunities to promote your club events and activities in your community. This also means you are not reaching out to possible event participants as well as potential new members.

# SPECIAL OLYMPICS



On a Saturday in mid-October, Special Olympics asked the Lions to offer a vision screening to the athletes participating in the Flag Football State Tournament in Woodbury. About 400 athletes plus family members and coaches gathered at the indoor fields at the M Health Fairview Sports Center.

Lions from several clubs gathered to provide this service and to have some fun. The screenings took place in a storage room right next to the football fields. This room could be darkened to assist in the screening. Because this was a darkened room, some people thought maybe the Lions had been sent there for a time out for poor behavior. However, one look at the angelic faces of the Lions present quickly dispelled this notion. One time after checking in an athlete, he was told to take a chair. He immediately picked up a chair and pretended to walk away. Sometimes directions were taken literally. Some of the athletes enjoyed teasing or joking with the Lions as well as talking about their teams or their medals.

The Lions completed about 110 screenings with about 50% being referrals. This referral rate is quite high although many of the athletes had glasses but did not wear them, and a few had seen a doctor recently and were aware of the issue. This rate also demonstrates the need for the service.

Special Olympics events coming up include the state bowling tournament. This event will take place at various bowling centers around the state. The Polar Plunges will be starting soon all around the state for anyone feeling overheated or wishing to support someone who will take a plunge in a cold pool or lake this winter raising money for Special Olympics.

June 21, 2025 will be the date of Opening Eyes. Lions will assist eye care professionals in providing a complete eye examination and providing free eyeglasses to those who need them. Attending will be Special Olympic Athletes from all over Minnesota as well as athletes from North and South Dakota and Wisconsin. The athletic competitions will be track and field, basketball, weight lifting and swimming, all taking place at the University of Minnesota. More than a thousand athletes are expected to attend these competitions. The need for Lion volunteers will be great to provide this service to the athletes. Please put this date on your calendar and consider volunteering with other Lions from around the state.

The Opening Eyes event and the athletic competitions at the University of Minnesota in June also will help Special Olympics and the Lions prepare for 2026 when Minnesota hosts the US games. A much larger event with more athletes from around the country.


