




















Leader Dogs for the Blind: A Success Story at Lino Lakes Prison

On March 15 researchers from the University of Minnesota will present information about their advancements they are making in research.

- Currently many people who live with diabetes need organ transplants that require taking
 medications for the rest of their lives to prevent rejection of the organ. Researchers are
 working to develop a vaccine that may eliminate the need for lifelong anti-rejection drugs.
- Some cells destroy insulin-producing cells that cause Type 1 diabetes. Progress is being made in controlling destructive inflammatory immune cells.
- Researchers are working towards the approval of clinical trials that will use pig cells, tissues and organs for treatment of diabetes. These clinical trials may benefit patients who are waiting for human organ transplants.
