

The Minnesota Lions Childhood Cancer Foundation (MLCCF) completed its fifth year of operation during the past year, marking a transition from foundational development to a phase of growth and long-term sustainability.

Over the past 12 months, MLCCF has continued to strengthen its partnership with the University of Minnesota, with direct impact at Masonic Children's Hospital. The foundation remains focused on its long-term goal of providing **\$1 million in cumulative support** to Masonic Children's Hospital to advance childhood cancer research and care.

Program support during the year included continued involvement with **Camp KACE**, providing children with cancer and their siblings access to a medically supported camp experience, and expansion of the **MLCCF Match Program**, enabling Lions clubs and donors to maximize the impact of their contributions.

MLCCF also expanded community engagement through partnerships and events, including the **Hamel Rodeo**, **KS95 for Kids Radiothon**, and club-led **LEGO events**, all of which increased visibility, volunteer participation, and financial support.

Internally, the foundation implemented a formal committee structure with trustees assigned to focused areas, strengthening governance and positioning MLCCF for sustainable growth.

As MLCCF enters its next phase, it is well positioned to expand partnerships, increase Lions engagement statewide, and continue building long-term support for children and families affected by cancer.
