Greetings from your SVDG Bruce Strachota.



Did you know that Lions International has added a few more core services areas?

Even though we were already doing service in these areas, we now have Vision, Diabetes, Childhood Cancer, Hunger, Environment AND NOW Humanitarian, Disaster & Youth, See the Global Service Team's awesome articles with service ideas!

Did you know that there are different types of Lion's memberships?

Regular (most common), Family (Lions living in the same house - reduced rate), Student (enrolled in an educational institution, under 30 - reduced rate) and Leo-Lion (former Leos, now Lions, under 30 - reduced rate).

Did you know what the difference between the Constitution and By-Laws are?

The Constitutions contain items which are more permanent and are amended by a 2/3 vote of members; and that Bylaws contain items which are less permanent and are amended by a majority vote?

Did you know that each club has delegates who can vote at the district midwinter convention?

The District Secretary has sent the delegate information to club presidents and secretaries. Please come to the convention and vote!



GLOBAL MEMBERSHIP TEAM (GMT)

Each year in December, there is a significant increase in membership drops, as club secretaries update their rosters in preparation for the upcoming annual dues payment. Now is the time to be proactive to keep Lions from leaving. Here are some things you can do to reduce membership losses:

- Encourage club membership chairpersons to reach out to Lions who have missed recent meetings and other club events. A personal invitation to a club event can go a long way for a member who feels disconnected from their club.
- Ask club treasurers to call members who are behind on their dues to convince them to pay before they
 are dropped. Clubs shouldn't wait until the last minute to collect.

What is service?

Lions and Leos serve in many ways, including:

Service activities: Hands-on service activities, such as tree planting, vision screening, rebuilding homes after disaster strikes or serving meals to those in need



Advocacy: Raising awareness of the causes that are important to Lions, educating our communities on issues that impact them and working with others to bring about positive change. Some examples include hosting a Strides walk for diabetes awareness or visiting a local lawmaker to discuss the needs of the blind or visually impaired.

Donations: Making charitable donations to individuals or organizations, including Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF). Funds donated to LCIF are tracked by the foundation and should not be reported as a service activity.

Fundraising: Raising funds to enable our service.

Service support:

- Holding meetings to strengthen your club, educate members, or plan service activities.
- 2) Fulfilling administrative tasks, such as running errands or maintaining club records.
- 3) Marketing your club to attract new members or forming new clubs.
- 4) Attending Lion events such as conventions and forums.
- 5) Engaging in fellowship and fun, together with other Lions.

These activities contribute to Lions' impact in various ways, but all prepare clubs to serve.

At the recent MD5M Lions KidSight Foundation meeting, we discussed that screening kids from six-months-old to six-years-old is still the founding goal of the program.

During the past few years, we have increased the age range for kids we screen to 18-year-olds. That is because in the course of screening families at community events, we were naturally willing to screen kids over the age of six in the same family with young children.

As a result, we saw that children older than six needed referrals. Our average referral rate of about 10 percent applies to this older age range as well as to the younger kids. And as we have started to screen in more and more public and private schools, we noticed that same referral rate in kids in their teens.

But it is the six-month to six-year group where finding a vision problem can result in treatment that corrects the problem. And when we find indicators for amblyopia, a complete examination can lead to action that prevents permanent eye damage, including blindness.

Any of you with kids, grandkids, nieces and nephews or neighbor's children who attend preschools are in a pivotal position to help us out. Let us know where the children attend, and the parents' names. We can approach the school and refer to the child, giving us some kind of better "in" to start the conversation.

The winter months are relatively quiet in terms of community events, where we ordinarily see many young kids. It would be a great season to do screenings in as many pre-schools as possible. Your help getting us in the door would be greatly appreciated.




