Reporting Your Service

Are you having some questions about how to report your clubs' service in the Lions Portal? Here are some helpful hints to use when reporting:

- How do we report tree planting and care? Tree planting and tree care are popular service activities
 conducted by Lions. The Lions International standard is to report <u>four</u> people served for each tree planted
 or cared for. This standard is based on a report from the United Nations Environment Program.
- How do we report activities that serve multiple causes? When reporting, select the primary cause served,
 or break the activity into multiple activities and report them separately. For example, if you are providing
 vision screening and diabetes screening at a health fair, you can report the vision and diabetes screenings
 as two separate activities.
- How should we report the number of people served by activities that promote our club? Because the direct beneficiaries of club marketing are the club members, you may enter up to the number of members in your club as the number of people served.
- Our environment project, a park cleanup / highway cleanup, served many thousands of people. How should we report the number of people served? The beneficiaries of a cleanup project normally include only the individuals who visit the area on day it is cleaned.
- We provided diabetes or vision screening for 100 people, but each of them has a family who will also benefit. How many people should we report were served? Report only the 100 directly served. There can be many indirect beneficiaries of your efforts, however, for the purposes of service reporting, please limit the number to direct beneficiaries.
- How do we report multiple clubs serving together? Participating clubs should agree on the approach to service reporting. For example, if one club initiated the project and did most of the planning, that club could report the entire activity. Alternatively, if all clubs participated equally, it could be agreed that the clubs report the activity separately. Just be sure that metrics, such as people served, are not duplicated.

We are busy preparing for the next generation of Can Do Canines. We have birthed and whelped four litters of puppies at our Whelping & Growth (WAG) Center in 2025, totaling 22 puppies.



The WAG Center is a temporary solution to our whelping needs while we move forward with an expansion project at our New Hope site. We hope to have construction completed in 2027.

NEWS AND EVENTS

Open House - Saturday, May 17, 2025, Noon- 2 p.m. - Open houses are held quarterly at Can Do Canines' campus in New Hope. Potential clients, volunteers, or anyone interested in supporting the organization is invited to attend to learn how an assistance dog changes the life of a person with a disability. Registration is not required, and all are welcome to attend. Lions members are especially invited.

Graduation - March 29, 2025; 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. - We celebrated 20 graduate teams at our March 2025 graduation. You can view our spring graduation video here. (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=UI3rvaCyBQ0). Our next graduation will be held on Saturday, June 21, 2025.

Growth and Expansion at Can Do Canines - In December 2024, we launched the Unleashing Independence capital campaign to double the size of our campus and achieve our 10-year growth goal of certifying 70 teams annually by 2033. The campus expansion will increase our capacity, upscaling to 70 qualified pairs annually by 2033, all while ensuring the highest standards of care for our dogs. We will double the size of our current facility to include:

- A Birthing & Enrichment Center to centralize breeding and whelping onsite.
- An Early Learning Center to provide a consistent, stimulating training environment for puppies 10-20 weeks of age.
- A **Volunteer Center** to grow our pool of volunteers by making the experience more accessible and efficient.
- Additional training spaces, client apartments, and office space.

Thank You! 5M-5 Lions joined with other MD5M Lions and partners in service to put together 1,000 Low-Glucose (Blood Sugar) Diabetes Emergency Kits at the MD5M Convention.

The kits

- are to be used when an individual is experiencing a low blood sugar (glucose) level (Hypoglycemia)
- include an Emergency Action Plan information card, Glucose Gel pacts and cracker packs.
- are being distributed to schools and other community organizations throughout Minnesota.

Hypoglycemia (Low Blood Sugar)

- Occurs when an individual's blood sugar (glucose) levels drop below a healthy range.
- Requires immediate treatment.
- May occur in someone who is not diabetic.
- May be related to a variety of medical conditions, certain medications, or treatments.
- May be quickly treated, until additional medical help is available, with high-sugar foods, drinks, or medication.
- Glucose is the primary source of energy for a body. If glucose levels continue to drop below a healthy range without treatment, the brain does not receive enough glucose to function as needed to maintain the body and low blood sugar levels occur.
- If the glucose level drops too low for an extended time, a person may experience seizures, lapse into a coma, or die.

Symptoms of Hypoglycemia

- **Severe Hypoglycemia:** person is unresponsive, has lost consciousness, experiencing convulsions, seizures, and coma.
- **Moderate Hypoglycemia:** a person is demonstrating confusion, unusual behavior, blurry vision, tunnel vision, loss of coordination, nightmares when asleep, slurred speech.
- **Mild Hypoglycemia:** a person is alert, but demonstrating difficulty concentrating, dizziness or lightheadedness, fatigue, headache, hunger, irritability or anxiety, tingling or numbness of lips tongue or cheek, nausea; is pale, shaky, sweating.

We want to make it to every event where children are expected to attend. There are a few things we need from Lions Clubs to help make this happen.

We like to get a couple of weeks' notice. That way, if there are conflicting events, we have time to make arrangements with Lions who are skilled at doing screenings so we can cover all the action.

We also need to know if the event is outdoors (probably – it's Summer!) because we will need to use one of our custom tents to make sure there is adequate protection from UV rays for our equipment to work. However, some events that are set up next to community centers might allow for an indoor space for vision screenings. It is all part of the planning process, so again, let us know as early as possible.

These events are a great way for Lions who have never done KidSight to learn how the process works and to get some experience with our Welch Allyn Spot scanners. Some clubs need all of their members to put on the event where we screen, so we might reach out to other clubs for assistance.

Remember that 10 to 12 percent of kids we screen will show some sign of a vision problem. Finding these problems early can make a big difference. Giving a kid the opportunity to see clearly will change that kid's life. Be a part of it.




