



The key areas of service for November are: Diabetes and Hunger Diabetes: World Diabetes Day is November 14<sup>th</sup>.



World Diabetes Day is the world's largest diabetes awareness campaign which reaches a global audience of over 1 billion people in over 160 countries. It is held every year on November 14th, the birthday of Sir Frederick Banting, who co-discovered insulin along with Charles Best in 1922.

The 2025 World Diabetes Day theme is "Diabetes in the Workplace." The campaign specifically calls on employers and employees to "Know more, do more" for diabetes support, highlighting issues like stigma, discrimination, and inclusion in the workplace.

#### **Hunger:**

The best diet for diabetics focuses on managing blood sugar with whole, unprocessed foods, including lots of non-starchy vegetables, lean proteins, and healthy fats, while limiting sugary drinks and refined carbohydrates like white bread and pastries.



- Use clear photos/videos + simple captions (what, why it mattered, who you helped).
- Tag locations, relevant hashtags, members, and partners.















# **Content Capture Tips**

- Action shots, smiles, and connection.
- Short videos of members sharing stories or doing service.
- Show Lions branding (signs, shirts, banners).

# **Content Formats for Growth**

- Reels: Short videos to reach new audiences and grow membership.
- Stories: Real-time, 24-hour updates to engage current followers.
- Carousels: Multiple images in one post for deeper storytelling and more engagement.

# What you can do in your club!

- Assign a content lead for events.
- Capture at least one post-worthy moment at every activity.
- Share posts that tell your club's story and inspire others to join.

# MEDIA TIPS FOR CLUBS

# Avoid Lion Jargon

Remember that your primary audience is the general public and prospective members, not just fellow Lions.

- DON'T use
   acronyms without
   explaining them
   (e.g., "We had a
   great GMT
   meeting!").
- DO use clear, simple language (e.g., "Our Global Membership Team met to plan our next recruitment drive.").

#### **MID WINTER CONVENTION 2026**

The "official" rollout of the Mid-Winter Convention links, flyers, contests, sign ups will be at the ALL CLUB MEETING on November 10, 2025.

Plan to attend or send someone from your club to get the information!

#### **Convention Committee Members Needed**

Volunteers are needed to help plan, promote and organize the 2026 Midwinter Convention. If you have an interest in being part of the pride that makes the convention successful, here is your opportunity to learn more about it! **Audio Visual –** Coordinate the audio-visual needs and set up with the hotel and their provider AV for you. Be on site to make sure needs are met and troubleshoot as needed.

**Ballroom Set-Up for Events –** Be involved in the planning for events to be held in the Ballroom and on hand prior to the events to make dure everything is set up correctly.

**Collection of coats, socks, eyeglasses and other items –** Determine collection site for donations, make arrangements to have donations picked-up on Saturday afternoon. Coordinate promotion of the donations in Convention literature and talking points.

**Contests: Crock Pot Challenge and Dessert Challenge -** Organize both events, deliver needed materials to clubs, pick up vote boxes, count votes, announce winner at the Sunday breakfast.

**Display Tables for Foundations and Projects –** Take reservations for display tables, work with the hotel to order and set up tables, consider charging for table, manage set up and organization of tables for the event.

**Every Day Hero Awards –** Promote Every Day Hero Awards, receive applications and checks for the awards. Create slides with picture and informational bullets for the Award Program. Assemble plaques and certificates to be presented.

**First Timer Contest –** Prepare contest form to be distributed to new attendees. Collect completed forms, score forms and announce winner at the Sunday Breakfast.

**Hospitality Books & Meal Tickets -** Receive orders for hospitality books and meal tickets, deliver tickets and books to recipients. Prepare counts for hotel guarantees, collect tickets at events. Sell extra tickets/seats prior to events.

**Hospitality Room Theme Competition and Judging –** Prepare judging form, appoint judges, count score, announce winners at Sunday Breakfast.

#### My "Ah-Ah" Moment – The Day I Truly Become a Lion

We all have a moment in time when we *become* a Lion — not just in name, but in heart. That "Ah-ha" moment when service becomes more than what we do — it becomes *who we are*. Some of us have had several of these moments, and some are still waiting for that first spark. I'd like to share mine with you. It happened on **April 25, 2025**, at about **8:30 p.m.**, the last night of the **Brooklyn Park Smelt Fry**.

Because of blood clots in my ankle, I was sitting in the back, running the beer tap instead of my usual place in the kitchen. As I sat there, a woman and her husband walked up to me. I was told I should come talk to you. Oh sure, what can I help you with? She said, "You've already helped. I just wanted to say thank you. That caught me by surprise. I asked, "You're welcome — but what did I help with?

She introduced herself as **Carmelita** and told me that she and her husband travel to the **Philippines** to help restore sight to people in need. Her husband measures each person's eyes, and then they help match them with a pair of donated eyeglasses. She said, we've heard that you and your Lions Club collect glasses — and because of Lions like you, so many people can see again. I just wanted to say thank you. That moment gave me goosebumps. As Lions, we spend hours collecting, cleaning, and boxing eyeglasses — and often never see where they go or who they help. But in that instant, everything came full circle. **Carmelita** later sent me photos of people in the Philippines receiving those very glasses. Faces lit up with joy, gratitude, and wonder — people who could now read, work, and truly see the world again.

That was my **Ah-Ha Moment**. The moment I *became* a Lion. I was meant to be right there, at that place and time, hearing that story. It filled my heart, gave me goosebumps, and even brought tears to my eyes.

I share this with all of you because it reminded me that **it's not just one of us who makes this possible** — **it's all of us together.** Each pair of glasses, each volunteer hour, each event — it all adds up to something extraordinary. We are more than a club. We are a movement of compassion and service that stretches around the world.

Together, we make the difference.
Together, we lead to serve with passion.






