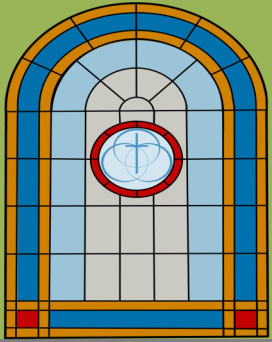

From The Pastor...

Stewardship Matters

As I write this on the first day of Fall, I am reminded of what this season of the year means to the life of almost any church. Interestingly, we start thinking about our “Fall” schedule as beginning when the opening days of school roll around. That might seem odd but it’s how our minds work. We have a hint of Fall in the air as the temperature is somewhat cooler and we have experienced a small amount of rain.

I would be willing to say that for a very large percentage of churches there is a common denominator which occurs every Fall. Stewardship. It might not be in the Fall but it will be soon after the first of the year if not the Fall. This happens because we are beginning to look toward a new calendar year and the financial requirements of the church in the new year. We want to be prudent and make decisions which model good stewardship. With that comes some type of campaign concluding with a commitment. This gives the church some idea of expected income and the mission and ministry the church undertakes.

I have a couple of questions for you to ponder as we think about stewardship and how it impacts our life. Hopefully the questions will cause you to think beyond the obvious. I say the obvious because a safe guess is that the entire time you have been reading you have been thinking about money. That’s fair. I am. But I am thinking broader than that as well.

1. Have you ever thought about stewardship being part of discipleship? How we steward our life is a reflection of our relationship with Jesus. If our relationship with him grows through prayer, worship and study, maybe it grows as we give our resources to him to be used for kingdom purpose. Our stewardship of life means all of our life should be an outflow of our relationship with him. Stewardship is a principle of relationship.

2. What if the church prayed and sought the heart of God seriously about what we do next year and simply believed in faith He will provide our needs? We do that with Faith Promise Missions. Why not do it with the General Budget? Most churches determine their budget by adding pledges and anticipated income. We do. So we really live by faith anyway. We just don’t call it that. I want to change the narrative. Let’s honestly seek God for our needs based on a vision for the future and experience the goodness of God.

Stewardship is an interesting and intriguing conversation to me. Thinking about my entire life being a reflection of godly stewardship is challenging.
