SUSTAINABILITY & ASHE UPDATES

At the annual ASHE conference in San Antonio on August 9, 2023, the North Carolina Healthcare Engineers Association was awarded as an **ASHE Platinum Elite Chapter** for the eighth year in a row! Congratulations to the NCHEA membership and the board for their vision to have NCHEA as a leader in optimizing the healthcare physical including ENERGY EFFICIENCY!!! The Elite designation is for excellence in promoting energy efficiency as a key part of healthcare facilities management and NCHEA has been a leader in this effort, being one of the few chapters to receive this every year it has been offered. To obtain this award, the chapter must promote energy management, in chapter updates, newsletters, and conferences. In addition, members must benchmark their energy data the ASHE Energy to Care program and participate in the ASHE Energy to Care Chapter Challenge pitting the chapters' energy reduction against other chapters. Thank you to ALL MEMBERS who participated in the Chapter Challenge this year from Wake Med, Novant Health, First Health and Atrium Health.

The Chapter Challenge is a very important part of the Elite award, and participation of our chapters has steadily grown from 6 hospitals from one system in 2015 to 22 hospitals in 5 healthcare systems in 2022. Although NCHEA did not win the Chapter Challenge, this group of hospitals had a respectable reduction of 0.8%, which is impressive considering the energy intensive equipment being installed, increased patient days and expanded OR operating hours. Congratulations to the Texas Association of Facility Healthcare Management (TAFHM) for winning with a 2.0% reduction overall. There were a total of 7 chapters in the large chapter competition (which included NCHEA) and 5 chapters in the small chapter competition.

What is keeping you from Benchmarking your Energy Data??? While plant operations departments consistently benchmark all kinds of stats – FTEs, contract costs, total budget, etc., benchmarking data is often left out. Why is that – because it isn't asked for? Are you prepared if it is?? Both the ASHE Energy to Care and the EPA's Energy Star programs have tools and dashboards to track energy and water data for FREE! Energy to Care has easy to follow instructions at www.ashe.org/energytocare. Simply input your facilities' square-foot area and then enter energy data monthly and you are on your way! How can NCHEA help you in this? Let me know why you don't benchmark your energy data and what NCHEA can do to help you. I want to hear for you!

The ASHE Energy to Care awards were presented at the annual conference in San Antonio on August 9, 2023, and North Carolina was well represented. The new ASHE Sustainability Champion award recognizes facilities that demonstrate leadership in health sustainability on an annual basis. This went to 10 hospitals nationally and 3 of those were here in NC. Congratulations to these NC ASHE Sustainability Award winners - Atrium Health Lincoln, Atrium Health Mercy, and Atrium Health Union. The ASHE Sustained Performance award is for three consecutive years at or below the facilities baseline energy consumption. Congratulations to these NC ASHE Sustained Performance Award winners - Atrium Health Cabarrus, Atrium Health Cleveland, Atrium Health Kings Mountain, Atrium Health Lincoln, Atrium Health Mercy, Atrium Health Pineville, Atrium Health Stanly, Atrium Health Union, Atrium Health Wake Forest Baptist Medical Center, Atrium Health Wilkes Regional Medical Center. The ASHE Energy To Care award goes to a facility that has reduced their energy consumption by 10% in a single year or 15% over 2 years or 5% in a single year if they were a previous awards winner. Congratulations to these ASHE Energy to Care award winners for 10% or more energy reduction - Atrium Health Behavioral Health - Davidson, Atrium Health CPN Admin Building, Atrium Health Mercy, Atrium Health Pineville, Atrium Health Stanly, Atrium Health Stanly Manor Skilled Nursing, Atrium Health Huntersville Oaks Skilled Nursing, LifePoint Health - Person Memorial Hospital and WakeMed Cary continued on page 7 Hospital.


