

#### How DACA works on land use issues, like a cell tower

The Administrative Hearing on T-Mobile's application for a communications tower at the Ruritan Club was rescheduled for Thursday, March 24<sup>th</sup> at 10:30 in Arundel Center.

fter the January-February Villager reported on the Aproposed cell tower at the Ruritan Club, DACA President Will Biddle was inundated with phone calls and emails protesting the tower. It was clear that the callers and senders believed DACA had approved the installation of a cell tower and they were angrily opposed to it. An anonymous person printed a flyer and distributed it in Royale Glenn (whose entrance off Mount Airy Road is a mile from Davidsonville Road and way beyond the view of the Ruritan property), exhorting those residents to call Will Biddle and to attend DACA's meeting on February 3. (It is DACA's policy to ignore any anonymous tract, message, letter, threat and the like; only signed or otherwise attributable communications, to which direct responses can be made, are worth the time and effort of the board to consider.)

The idea that DACA has official power to allow, consent to, or prohibit any proposed land usage is incorrect. Approval of a cell tower is in the purview of the Administrative Hearing Officer, who listens to all sides that are presented at the public hearing, currently scheduled for 10:30 am on March 24, at Arundel Center.

DACA members and guests are welcome to attend


Executive Committee meetings if they have the courtesy to notify any board member in advance that they would like to be there. The board meets in a small conference room and if too many people show up unannounced, they must stand in the corners or along the wall or outside the room.

The February board meeting was attended by about 20 residents of Rodeo Drive and King's Retreat, some of whom had announced their intention to attend and most of whom had not; only four or five were members of DACA before this meeting. King's Retreat is the community immediately south of the Ruritan's property on Davidsonville Road and has homes closest to the Ruritan clubhouse. Rodeo Drive's community (nine homes) shares the longest property line, to the west along the back of the Ruritan's playing field, which is bordered by tall trees that significantly obstruct the view between the two properties. These residents came with the intention of telling DACA's board to oppose the cell tower.

When members of the group became vociferous, argumentative, and disruptive to the meeting, President Will Biddle had to admonish and (To page 5)

instruct them that DACA is an association of individuals managed by a board of volunteers; that it is not an umbrella for neighborhood associations; and that it serves for the betterment of all Davidsonville.

He pointed out that DACA had three options:

- 1) speak in support of the tower at the public hearing;
- 2) speak against the tower at the hearing or
- 3) not speak at the hearing.

For an organization to testify in a county hearing, the County requires every member of the executive board to sign an authorization to speak, regardless of which individual testifies for the organization. For that reason, DACA's board agreed that if more than two board members dissented from the majority position, DACA would not speak at the hearing. They felt it would be too much to ask any board members to sign an authorization to speak against their own position, unless there were a very clear majority in support of the position being deliberated. The Executive Committee had reached this decision prior to the meeting through emails, and Will wanted everyone there to know that DACA would take no action if the board was split to such degree that minority votes were more than two.

Amid many interruptions, Bill Bittner, Site Acquisition Manager for T-Mobile, described the appearance of the cell tower, the need for it and the reason for placing

it at the Ruritan Club. Ruritan President Bob Tomlinson spoke briefly of the Ruritan's desire for it: the rental income from T-Mobile would be used for the good of community organizations such as the athletic association, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, etc. Board member Tricia Johnson of King's Retreat asked Mr. Bittner what other sites had been researched. The tower is needed within the one-mile radius of the Ruritan site in order to fill a gap in the service coverage area for T-Mobile subscribers. Red Vaughn recalled DACA's positions on the 1974 application for a shopping center across from the corner store (opposed); the Gaug property cell tower next to route 50 (supported), and other land use issues. Bob Carobrese and Kate Fox suggested asking local farmers if they would like to have it on their property, and began making a list of nearby land owners. Land in the Anne Arundel County Agricultural Land Preservation program cannot be used.

It was apparent that all Rodeo Drive and many King's Retreat residents had already reached their decision to oppose the cell tower and that their purpose in attending was to persuade the DACA Executive Committee to support their position. Garth Beall brought a copy of the Beall Property Association's (Rodeo Drive) letter addressed to Administrative Hearing Officer Douglas Hollman, expressing opposition to a cell tower at the Ruritan Club. #### Patuxent River sewage discharge violators near Davidsonville

The Davidsonville area is roughly in the center of the 110 mile Patuxent corridor with some distinctive problems to the north, the south and right here next to home.

After over a year of comprehensive and painstaking research and review of State records, the Patuxent Riverkeeper, in partnership with the Natural Resources Defense Council, has finally completed a compliance sweep of the Patuxent permitted discharge violators.


The bad news is that the two leading contenders are very nearby the Davidsonville community. Our aim has been to determine which enterprises or facilities are the most chronic and persistent discharge polluters in our Patuxent tributary. The runners-up include a potpourri of buggy, outmoded and troubled industrial faculties and wastewater plants that exist by virtue of state-issued permits that are regularly violated and that the state rarely enforces.

The leader of the pack is Dorsey Run Waste Water Treatment Plant (Jessup, Anne Arundel County) with 24 violations between 2005 and 2010 and the second runner up is the Harwood Landfill. The records also showed that, between July 2003 and June 2009, problems at the

Dorsey Run facility and in the sewer pipes leading to it caused sewage spills totaling about 2.2 million gallons of raw sewage. A further 11 million gallons of partially treated sewage were discharged when the plant's sand filtration system broke in late October 2007. The Patuxent Riverkeeper and NRDC are now looking at a variety of tactics to bring these facilities into compliance.

Meanwhile, slightly downstream are two wastewater treatment plants, namely Wayson's Mobile Court and Patuxent Mobile Estates, which recently had state discharge permits up for renewal. The plants use late 1960s and 1970s vintage processing technology in order to treat the sewage waste generated by the mobile home courts they serve.

As many Marylanders know, the state's Chesapeake Bay Restoration Fund collects a fee from residents statewide that is used to upgrade major wastewater plants. However, the funds are not prioritized to benefit these smaller facilities. As a result, the mobile home park's processing plants return treated wastewater to the Patuxent and/or nearby streams that, while low in harmful bacteria, is really high in excess nutrients and phosphorus. In fact, lab scientists at Chesapeake Biological Labs in Solomons, MD, after analyzing independent samples taken by Patuxent Riverkeeper referred to the tests from the two Anne Arundel County plants as "screamingly high!"

The Riverkeeper organization and several citizens petitioned the state for public hearings to review what might be done about these plants. For perspective, there are some 36 wastewater plants that drain into the Patuxent of which 30 are considered by the states as "minors" and therefore low on the list of priority targets for upgrades and subsidies for modernization efforts.

The Patuxent Riverkeeper's concern has been that while these plants might individually be minor contributors to the water quality woes, all 30 of them combined present a regulatory loophole of potentially major proportions. Notably the Patuxent River Report Card produced annually by Patuxent Riverkeeper in cooperation with the University of Maryland Center for Environmental Sciences has repeatedly scored this river at Dfor steadily declining water quality and the Patuxent waters along the Anne Arundel County boundary as impaired for nutrients.

The private operators of these plants in principle

actually benefit economically from low state willpower to more vigorously regulate. The moral overtones of putting a cost burden on residents of modest means was a controversial feature of the public hearings held at Lothian Elementary School during October 2009, when the operator/owners of these businesses indicated that they would have to close the facilities and displace the residents if they were to be required to bear the of cost of upgrading their wastewater plants to present day technological performance standards.

In fact, the state typically has not even required these plants to monitor outflows for nutrients. The mere fact of being a "minor" has relaxed regulatory diligence to the extent we have neither monitored nor capped the nutrients these permittees are allowed to discharge into the waters we fish, swim and draw drinking water from.

The Patuxent Riverkeeper was joined by retired State Sen. Bernie Fowler, sometimes called the "preacher for the Patuxent," who raised genuine angst about a business enterprise whose profit margin—even while serving people of modest means—still relies on out-of-date technology and acknowledges openly that it cannot make a profit unless exempted from the need to re-invest and modernize facilities designed to protect the public health and safety.

It is, of course, the very definition of pollution-based prosperity and unsustainable business. As a result of these efforts, the State has issued renewal permits for now that at least require the owner/operators to monitor for nutrients. The information at least provides empirical data about the quantum contribution made by these generators to an already sick tributary.

Incidentally, the same business venture operates two additional waste water treatment plants on the Patuxent with permit renewals scheduled in the near future.

Drive's primary objection was that the cell tower is unattractive and inappropriate to the appearance of this rural community.

Nowadays it is a mistake to claim that this land is "rural" since the majority of acreage surrounding the proposed site is comprised of small-plot, nonagricultural residences. The few farmers still in business are not the ones complaining about this proposed tower. The Ruritan Club and T-Mobile had previously agreed not to use night lighting on the flagpole and T-Mobile had already submitted its application and plan to Anne Arundel County's Department of Planning and Zoning. The hearing is scheduled to begin at 10:30 am, on Thursday, March 24, Arundel Center, Calvert Street, before Administrative Hearing Officer Douglas Hollmann.

Will had instructed the board members to hear everyone speak, try to be impartial, and then decide what we want to do. The Ruritan is legally bound to proceed and only the Administrative Hearing Officer, the Board of Appeals, and the District Courts have authority to deny the cell phone tower.

After an hour, Will called an end to the discussion. DACA's Executive Committee voted again in March to support T-Mobile's cell tower at the Ruritan Club (eight for, four opposed). As four members dissented, DACA will not speak at the March 24<sup>th</sup> hearing to support or oppose locating the tower at the Ruritan property.

Executive Board members are welcome to support whichever side they choose, but they may not identify themselves at the hearing as being members of DACA as that could be misconstrued by the hearing officer that DACA has taken a position on this issue.

What the Rodeo Drive people must consider is to be careful for what they wish for. As of now, it is not impossible that T-Mobile could put it on another nearby property, and it could be a bigger eyesore for them there than at the Ruritan.

#### A view of the height of the tower

**¬**-Mobile conducted a balloon test on Thursday, February 17, raising a 24-36" diameter red balloon to 100 feet. As I drove south on Davidsonville Road, I searched the skyline but saw no balloon until I reached the edge of the Ruritan field.

Then I drove back to Mount Airy Road. The balloon was not visible from any part of Mount Airy Road. I next went to Rodeo Drive. No balloon was in sight until I reached the cul-de-sac in front of the mail boxes at 3309 and 3317. From there the balloon was visible through the winter-bare tree tops.

Unconvinced, I returned to the Ruritan Club to verify the height of the balloon – "Yes, ma'am, it's at a full one hundred feet."

On to King's Retreat for the next viewing, I drove to the circle at the end, turned around and headed out. The balloon came into sight when I reached the front of 871 and the entrance to King's Retreat Court. There from the top of the hill it was a straight shot to the balloon. A simple pole might easily be ignored, but I would not want to call attention to it with a big flag and bright lights. Heading east down the hill toward Davidsonville Road, the balloon sank out of sight, nicely shielded by the tall old trees that surround the nearest homes. It did not reappear until I reached the rear edge of the Ruritan property. There it peeped between the tops of the evergreen tree border on the fence line next to King's Retreat Drive.


I drove west on #214 as far as the cemetery and could not see it from anywhere on that road.







#### All Hallows' Parish Organ Concert Series 2011

In the last *Villager* it was written that All Hallows was the oldest parish in Maryland, with the newest organ. It should have been written, the oldest in the Diocese of Maryland, which does not include the Eastern Shore.

The Rev. David Robert Green told *Villager* that Christ Church, Kent Island, is the oldest parish in Maryland, established in 1631 by William Claiborne and others from the Jamestown colony. All Hallows, indeed, holds the distinction of being one of the oldest parishes in Maryland, but not the oldest. Carville Earle's 1975 research paper on *The Evolution of a Tidewater Parish* traces All Hallows Parish as a political and geographical entity from 1650, still newer than Kent Island's Christ Church.



In 2011, All Hallows has two more recitals scheduled, to be performed by internationally renowned organ masters. The Brick Church is at 3604 Solomons Island Road at Brick Church Road. All recitals are on Sunday afternoons at three o'clock. Free will offerings will be accepted with gratitude.



#### State Public Works approves Rural Legacy Grant for 185 acres in West River

Annapolis MD (February 24, 2011)

County Executive John Leopold
thanked the Maryland Board of
Public Works for approving \$1.9
million in Rural Legacy Grant
Funds for Anne Arundel County to
fund the acquisition of perpetual
easements for the preservation of
land in the County Rural Legacy
Area.

The Rural Legacy Grant program, administered through the Maryland Department of Natural Resources, provides funding necessary to protect large, contiguous tracts of land and other strategic areas from sprawl development and to enhance natural resource, agricultural, forestry and environmental protection through cooperative efforts among state and local governments and land trusts. Since its inception in 1998, the program has provided \$7,240,000 in Rural Legacy grant funding to Anne Arundel County.

The grant will fund the protection of a 185-acre property in West River, part of a 2,160-acre block of contiguous land including County and State agricultural districts and easements and other County-owned land. Tentative plans are to use the property for organic farming and education tours, as well as the continuation of grain farming. The County expects to close on the property within the month.

"I am pleased that the Governor, Comptroller and Treasurer have approved these funds to help further our progress in safeguarding the County's valuable farmland and forests," County Executive Leopold said.
