





### DACA on the roads

The County must replace the bridge over Davidsonville Branch on Wayson Road between Roedown Farm and the DFRC. The County can get federal funds to assist construction if they make the bridge wide enough to meet federal specifications. Under those specifications, heavy trucks would no longer be prohibited from using Wayson Road based on the weight limit of the old bridge. DACA's concern was whether to risk the loss federal funding by banning heavy truck traffic on that road. President Will Biddle had to reply to the Public Advisory Board with DACA's position on banning heavy trucks on a country road.

In a split decision, the DACA board narrowly voted in favor of asking the Public Advisory Board to incorporate language in their recommendation to Department of Public Works, that DACA would support the widening the bridge to federal requirements if, and only if, heavy truck traffic is still prohibited from using Wayson Road.

The Woodland Beach Fire Department bought the R-1 zoned property on the southwest corner of Rte #2 and #214 to build a new fire house. The problem there is access to water for the fire company. The county water main runs down the north side of #214; therefore the fire department can legally tap into that line by drilling under the road surface to access it. DACA's board voted to send a letter to the Department of Public Works stating that we

have no objections to construction of a new fire house in that location.

Ed Woods reported that expansion of the Davidsonville Park & Ride lot is expected to start this summer. The state owns the old Davidsonville Road roadway property south of the lot. In the meantime, a sign posted there says, "When lot is full, go to Truman lot." Even when Davidsonville's lot is full empty spaces are available at the lot on Harry Truman Parkway.

The South River Federation received a grant from the Chesapeake Bay Trust to clean up the pond at Davidsonville Wildlife Sanctuary. It will make it nicer for the animals and prevent excess water from running into the streams. Stormwater management construction is in the permitting process. DACA contributed \$200 to the Davidsonville Wildlife Sanctuary.

## Harwood Civic Association and DACA vs. Anne Arundel County

ACA and other civic associations and individual plantiffs have entered a suit against the County challenging several zoning changes made by the County Council in Districts Six and Seven during the Comprehensive Re-zoning process. The purpose is to make every possible effort to keep South County rural. Similar suits are being brought against the Frederick County Council amd Queen Anne's County Council.

Russ Stevenson of the Chesapeake Legal Alliance represents DACA, Harwood Civic Association, and the other plaintiffs. In November he wrote, "One particularly good piece of news is that I have found an excellent expert witness who is willing to help us on a pro bono basis. It appears that the Queen Anne's County Council just did the same thing (wrongly upzoning property) with respect to a very large tract of land that their comprehensive plan says should remain agricultural, ... and it is likely that we will be able to cooperate to some extent."

The suit alleges that the Comprehensive Re-zoning Bill 44-11 for Districts Six and Seven failed to implement and is inconsistent with the County's General Development Plan, and therefore violates the Maryland Annotated Code and Section 18-2-102 of the Anne Arundel County Code. It alleges also that the County Council, in overriding the veto of ten amendments, acted in an arbitrary, capricious, and unreasonable manner in violation of Maryland law. The ten vetoed amendments affect re-zoned properties in South County, Gambrills, and Edgewater. (The property on the southwest corner of Route #2 and #214, re-zoned from RA to R-1, has been bought by the Woodland Beach Fire Department. See article on page 6.) Some of the property owners who received the up-zoning for which they applied have entered the suit as Intervenors, seeking to dismiss the suit, claiming that the plaintiffs lack standing in the Thanks to HCA newsletter for information. issue.

## Be an Election Judge



## Where can we turn for help on zoning issues? Growth Action Network

Growth Action Network (GAN) is a grassroots coalition of environmentalists, community associations and individuals who educate and advocate that new development belongs where infrastructure already exists and where it will not harm water quality and the environment.

The mission of the Growth Action Network is to involve citizens of Anne Arundel County in the planning process and in advocacy to allow growth only where infrastructure is sufficient, and natural resources (including water and air quality) are protected, so that all growth will enhance the quality of life in the county for the benefit of residents and businesses.

GAN began in the summer of 2007 when about 40 individuals concerned about growth in Anne Arundel County were convened by the Arnold Preservation Council to see how "smart growth" could be supported. A Coordinating Council was formed to run the coalition by consensus. Now more than 120 members of GAN represent thousands of County residents. Members share information and work together as needed.

Strengthen county infrastructure Clean up watersheds and waterways Reuse existing structures Develop transit for Anne Arundel County Plan for workforce housing near jobs, integrated with market housing

Protect remaining farms, forests and open space **Early accomplishments** 

Brought Eben Fodor, author of *Better Not Bigger*, to lead a day-long workshop on tools needed to manage growth

Convinced the County Administration to include a citizen panel in the fashioning of the County's General Development Plan

Led the effort to establish reasonable impact fees so that development is not subsidized by taxpayers

Initiated regular meetings with the Director of Planning and Zoning

**In 2011**, GAN led community workshops from Linthicum to South County to prepare for the yearlong Comprehensive Rezoning of the County.

Prepared a letter to County Council signed by 24 members stressing the legal requirement to rezone only when consistent with small area plans of the General Development Plan (see page 7).

Assisted communities and individuals preparing testimony before the County Council

Worked with members in South County who sued the County Council for failure to follow the South County Small Area Plan represented in the case by the Chesapeake Legal Alliance. (Please turn to page 12)

### Old Time Churches and Other Inspiring Subjects.

"As I gazed at the details of this lovely scene, My curiosity was aroused..." From Juliana Walch Ammon's "The Long Road Back"

The first lines of Mrs. Ammon's poem could well have been quoted from her life-long friend, author and artist, Mildred Bottner Anderson, Just such curiosity and excitement at the beauty around her inspires Mrs. Anderson's work, particularly her latest book, Old Time Churches and Other Inspiring Subjects.

Mildred Bottner Anderson is a fixture in the region's arts and letters community and the greater Gambrills, Davidsonville, Crofton area. The launch of Mrs. Anderson's second book is coincident with her 80<sup>th</sup> birthday. The book is her gift to the community, her friends and family.

A collection of paintings in oil, water color and acrylic are the volume's backbone. As one gathers from the title, Mrs. Anderson began with churches. "My friends were asking me, 'Will you paint this church?' or 'that church?' Soon I had painted 41 churches, most within an easy driving distance. In fact, with the help of Mrs. Anderson's editor, Gail Enright, the paintings of churches are organized geographically. "You could hop in your car and drive from one church site to the next and make a lovely day of it," Mrs. Anderson points out.

The 201 pages of Old Time Churches and Other Inspiring Subjects contain beautiful plates of 112 paintings. Among the flower paintings, she has captured favorite blooms and plants illustrating her own gardens and bouquets for all to enjoy.

The new book contains a variety of paintings of beautiful old homes and structures including barns, a lighthouse and scenes from Ms. Anderson's travels in Europe. The four seasons are captured in canvases of rolling hills and farm lands. Two paintings are dedicated





## **Baffling the Barber Beavers**

eavers are back in the area and that is a **B**positive sign for the South River! Situated in a flood plain with low-lying spots, Governor's Bridge Road can flood in heavy rains or as a result of beaver activity, as in the past. Last year, the South River Federation reached out to the Department of Public Works (DPW) and asked them to consider installing a Clemson Leveling Device, also known as a beaver baffler. The device consists of a three-dimensional space which can take in water from all angles — a wide-gauge PVC pipe with holes drilled in it — and move it through the culvert under the road. The pipe is very hard for the beavers to plug completely, thus "baffling" them, and hopefully driving them elsewhere to build dams where they won't affect the road. DPW installed this system last June on the upstream side of Governor Bridge Road to avoid future conflicts. Please remember, working towards a healthier, more swimmable and fishable river likely means a return of the wildlife that called this land home long before we did.


