Definition of Narrative Leadership

- Narrative leadership is the strategic use of storytelling by leaders to shape how people understand events, values, and collective identity.
- It links policy goals with shared meaning and public experience.
- Through narrative, leaders frame problems, define solutions, and motivate collective action.

- Rooted in political communication and leadership studies
- Influenced by framing theory and social constructivism
- Narratives help societies interpret complex political realities

Why Narratives Matter in Politics

- Politics involves interpretation as much as information

Core Components of Political Narratives

- Values: the moral foundation of the story
- Conflict: a challenge or problem that must be addressed
- Characters: citizens, leaders, or institutions
- Resolution: a vision for the future


Narrative Structure Used by Leaders

- Story of Self - personal experiences that shape values
- Story of Us - shared identity and collective purpose
- Story of Now - urgency and call to action

- Movements often grow through powerful storytelling

- Modern narratives spread through television, journalism, and digital media
