The Northwest Illinois Land Use Council #1, Envirothon is an annual natural resources education program. The conservation day is typically held at the Palisades State Park, Savanna, IL. Students participate in different instructional stations with topics of Wildlife, Water Quality, Recycling, Geology, Forestry, Conservation Laws, Agriculture, Ecology, Nature Walk, Soil Conservation and many more.

- Previous recipients of SWCD grants do qualify for this educational funding and may apply again.
- Grantees are required to submit a follow-up report to the Whiteside County SWCD's Education Program Board within 3 months of receiving the grant money or notification if the money is not used within that time period.

FISH SALES

The 2024 spring fish sale is underway, with a variety of species available. We are offering a few new items this year including fish food, fish feeders and electrofishing surveys. Channel catfish can not be bagged, you will need to bring containers of water with you for those, see the order form for details. The fish sale order deadline and pick up date are listed on the order form. The delivery will be at our office location of 400 Wilkens Drive, Morrison, IL 61270.

EQUIPMENT RENTALS

The Whiteside County SWCD has 2 Bag a Nuts for rent. There is no rental fee but we do ask for a \$25.00 deposit. We also have 2 tree planters. One planter is a 3-point hitch planter and one is a hydraulic pull behind planter. There is a charge of \$50 for the first 1000 trees and \$25 for every 1000 trees after that. If you purchase 2,000 trees or more from the district, rental is free. A 1-7/8" ball hitch is needed to pull the tree planters. Call our office if you need to rent any equipment.

Rain Barrels....

What is a Rain Barrel?

A rain barrel is a system that collects and stores rainwater from your roof that would otherwise be lost to runoff and diverted to storm drains and streams. These rain barrels are recycled 55 gallon drums with a vinyl hose, PVC couplings, and a screen grate to keep debris and insects out.

Why Would I Want a Rain Barrel?

<u>Conserve water</u> – A half inch of rain can fill a typical 50-55 gallon rain barrel, allowing homeowners to save hundreds of gallons of water during the growing season.

<u>Save money and energy</u> – Lawn and garden watering make up nearly 40% of total household water use during the summer months. This decreased demand for treated tap water not only helps protect the environment, but also saves money and energy.

<u>Reduce water pollution</u> – Rain barrels reduce storm water runoff, which can contain pollutants like sediment, oil, grease, bacteria, and nutrients.

Improve the health of your gardens, lawns, and trees by using a natural water source - Provides an ample supply of free "soft water" to homeowners, providing no chlorine, lime, or calcium making it ideal for gardens, flower beds, and car and window washing. Using harvested rain water offers a natural alternative to the chemicals and hard water that many of our municipal water systems can produce.

<u>To teach and encourage others</u> – You will help to spread the culture of rainwater collection and in turn, help our larger community and the environment.

The Whiteside County Soil and Water Conservation District sells rain barrels for \$70.00 each.

CRP Assistance:

CRP is a conservation program administered by the Farm Service Agency (FSA). Sign-ups and contracts are handled through FSA staff, the technical aspects of CRP are handled through NRCS and associated contracted staff (SWCD's, Pheasants Forever, NWTF etc). NRCS and associated partners develop the conservation plans and job sheets, in addition to certifications and status reviews. Participants with questions regarding CRP and associated eligibility should be directed to FSA however, if the question is technical in nature, it will then be forwarded to NRCS.

NRCS and partner staff with delegated authority as an apprentice planner or certified conservation planner, will have the ability to develop plans, job sheets and complete reviews. Planners involved in the development of a plan or review of a plans implementation, or status will have to provide information as needed, pertinent to contracting issues involved with compliance or implementing a practice. Issues that could arise with the compliance of a CRP contract need to be discussed with FSA and the technical staff or could be appealed to the County Committee.

ELECTROFISHING SURVEYS

Benefits of Electrofishing

We travel across the Midwest to electrofish lakes and ponds for campgrounds, sportsmen's clubs, lake associations, and private recreational lake owners. We create management plans to establish daily creel limits, forage stockings, game fish stockings, habitat enhancements, vegetation control, and address any aeration or water quality needs.

Electrofishing is perhaps our greatest Lake Management Tool! Electrofishing or shocking your lake/pond gives us a great snapshot of your current fish population. In order to create the perfect management plan, you need to take an inventory of what you already have.

How it Works

COLLECT:

We use a specialized boat to temporarily stun fish in a lake or pond. All fish collected are analyzed and then returned safely back to their home.

INSPECT:

While on the water, we visually inspect the fish for diseases and parasites; inspect the dam, spillway, and watershed; carefully observe predator to prey ratios and calculate relative weights; monitor undesirable species or over-abundant year classes; and study the overall habitat and water quality.


MAINTAIN:

For Lake and Pond Owners who create specialized or trophy fisheries, we often electrofish annually to keep on top of spawning success and overall fish health. For most lakes and ponds, we recommend electrofishing every 2-3 years to make sure everything is staying balanced and healthy.






NAGS News:

Whiteside County SWCD Education Fund 2024 Poster Contest

Attention Whiteside County Teachers and Students!!! The Whiteside County Soil & Water Conservation District is again sponsoring a poster contest. The 2024 theme is: "May the Forest Be With You Always".

The poster contest is grouped by grade level: K-1, 2-3, 4-6, 7-9 & 10-12. One poster will be chosen from each group to be sent to the Illinois State Soil & Water Conservation District Office in Springfield. State winning entries will advance to the national contest

Contest Rules: Any media may be used to create a flat or two-dimensional effect (paint, crayon, colored pencil, charcoal, stickers, paper or other materials on regular posters (no computer only special category).

- All posters must be created by an individual student rather than a team of students.
- Poster size must be between 8.5" x 11" and 22" x 28".
- Poster submissions can be digital (Electronic Picture (JPEG) or scanned in) or a physical poster and turned into the Whiteside County Soil and Water Conservation District by March 29, 2024 with the entry form. The entry form attached MUST be submitted for each poster, whether electronic or physical. The 2024 Stewardship title "May the Forest Be With You Always" must be on the front of the posters. This is the only title eligible for the national poster contest. Therefore, please do not put names on the front of the poster.
- Although younger students will most likely receive help in planning from parents or teacher, NACD encourages each student to do as much of the work as possible by him/herself. Entries completed by students in their hand writing and coloring will score better than those designed, drawn and colored by adult assistance.

Prizes: We will have five category winners: K-1, 2-3, 4-6, 7-9, 10-12. Prizes are to be determined.

Category One:

CONSERVATION PRACTICES - Contour Buffer Strips, Contour Farming and Strip Cropping, Cover Crops, Critical Area Planting, Crop Residue Management, Crop Rotation, Diversions, Field Borders, Grade Stabilization Structures (dam/embankment), Grass Waterways, Livestock Management, Manure Storage and Runoff Control, Nutrient Management, Pasture Planting, Pest Management, Riparian Buffer, Rotational Grazing, Stream Bank and Shoreline Stabilization, Terraces, Tree Planting, Upland Wildlife Habitat, Water and Sediment Control Basin, Well Abandonment, Wetland Restoration, Wildlife Food Plot, Windbreaks, and Woodlot Management.

Category Two:
