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BYLAWS OF

PONDEROSA VALLEY HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION, INC.

Article I

Name, Principal Office and Definitions

- Section 1.1. <u>Name</u>. The name of the Association shall be Ponderosa Valley Homeowners Associations, Inc. (the "Association").
- Section 1.2 <u>Principal Office</u>. The principal office of the Association in the State of Texas shall be located in Denton County. The Association may have such other offices, either within or outside the State of Texas, as the Board may determine or as the affairs of the Association may require.
- Section 1.3 <u>Definitions</u>. The words used in these Bylaws shall be given their ordinary, commonly understood definitions. Capitalized terms shall have the same meaning as set forth in the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions for Ponderosa Valley (said Declaration, as amended, renewed or extended from time to time, is hereinafter sometimes referred to as the "Declaration"), unless the context shall otherwise require. In person voting shall include voting by suitable electronic communication system (as further described in Article III, Section 3.10).

Article II

Association: Membership, Meetings, Quorum, Voting, Proxies

- Section 2.1. <u>Membership</u>. The provisions of the Declaration pertaining to membership are specifically incorporated herein by reference.
- Section 2.2. <u>Place of Meetings</u>. Meetings of the Association shall be held in person at the principal office of the Association, by suitable electronic communication system including videoconferencing technology or the internet, or any combination including but not limited to Zoom, GotoMeeting, Google Meet, Microsoft Teams or similar computerized meeting or at such other suitable place convenient to the Members as the Board may designate.
- Section 2.3. <u>Annual Meetings</u>. Regular annual meetings shall be set by the Board so as to occur during the last quarter of the Association's fiscal year on a date and at a time set by the Board.
- Section 2.4. <u>Special Meetings</u>. The President may call special meetings. In addition, it shall be the duty of the President to call a special meeting if so directed by resolution of a majority of the Board or upon a petition signed by Members representing at least ten percent (10%) of the total votes of the Association.
- Section 2.5. <u>Notice of Meetings</u>. Written printed or digital notice stating the place, day and hour, and general subject of any meeting of the Members shall be delivered, either personally by

regular mail, by posting on the "Association's" website (if any), by posting on the internet media (if any) and/or by e-mail, The default method shall be by regular mail, members may authorize electronic communication by completing "E-mail Opt-In Form" located on "Association's" website to each Member entitled to vote at such meeting not less than ten (10) nor more than sixty (60) days before the date of such meeting, by or at the direction of the President or the Secretary or the officers or persons calling the meeting.

In the case of a special meeting or when required by statute or these Bylaws, the purpose or purposes for which the meeting is called shall be stated in the notice. No business shall be transacted at a special meeting except as stated in the notice.

If mailed the notice of a meeting shall be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the United States mail addressed to the Member at his or her address as it appears on the records of the Association with postage thereon prepaid.

If e-mailed, the notice of a meeting shall be deemed to be delivered when sent electronically to the Member at his or her e-mail address as it appears on the records of the Association. It is the Member's duty to keep an updated e-mail address registered with the "Association".

Section 2.6. <u>Waiver of Notice</u>. Waiver of notice of a meeting of the Members shall be deemed the equivalent of proper notice. Any Member may, in writing, waive notice of any meeting of the Members, either before or after such meeting. Attendance at a meeting by a Member shall be deemed waiver by such Member of notice of the time, date and place thereof, unless such Member specifically objects to lack of proper notice at the time the meeting is called to order. Attendance at a special meeting also shall be deemed waiver of notice of all business transacted unless an objection on the basis of lack of proper notice is raised before the business is put to a vote.

Section 2.7. Adjournment of Meetings. If any meeting of the Association cannot be held because a quorum is not present, a majority of the Members who are present at such meeting, either in person or by proxy, may adjourn the meeting to a time not less than five (5) nor more than thirty (30) days from the time the original meeting was called. At the reconvened meeting, if a quorum is present, any business which might have been transacted at the meeting originally called may be transacted. If a time and place for reconvening the meeting is not fixed by those in attendance at the original meeting, or if for any reason a new date is fixed for reconvening the meeting after adjournment, notice of the time and place for reconvening the meeting shall be given to Members in the manner prescribed for special meetings.

The Members present at a duly called or held meeting at which a quorum is present may continue to do business until adjournment, notwithstanding the withdrawal of enough Members to leave less than a quorum, provided that any action taken is approved by Members representing at least a majority of votes required to constitute a quorum.

Section 2.8. <u>Voting</u>. The voting rights of the Members shall be as set forth in the Declaration and these Bylaws, and the Declaration's voting rights provisions are specifically incorporated herein.

Section 2.9. <u>Proxies</u>. Members may vote in person, by written consent or by proxy, except as specifically provided otherwise in the Governing Documents. All proxies shall be in writing, dated and filed with the Secretary before the appointed time of each meeting. Every proxy

shall be revocable and automatically cease upon conveyance by the Member of such Member's Lot, or upon receipt of notice by the Secretary of the death or judicially declared incompetence of a Member, or of written revocation, or upon the expiration of eleven (11) months from the date of the proxy.

- Section 2.10. <u>Majority</u>. As used in these Bylaws, the term "majority" shall mean those votes, owners or other group, as the context may indicate, totaling more than fifty percent (50%) of the total number.
- Section 2.11. Quorum. Except as otherwise provided In these Bylaws or in the Declaration, the presence in person or by proxy of Members representing at lease twenty-five percent (25%) of the total votes in the Association.
- Section 2.12. <u>Conduct of Meetings</u>. The President shall preside over all meetings of the Association, and the Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meeting and record in a minute book all resolutions adopted at the meeting, as well as a record of all transactions occurring at the meeting.
- Section 2.13. Action Without a Meeting. Any action required by law to be taken at a meeting of the Members, or any action which may be taken at a meeting of the Members, may be taken without a meeting if written consent setting forth the action so taken is signed by a sufficient number of members as would be necessary to take that action at a meeting at which all of the Members were present and voted, and any such consent shall have the same force and effect as a unanimous vote of the Members. Such consents shall be signed within sixty (60) days after receipt of the earliest dated consent, dated and delivered to the Association. Such consents shall be filed with the minutes of the Association and shall have the same force as a vote of Members at a meeting. Each written consent shall bear the date of the signature of each Member who signs the consent. Within ten (10) days following authorization of any action by written consent, the Association shall give notice to all Members of the material features of the authorized action.

Article III

Board of Directors: Number, Powers Meetings

A. <u>Composition and Selection</u>.

- Section 3.1. Governing Body; Composition. The affairs of the Association shall be governed by a Board, each of whom shall have one vote. The directors shall be Members or spouses of such Members; provided, however, no person and his or her spouse may serve on the Board at the same time. In the case of a Member which is not a natural person, the person designated in writing to the Secretary of the Association as the representative of such Member shall be eligible to serve as a director; provided, no Member may have more than one representative on the Board at the same time.
- Section 3.2. <u>Number of Directors</u>. The Board shall consist of five (5) directors as provided in Section 3.4.

Section 3.3. Nomination and Election Procedures.

(a) <u>Nominations</u>. Nominations for election to the Board may be made from the floor or by a Nominating Committee. The Nominating Committee, if any, shall consist of a chairman, who

shall be a director, and two (2) or more Members. The Nominating Committee, if any, shall be appointed by the Board not less than thirty (30) days prior to each annual meeting of the Members to serve a term of one (1) year or until their successors are appointed, and such appointment shall be announced at each such special meeting. The Nominating Committee shall make as many nominations for election to the Board of Directors as it shall in its discretion determine, but in no event less than the number of positions to be filled. All candidates shall have a reasonable opportunity to communicate their qualifications to the Members and to solicit votes. The Board may adopt rules governing the procedures for the nomination of directors.

- (b) <u>Election Procedures</u>. Each Member may cast all votes attributed to the Lots which such Member represents for each vacancy to be filled. There shall be no cumulative voting. That number of candidates equal to the number of positions to be filled and who receive the greatest number of votes shall be elected. The directors elected by the Members shall hold office until their respective successors have been elected and qualified. Directors may be elected to any number of consecutive terms.
- Section 3.4 <u>Election and Term of Office</u>. Upon the expiration of the term of office of each director. Members shall elect a successor to serve a term of two years; provided, the terms of directors shall be staggered such that no more than two directors serve terms which expire simultaneously. To provide for such staggering, the director receiving the fewest number of votes shall serve an initial one year term. Directors elected by the Members shall hold office until their respective successors have been elected and qualified.
- Section 3.5. Removal of Directors: Vacancies. Any director elected by the Members may be removed, with or without cause, by the vote of the Members holding a majority of the votes entitled to be cast for the election of such director. Any director whose removal is sought shall be given notice prior to any meeting called for that purpose. Upon removal of a director, a successor shall then and there be elected by the Members to fill the vacancy for the remainder of the term of such director.

Any director elected by the Members who has three (3) consecutive unexcused absences from Board meetings or who is delinquent in the payment of any assessment or other charge due the Association for more than thirty (30) days, maybe removed by a majority of the directors present at a regular or special meeting at which a quorum is present, and a successor may be appointed by the Board to fill the vacancy for the remainder of the term.

In the event of the death, disability or resignation of a director elected by the Member, a vacancy may be declared by the Board, and it may appoint a successor to serve for the remainder of the term of such director. Alternatively, the Board may call for an election for the purpose of electing a successor to fill any such vacancy on the Board. In such case, the Member shall be entitled to elect a successor to serve for the remainder of the term of such director.

B. Meetings.

Section 3.6. <u>Organizational Meetings</u>. The first meeting of the Board following each annual meeting of the Membership shall be held within ten (10) days thereafter at such time and place as shall be fixed by the Board.

- Section 3.7. Regular Meetings. Regular meetings of the Board may be held at such time and place as shall be determined from time to time by a majority of the directors, but at least four (4) such meetings shall be held during each fiscal year with at least one (1) per quarter. Notice of the time and place of the meeting shall be communicated to directors no less than four (4) days prior to the meeting; provided, however, notice of a meeting need not be given to any director who has signed a waiver of notice or a written consent to holding of the meeting.
- Section 3.8. Special Meetings. Special meetings of the Board shall be held when called by written notice signed by the President or by any two (2) directors. The notice shall specify the time and place of the meeting and the nature of any special business to be considered. The notice shall be given to each director by one of the following methods: (i) by personal delivery; (ii) written notice by first-class mail, postage prepaid; (iii) by telephone communication, either directly to the director or to a person at the director's office or home who would reasonably be expected to communicate such notice promptly to the director; or (iv) by electronic mail, facsimile, computer, fiber optic or other communication device. All such notices shall be given at the director's telephone number, fax number, electronic mail address, or sent to the director's address as shown on the records of the Association. Notices sent by first-class mail shall be deposited into a United States mailbox at least four (4) days before the time set for the meeting. Notices given by personal delivery, telephone or other device shall be delivered or transmitted at least seventy-two (72) hours before the time set for the meeting.
- Section 3.9. <u>Waiver of Notice</u>. The transactions of any meeting of the Board, however called and noticed or wherever held, shall be as valid as though taken at a meeting duly held after regular call and notice if (i) a quorum is present, and (ii) either before or after the meeting each of the directors not present signs a written waiver of notice, a consent to holding the meeting, or an approval of the minutes. The waiver of notice or consent need not specify the purpose of the Meeting. Notice of a meeting also shall be deemed given to any director who attends the meeting without protesting before or at its commencement about the lack of adequate notice.
- Section 3.10. <u>Electronic Meetings</u>. Members of the Board or any committee may participate in a meeting of the Board or committee by means of conference telephone or similar communications equipment, or another suitable electronic communication system including videoconferencing technology or the internet, or any combination including but not limited to Zoom, GotoMeeting, Google Meet, Microsoft Teams or similar computerized meeting, by means of which all parties participating in the meeting can simultaneously communicate with one another. Participation in a meeting pursuant to this subsection shall constitute presence in person at such meeting.
- Section 3.11. Quorum of Board. At all meetings of the Board, a majority of the directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, and the directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall constitute the decision of the Board. A meeting at which a quorum is initially present may continue to transact business, notwithstanding the withdrawal of directors, if any action taken is approved by at least a majority of the required quorum for that meeting. If any meeting of the Board cannot be held because a quorum is not present, a majority of the directors who are present at such meeting may adjourn the meeting to a time not less than five (5) nor more than thirty (30) days from the date the original meeting was called. At the reconvened meeting, if a quorum is present, any business which might have transacted at the meeting originally called may be transacted without further notice.

- Section 3.12. <u>Compensation</u>. No director shall receive any compensation from the Association for acting as such unless approved by Members representing a majority of the total vote of the Association at a regular or special meeting of the Association; provided any director may be reimbursed for expenses incurred on behalf of the Association upon approval of a majority of the other directors.
- Section 3.13. <u>Conduct of Meetings</u>. The President shall preside over all meetings of the Board, and the Secretary shall keep a minute book of meetings of the Board recording therein all resolutions adopted by the Board of Directors and any transactions and proceedings occurring at such meetings.
- Section 3.14. Open Meetings. Subject to the provisions of Section 15 of this Article, all meetings of the Board shall be open to any Members, but Members other than directors may not participate in any discussion or deliberation unless permission to speak is requested on his or her behalf by a director. In such case, the President may limit the time any Member may speak. Notwithstanding the above, the President may adjourn any meeting of the Board and reconvene in executive session, excluding Members, to discuss matters of a sensitive nature, such as pending or threatened litigation, personnel matters, etc., or matters that are to remain confidential by request of the affected parties and agreement of the Board. The general nature of any business to be considered in executive session must first be announced at the open meeting.
- Section 3.15. Action Without a Formal Meeting. Any action to be taken at a meeting of the directors or any action that may be taken at a meeting of the directors may be taken without a meeting if a consent in writing, setting forth the actions so taken, shall be signed by a sufficient number of directors as would be necessary to take that action at a meeting at which all of the directors were present and voted, and such consent shall have the same force and effect as a unanimous vote.

C. Powers and Duties.

- Section 3.16. <u>Powers</u>. The Board shall have all of the powers and duties necessary for the administration of the Association's affairs and, as provided by law, may do or cause to be done all acts and things are not by the Governing Documents or by law directed to be done and exercised exclusively by the Members of the membership generally.
 - Section 3.17. Duties. The duties of the Board shall include, without limitation, the following:
- (a) preparation and adoption, in accordance with Article VI of the Declaration, of annual budgets in which there shall be established the contribution of each Owner to the Common Expenses;
- (b) making assessments to defray the Common Expenses, establishing the means and methods or collecting such assessments, and establishing the period or the installment payments of the annual assessment; provided, unless otherwise determined by the Board, the annual assessment for each Lot's proportionate share of the Common Expenses shall be payable on January 1 of each year;
- (c) providing for the operation, care, upkeep and maintenance of all of the Common Property;

- (d) designating, hiring and dismissing the personnel necessary for the operation of the Association and the maintenance, operation, repair and replacement of its property and the Common Property and, where appropriate, providing for the compensation or such personnel and for the purchase of equipment, supplies and materials to be used by such personnel in the performance or their duties;
- (e) collecting the assessments, depositing the proceeds thereof in a bank depository which it shall approve and using the proceeds to operate the Association; provided, any reserve fund may be deposited in the directors' best business judgment, in depositories other than bank;
 - (f) making and amending rules and regulations;
- (g) opening or bank accounts on behalf of the Association and designating the signatories required;
- (h) making or contracting for the making of repairs, additions and improvements to or alterations of the Common Property in accordance with the other provisions or the Declaration and these Bylaws after damage or destruction by fire or other casualty;
- (i) enforcing by legal means the provisions of the Governing Documents and bringing any proceedings which may be instituted on behalf of or against the Owner concerning the Association;
- (j) obtaining and carrying insurance against casualties and liabilities, as provided in the Declaration, and paying the premium cost thereof;
- (k) paying the cost of all services rendered to the Association or its Members and not chargeable directly to specific Owners;
- (l) keeping books with detailed account of the receipts and expenditures affecting the Association and its administration, specifying the maintenance and repair expenses and any other expenses incurred;
- (m) making available to any prospective purchaser of a Lot, any Owner of a Lot, any first mortgagee, and the holders, insurers and guarantors of a first mortgage on any Lot, current copies of the Governing Documents and all other books, records and financial statements of the Association; and
- (n) permitting utility suppliers to use portions of the Common Property reasonably necessary to the ongoing development or operation of the Properties.
- Section 3.18. <u>Management</u>. The Board may employ for the Association a professional management agent or agents at a compensation established by the Board to perform such duties and services as the Board shall authorize. The Board may delegate to its managing agent or manager, subject to the Board's supervision, all of the powers granted to the Board by these Bylaws, other than the powers set forth in Subsections 3.17(a), 3.17(f), 3.18(g) and 3.17(i).

- Section 3.19. <u>Accounts and Reports</u>. The following management standards of performance will be followed unless the Board by resolution specifically determines otherwise:
- (a) accrual accounting, as defined by generally accepted accounting principles, shall be employed.
- (b) accounting and controls should conform to generally accepted accounting principles;
- (c) cash accounts of the Association shall not be commingled with any other accounts;
- (d) no remuneration shall be accepted by the managing agent from vendors, independent contractors or other providing goods or services to the Association, whether in the form of commissions, finder's fees, service fees, prizes, gifts or otherwise; anything of value received shall benefit the Association;
- (e) any financial or other interest which the managing agent may have in any firm providing goods or services to the Association shall be disclosed promptly to the Board;
- (f) an annual report consisting of at least the following shall be made available to all Members within one hundred twenty (120) days after the close of the fiscal year: (i) a balance sheet; (ii) an operating (income statement); and (iii) a statement of changes in financial position for the fiscal year. The annual report referred to above shall be prepared on a reviewed or compiled basis, as determined by the Board, by an independent public accountant; provided upon written request of any holder, guarantor or insurer of any first mortgage on a Lot, the Association may provide an audited financial statement.
- Section 3.20. <u>Borrowing</u>. The Association shall have the power to borrow money for any legal purposes; provided the Board shall obtain Member approval in the same manner provided in Section 6.5 of the Declaration for special assessments in the event that the proposed borrowing is for the purpose or making discretionary capital improvements and the total amount of such borrowing, together with all other debt incurred within the previous 12-month period, exceeds or would exceed ten percent (10%) of the budgeted gross expenses of the Association for that fiscal year.
- Section 3.21. Rights of the Association. With respect to the Common Property, and in accordance with the Articles of Incorporation and the Declaration, the Association shall have the right to contact with any person for the performance of various duties and functions. Without limiting the foregoing, this right shall entitle the Association to enter into common management, operational or other agreements with trusts, condominiums, cooperatives and other owners or residents associations, both within and without the Properties. Such agreements shall require the consent of a majority of the total number of directors of the Association.
- Section 3.22. <u>Enforcement</u>. The Association shall have the power to impose sanctions for violations of the Governing Documents. The failure of the Board to enforce any provision of the Governing Documents shall not be deemed a waiver of the right of the Board to do so thereafter or of the right to enforce any other violation.

- (a) Notice. Prior to imposition of any sanction under the Governing Documents, the Board or its delegate shall serve the alleged violator with written notice describing (i) the nature of the alleged violation, (ii) the proposed sanction to be imposed, (iii) a period of not less than ten (10) days within which the alleged violator may present a written request to the Covenants Committee, if any, or Board, for a hearing; and (iv) a statement that the proposed sanction shall be imposed as contained in the notice unless a challenge is begun within ten (10) days of the notice shall be imposed; provided that the Board or the Covenants Committee, if any, may suspend any proposed sanction if the violation is cured within the 10 day period. Such suspension shall not constitute a waiver of the right to sanction future violations of the same or other provisions and rules by any Person.
- (b) <u>Hearing</u>. If a hearing is requested within the allotted ten (10) day period, the hearing shall be held before the Covenants Committee, if any, or the Board in executive session. The alleged violator shall be afforded a reasonable opportunity to be heard. Prior to the effectiveness of any sanction hereunder, proof of proper notice shall be placed in the minutes of the meeting. Such proof shall be deemed adequate if a copy of the notice, together with a statement of the date and manner of delivery, is entered by the Person who delivered such notice. The notice requirements shall be deemed satisfied if the alleged violator appears at the meeting. The minutes of the meeting shall contain a written statement of the result of the hearing and the sanction, if any, imposed.
- (c) Appeal. Following a hearing before the Covenants Committee, the violator shall have the right to appeal the decision to the Board. To perfect this right, a written notice of appeal must be received by the manager, President or Secretary of the Association within thirty (30) days after the hearing date.

Article IV

Officers 1

- Section 4.1. Officers. The officers of the Association shall be a President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer, to be elected from among the members of the Board. The Board may appoint such other officers, including one or more Assistant Secretaries and one or more Assistant Treasurers, as it shall deem desirable, such officers to have the authority and perform the duties prescribed from time to time by the Board. Any two or more offices may be held by the same person, except the offices of President and Secretary.
- Section 4.2. <u>Election and Term of Office</u>. The officers of the Association shall be elected annually by the Board at the first meeting of the Board following each annual meeting of the Members, as set forth in Section 3.6.
- Section 4.3. Removal and Vacancies. Any officer maybe removed by the Board whenever in its judgment the best interests of the Association will be served thereby. A vacancy in any office arising because of death, resignation, removal or otherwise may be filled by the Board for the unexpired portion of the term.
- Section 4.4. <u>Powers and Duties</u>. The officers of the Association shall each have such powers and duties as generally pertain to their respective offices, as well as such powers and duties as

may from time to time specifically be conferred or imposed by the Board. The President shall be the chief executive officer of the Association. The Treasurer shall have primary responsibility for the preparation of the budget as provided for in the Declaration and may delegate all or part of the preparation and notification duties to a finance committee, management agent or both.

- Section 4.5. <u>Resignation</u>. Any officer may resign at any time by giving written notice to the Board, the President or the Secretary. Such resignation shall take effect on the date of the receipt of such notice or at any later time specified therein, and unless otherwise specified therein, the acceptance of such resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective.
- Section 4.6. <u>Agreements, Contracts, Deeds, Leases, Checks, etc.</u> All agreements, contracts, deeds, leases, checks and other instruments of the Association shall be executed by at least (2) officers or by such other person or persons as may be designated by resolution of the Board.
- Section 4.7. <u>Compensation</u>. Compensation of officers shall be subject to the same limitations as compensation of directors under Section 3.12.

Article V

Committees

- Section 5.1. General. Committees are hereby authorized to perform such tasks and to serve for such periods as may be designated by a resolution adopted by a majority of the directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present. Each committee shall cooperate in accordance with the terms of the resolution of the Board designating the committee or with rules adopted by the Board of Directors.
- Section 5.2. <u>Covenants Committee</u>. In addition to any other committees which may be established by the Board pursuant to Section 5.1, the Board may appoint a Covenants Committee consisting of at least three (3) and no more than five (5) members. Acting in accordance with the provisions of the Declaration, these Bylaws and resolutions the Board may adopt, the Covenants Committee, if established, shall be the hearing tribunal of the Association and shall conduct all hearings held pursuant to Section 3.22.

Article VI

Miscellaneous

- Section 6.1. <u>Fiscal Year</u>. The fiscal year of the Association shall be set by resolution of the Board. In the absence of a resolution, the fiscal year shall be the calendar year.
- Section 6.2. <u>Parliamentary Rules</u>. Except as may be modified by Board resolution, Robert's Rules of Order (current edition) shall govern the conduct of Association proceedings when not in conflict with Texas law, the Articles of Incorporation, the Declaration or these Bylaws.
- Section 6.3. <u>Conflicts</u>. If there are conflicts between the provisions of Texas law, the Articles of Incorporation, the Declaration and these Bylaws, the provisions of Texas law, the Declaration, the Articles of Incorporation and the Bylaws (in that order) shall prevail.

Section 6.4. Books and Records.

- (a) <u>Inspection by Members and Mortgagees</u>. The Governing Documents, the membership register, books of account, and the minutes of meetings of the Members, the Board and Committees, shall be made available for inspection and copying by any holder, insurer or guarantor of a First Mortgage on a Lot, a Member, or by the duly appointed representative of any of the foregoing at any reasonable time and for a purpose reasonably related to his or her interest in the Lot. Such inspection shall take place at the office of the Association or at such other place within the Properties as the Board shall prescribe.
 - (b) Rules for Inspection. The Board shall establish reasonable rules with respect to:
 - (i) notice to be given to the custodian of the records;
 - (ii) hours and days of the week when such an inspection may be made; and
 - (iii) payment of the cost of reproducing copies of documents requested.
- (c) <u>Inspection by Directors</u>. Every director shall have the absolute right at any reasonable time to inspect all books, records and documents of the Association and the physical Properties owned or controlled by the Association. The right of inspection by a director includes the right to make extracts and a copy of relevant documents at the expense of the Association.
- Section 6.5. <u>Notices</u>. Unless otherwise provided in these Bylaws, all notices, demands, bills, statements or other communications under these Bylaws shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given if delivered personally, by electronic communication including but not limited to e-mail, or if sent by United States mail, first-class postage prepaid:
- (a) if to a Member, at the address which the Member has designated in writing and filed with the Secretary or, if no such address has been designated, at the address of the Unit of such Member or Member; or
- (b) if to the Association, the Board, or the managing agent, at the principal office of the Association or the managing agent, if any, or at such other address as shall be designated by notice in writing to the Members pursuant to this Section.
- (c) the default method shall be by first class mail, Members may authorize electronic communication by completing "E-mail Opt-In Form" located on "Association" website. If e-mailed, the notice shall be deemed to have been delivered when sent to the e-mail address as it appears on the records of the "Association."

Section 6.6. <u>Amendment</u>.

(b) Members. Except as provided above, these Bylaws maybe amended only by the affirmative vote or written consent, or any combination thereof, of Members representing at least a majority of the total votes in the Association. Notwithstanding the above, the percentage of votes necessary to amend a specific clause shall not be less than the prescribed percentage or affirmative

votes required for action to be taken under that clause. Any amendment to be effective must be recorded in the County Clerk Official Records of Denton County, Texas.

If a Member consents to any amendment to these Bylaws, it will be conclusively presumed that such Member has the authority so to consent and no contrary provision in any Mortgage or contract between the Member and a third party will affect the validity or such amendment.
