Preface

Very often photography seems to turn its back on reality, escaping, in the name of creativity, along the lines of illusion and shock. Rather than reflecting worlds, it contrives them.

This inventive tradition persists, as witness the use of texture screens, soft focus filters, and handwork on negatives. The underlying feeling supporting this approach is that a straight photograph is purely the product of a machine and therefore not art. Yet this approach is at odds with the real nature of the medium. The photographer starts with an image already whole — an image found, not invented. Because we constantly connect the word “inventive” with “creative” we sometimes forget that creativity can take other forms. Seeing and discovering are equally as expressive of creativeness as inventing. The power of the photographic art is its ability to re-create what is seen in a form that the onlooker feels is real.

The photographic image allows one the time to see, to contemplate and possibly to discover. Photographs that reflect familiar worlds open to us the opportunity for self-discovery.

For many years the famous American photographer Dorothea Lange had the following words of Francis Bacon's posted on her darkroom door: “The contemplation of things as they are, without substitution or imposture, without error or confusion, is in itself a nobler thing than a whole harvest of invention.”

Our photographs are of people and places that are familiar. And while everything that is familiar to one is not always so to another we all have enough in common to make our worlds at least cousins to each other.

Seeing images of situations with which we have a passing acquaintance allows us to expand our understanding of a community. By contemplating photographs of the familiar we see and often discover new things. The cherished dimension for this type of image is that it contains not only the specific but the general.

Introduction

Within a week after our return to Lewisburg last fall, the first American president ever to hold office without the electoral mandate of the people pardoned Richard M. Nixon for all federal crimes that were or may have been committed while he held office. It was the beginning of a year that would see the economy plummet into the deepest recession since the 1930s, the United States end its involvement in the Indochina war, and the Central Intelligence Agency admit to unlawful spying on American citizens. It was also the year that Bucknell liberal arts graduates scrambled — often unsuccessfully — for the few jobs to be had, that campus concern for state and corporate accountability to the citizen and the consumer increased, and that student support for more direct participation and control over their educational experiences culminated in the creation of “Student Voices” and a “Community Free School”. Finally it was the year grade-inflation unnerved college administrators who worried about the market value of their degrees, and predictably, Bucknell tuition jumped by \$400 for the 1975-76 school year.

Gerald Ford, declaring that the former president and his family had “suffered enough and will continue to suffer no matter what I do,” granted an unconditional pardon to Nixon for his Watergate crimes on September 8, 1974. With the new President’s popularity at a low and the credibility of all politicians suspect, Georgia legislator Julian Bond, speaking before a capacity crowd in Coleman theater, said, “The reins of government have been seized by a mighty coalition of the comfortable, the callous and the smug.” Bond described himself as a progressive who believed the system can be put back in the hands of the working people instead of powerful business interests. Shortly after his Bucknell appearance, Bond announced his own candidacy for the presidency.

On the heels of Watergate and the sagging economy, November brought 75 younger and generally more liberal Democrats to the House of Representatives, creating what appeared to be a veto-proof Congress. Six months later the Democratic hope lay in tatters as four attempts to override presidential vetoes failed.

The economy was on everyone’s mind. Seniors read in the New York Times on April 5 that 1975 “may be the most discouraging year since the 1930s” for finding jobs “as hard-pressed companies cut back their staffs, slap freezes on hiring and cancel campus recruiting appearances.” Commenting on the local situation, Raymond Irwin, director of the Office of Career Planning and Placement, said, “Yesterday’s job market is a fairy tale today” (Bucknellian interview, April 11). Nationally the number of positions open to liberal arts students declined by 45 per cent over the past four years, though the opportunities for accountants, computer and math-related majors and graduates in technical fields has held constant. A third of the students replying to the senior questionnaire distributed in 1974 said they were employed.

Though it is too early to know how the class of ’75 will fare, figures for January showed that the national unemployment rate surged to 8.2 per cent of the work force, making 1975 the worst recession year in the post-war period. Spring

colloquy keynote speaker Paul Sweezy analyzed the slump as another example of capitalism bogging down in one of its "chronic depressions." He described the prosperity of the last 25 years as an aberration in the normal business cycle of up and down swings. Continuous economic growth was made possible by the accumulation of a huge national debt and forced spending by the government in defense industries. "The question," he said, "is whether substantial sectors of the working class may not begin, in the not too distant future, to consider seriously a program of radical structural and socialist reform." He believed that a system of "de-centralized" central planning can manage these problems and, at the same time, utilize resources in a rational way."

Speculating on the international scope of the economic problem, Economics department chairman William Cooper said that it's "inevitable" that Americans will have to change their priorities: "the distribution of income and the use of the world's resources have favored Americans so much that those countries that can't afford to meet their basic needs will no longer permit this to go on. The U.S. will have to share with poor countries or else fight them" (Bucknellian interview, October 25).

Ralph Nader put the question a different way before an overflowing audience in Rooke Chapel when he asked: "Who is going to take control of governmental powers? Is it going to be the corporation or a broader variety of people?" His strategy called for consumers first to exercise their power as regulators of the market place, second to press for legislation which curbs the abrasive practices of business, and third to advocate the restructuring of the institutions serving our economic needs. Nader's three-hour presentation inspired a group of students to push for a Bucknell Public Interest Research Group (PIRG) which would hire a full-time staff of professionals to coordinate and conduct research in the consumer's interest on the local and state level. A controversial funding scheme — adding \$5 to University bills (refundable by request) rather than receiving money through the Appropriations Committee of the Association of Bucknell Students (ABS) — was the reason given by many ABS members for their refusal to grant a student referendum on the PIRG's formation thus keeping the organization from forming spring semester.

The accountability of educational institutions to their constituents prompted the "Student Voices" program to lobby for including a small number of students in departmental meetings along with faculty. The most successful relationship developed in the History department where three students with voting privileges participated in the evaluation, promotion, hiring and firing of faculty members. Elsewhere, some departments permitted students to attend in an advisory capacity only.

The other educational innovation arising from a general dissatisfaction with the imposed structure of traditional classroom experiences was the "Community Free School". Over 25 courses from tennis to journalism to law and society were offered by students, townspeople and professors. The "school" initially enrolled over 700, through attendance stabilized at about half that number once the semester got underway. The ABS-sponsored no-credit, no-tuition experiment is expected to continue.

The ABS Concert Committee successfully staged five concerts in Davis Gym — Todd Rundgren, America, Billy Joel, Santana and Frankie Valli and the Four Seasons — proving that rock promotion need not be a money losing proposition.

Student interest and pressure provided the impetus to integrate men and women on six different dormitory floors, two in Swartz and four in New Dorm, beginning in the fall of 1975. Men and women will have separate bathroom facilities but hallways and lounges will become common ground.

Martin House, the women's study center, ended its first year and will continue along with the Critical Studies and Creative Arts houses as a special interest housing unit. Starting in September, Phi Lambda Theta will move into its new fraternity house on the hill, leaving Leiser House to the cross-generational program. That group is anxious to put young and old people under one roof in an attempt to break through the barriers to communication imposed by an agist society.

Excitement over the accomplishments of campus athletic teams reached a fever pitch when the soccer squad defeated LaSalle for the ECC championship, beat Penn State in the first round of the NCAA playoff and travelled to Temple Stadium to play Philadelphia Textile in the Tri-State finals. The Bisons lost 1-0 in double overtime, ending further tournament action and the long season with an impressive 12-1-2 record. The men's swimming and track teams also placed first in East Coast Conference final standings.

The Bucknell community felt another kind of unity — a common loss — when it was confronted with the deaths of Fred Prender, head football coach; Paul Benson, assistant professor of Mathematics; Francis Rice, adjunct associate professor of Management; and Jeffrey Harold, a member of the class of '78. Prender served as assistant football and wrestling coach before leaving Bucknell for Juniata. He returned in 1969 to take the head coaching job. Benson's relationship to the university stretched back to 1934 when he taught mathematics as an undergraduate. In 1960 he retired from business to rejoin the math faculty. Rice, a lawyer in Sunbury, offered the course in business law to management students. Harold, 19, collapsed shortly after his physical education class in Davis Gym. He was pronounced dead on arrival at Evangelical Community Hospital having suffered a heart attack.

Against the political and economic backdrop of Watergate and recession, 1975 will be remembered as the end of an era for United States foreign policy. After 22 years of military involvement in Vietnam, Gerald Ford announced on April 24 that the war in Indochina is finished "as far as America is concerned." Five days later the last Americans and some 150,000 Vietnamese were evacuated from Saigon as the Provisional Revolutionary Government renamed the South Vietnamese capital Ho Chi Minh City. Two weeks earlier the Khmer Rouge successfully encircled Phnom Penh, forced the surrender of the coalition government, and initiated a peasant revolution by driving city residents back to the land. President Ford, commenting on the swift developments to an audience of Tulane students, said "the tragic events in Indochina portend neither the end of the world nor America's leadership in the world." He criticized the "polarized thinking" that believes "if we do not succeed everywhere, we have not succeeded anywhere." At the same time, the Justice Department relaxed immigration rules to permit the resettlement of 130,000 to 150,000 Vietnamese in this country, of which one, a baby, was adopted by William Scouten, an assistant professor of Chemistry.

Within a month after the President called for a national reconciliation over Vietnam, evidence surfaced which showed why much of the distrust between the government and its citizenry existed. The Rockefeller Commission report on the Central Intelligence Agency elaborated on newspaper allegations that the CIA had conducted vast and unlawful domestic operations resulting in the creation of files on 300,000 individuals and organizations, including many anti-war groups. The spying took the form of room bugging, burglaries, wiretapping, the opening of foreign mail, the infiltration of political groups and secret drug testing. Combined with the disclosures during the Watergate scandal, the Rockefeller report confirmed suspicions that the government was regularly infringing on the constitutional rights of many of its citizens.

On campus, concern over the national deterioration of respect for the individual's civil liberties propelled the Bucknell chapter of the American Civil Liberties Union to hold a weekend colloquy and expand its educational programs. Other students belonging to the Lewisburg Prison Project staged demonstrations at the Federal Penitentiary on behalf of prisoner's rights.

On June 1 under gray and threatening skies, President Charles Watts III conferred 600 Bachelor and 33 graduate degrees before a commencement audience of parents, friends and faculty. It began to rain five minutes after the ceremony concluded.

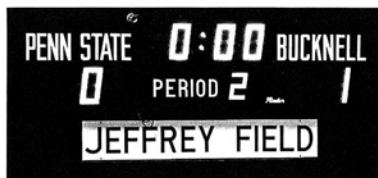

Reflections . . .

To reflect on the Bucknell experience, we assembled the senior women who once lived together as freshmen on the fourth floor of Robert's Hall and asked for impressions of their college education. Moderator and participant Doty Schnure opened the conversation.

"I thought some of you would be willing to talk about what has happened to us over four years. Our hall group has done different things: Marge is married, some are engaged, people have lived off-campus and others have joined sororities. I would like to get some discussion started about what difference these various experiences have made."

Edited portions appear below.

I wonder how much influence the freshman hall situation has on the rest of your life at Bucknell? For instance, half of our hall has done things like move off campus, and I wonder how much of that was due to the influence of the R.A.? She wasn't like "this hall group of your life." We never did do the things like getting hall group T-shirts.

Freshman halls really set the tone for dorm life throughout my four years. You are not forced to grow up; you are almost pushed into this atmosphere where everything is done for you. Everyone acts immature all the time and it's perfectly acceptable. If you want to grow outside of that you pretty much have to do it on your own.

You can see the influence in later room picks. Everyone tries to get together and recreate the freshman hall situation.

Living off campus in an apartment had educated me in a different way. I now have responsibilities and bills to pay. I have to cook for myself, take care of my apartment and get my school work done. It's not easy.

It seems that sororities and fraternities are becoming big again. Drinking . . . the raids . . . and last year's streaking, for example. Our class was at the tail end of the social activism of the sixties. Now the underclassmen are drifting back to getting jobs and having parties.



I think my expectations are completely different from four years ago. I've gone through a trend from idealism to realism — from fantasy to reality. At the time I thought I knew what I wanted, now I realize that I have hardly begun to discover what I want to do.

I've lived with seniors for the last three years, I listened to them — about how they were scared and nervous and didn't know what they wanted to do after graduation. Last year, I thought I couldn't wait until I was a senior, but this year it is a different story.

For so long we've known what we were going to be doing — a summer job and back to school — and now I see that I never thought beyond graduation.

I think it was easier in our parent's day. They knew they were going to get married, and they did. It's much more confusing when you think about all the options open to us. We won't necessarily settle down and have kids. But I think that when you have so many options, it is tempting not to try as hard and say, "this isn't right, I'll do

something else." Nothing in life is easy. You've got to try.

I think it's interesting to talk to your parents about what they are doing with their lives. My mother is just going back to school . . . and my father just changed jobs last year. I don't think you ever stop being confused about what you want to do.

We're trying to find jobs which are fulfilling while the generation before us often took jobs simply for the money. Now they hate their work . . . But when you look for work you see how competitive everything becomes. I don't like the thought that I'm competing for a job with other women from my class. I feel uncomfortable thinking that she might get the job and I might not.

Now I'm realizing that I finally have a chance to make real decisions about my life — from the question of survival to where I want to live. And it's now when you begin to wonder whether Bucknell failed you or you failed yourself in not thinking about these things before.

Introduction

While different types of institutions do appear to have different effects on their students, the magnitude of these effects is small compared with the effects of the student input.

Most of my friends are people I knew as a freshman . . . I don't know how the Office of Residential Life managed to get together enough people that really sort of had the same kind of ideas.

A Bucknell senior, L'Agenda interview

The questions are: What should the Bucknell Experience do to foster individual growth and self-reliance among members of its student body? And, what is currently happening to accomplish these ends?

Protagonists and antagonists alternately defend or criticize Bucknell's performance as a mold of liberally educated free spirits given to the world as clear thinkers rather than specialists. Recently President Charles Watts III has been speaking before parents and alumni groups on the perils of training students simply for vocations rather than as liberal artists. He feels the pressure from some quarters, he says, to provide the education that will make the Bucknell student employable immediately upon graduation.

This should not be the university's only mission. The economic realities have been forcing the liberal arts into a retreat. Students are more career-conscious than before limiting the time they have to involve themselves in a classical education. 'Give them skills that are marketable' is the cry of the '70's.

As the charges and countercharges escalate we should look at who chooses Bucknell to educate them. Consider some statistics about the class of 1975.

(1) The class of 707 students contained 65 per cent men and 35 per cent women, a 2:1 ratio which has been consistent at Bucknell for a number of years.

(2) Of the entering freshmen, 90 per cent had graduated in the top 20 per cent of their classes and 86 per cent had already chosen a major field.

(3) Sixty-five percent of the incoming class resided in the northeast. Pennsylvania, New Jersey, New York and Connecticut were the most highly represented states.

(4) Parents provide total support for 79 per cent of the students.

(5) Over 80 per cent of the students' forebearers had come from central Europe, eastern Europe or the British Isles.

(6) Ninety-seven per cent of the incoming students were Caucasian.

(7) Almost 87 per cent of the students' parents were either Protestant or Catholic, predominately the former. Sixty-five per cent were Republicans. Twice as many students reported they're parents were conservative than reported they were liberal. The students themselves had a wider range of religious and political preferences.

(8) Sixty-seven per cent of the students' Fathers were either businessmen, teachers, executives or professionals.

(9) Sixty-seven per cent subscribed to the "Collegiate" philosophy of education as opposed to the "Vocational", "Academic" or "Non-Conformist" type. The "Collegiate" philosophy stated that "extra curricular activities, living group functions, athletics, social life, rewarding friendships, loyalty to college traditions are important elements in one's college experience and necessary for the cultivation of the well rounded person." Individuals who were still "searching for the meaning of life" and who subscribed to the philosophy which, "emphasized individualistic interests and styles, concern for personal identity, and often, contempt for many aspects of organized society," numbered only four per cent.

(10) Bucknell had been chosen by 46 per cent of the students because of its general academic reputation, and by 28 per cent because of the students' general impression of the campus and student body.

(11) Projecting ahead, 69 per cent of the incoming freshpersons believed they would go on to do graduate work of some sort after they had completed four years at Bucknell.

These are selected statistics, excerpted from a test whose questions were necessarily limited in their optional responses. Nevertheless, as "facts" they indicate that the majority of the class of 1975 entered Bucknell as relatively intelligent sons and daughters of upper middle class people, holding upper middle class values and beliefs.

The evidence shows that Bucknell attracts and chooses from a relatively narrow band of potential candidates compared to public institutions. Although some administrators point to Bucknell's rare combination of liberal arts and engineering or the university's recent attempts to offer scholarship aid to students from less wealthy families, the Bucknell Experience will not introduce students to people possessing lifestyles or outlooks very different from their own.

It is true that during the nation-wide "activist years" of the late 60's and early 70's Bucknell students were also quite active, becoming more independent of both peers and parents, effecting many changes in university policy and greatly reducing parental control. However, according to **Trends: 1** a report compiled by the Bucknell Counseling Service, student involvement and activism has fallen from its high of 1971 to its pre-1968 level. The Counseling Service regards this return to "normalcy" as either indicative of a regression to apathy and conformity, or as a healthy return to the status quo.

The relatively uniformity of Bucknell's incoming classes speaks poorly of the university with regard to how much an institution can do to promote growth among its students. If our opening quotation has any validity, Bucknell reinforces its own image by attracting and admitting the sons and daughters of the middle class. If the university were to assemble a more diverse student body then a more complete understanding of the full range of human experience would be possible.

A majority of Bucknell students show a desire for further education. In the Senior Questionnaire administered in 1974 seventy-five per cent of the students planned to continue their education. Thirty per cent planned to acquire doctorates. Only one in ten felt a home and family rather than further schooling or employment was a prime interest. In addition, 66 per cent of those replying valued as the most important job requirements the "opportunity to use their special talents," the "opportunity to be helpful to others and/or society in general" and the "opportunity to work with people rather than things."

The conclusions that can be drawn from this before-after profile of the student body must be tentative, but it seems that most graduates want to continue doing what they have been doing or acquire something they missed or didn't have a chance to get at Bucknell. Readers can draw their own implications from the fact that this selected student body wants to continue its education in other elitist institutions.

Bucknell is reaching a crossroads — its traditional sources of applicants are producing students seeking an education that will net them economic satisfaction in later life while its philosophy of education has always stressed the value of the liberal arts. Either it must cater to those traditional sources and watch its liberal arts program wither away from inattention, or it must seek new patrons who desire a more humanistic approach to learning.

However the university decides to deal with its future path it would not be wise to ignore the purposeful cultivation of the creative and sensitive spirit in its students for that would only serve to limit the potentials of their growth.
