Lunar illuminates the path: latest trends and best practices in school library management revealed

During his presentation, he gave a quick preview of the Standards for Philippine Libraries: School Library and Media Centers, emphasizing the importance of adhering to these standards to ensure effective library management. Mr. Lunar also highlighted best practices in library management, including developing a clear library policy, creating a welcoming environment, and building a diverse and relevant collection.

Best Practices for Effective Library Management

Mr. Lunar stressed the importance of promoting information literacy, engaging students through programs, and empowering library staff. He also emphasized the need for schools to use data analytics for decision-making and foster community and collaboration. "We need to create links," he said, encouraging school librarians to build strong collaborations among community members. He also urged librarians to think outside the box and maximize the use of library materials by introducing them to teachers and learners.


Emerging Trends in School Library Management
