Notice of School Survey

Who can respond to the surveys?

About every two years, the School Board has conducted a survey to solicit input from the school community. This year, there are three versions of the survey: one for parents of students currently in Providence, one for parents of students from Providence who are currently attending Plymouth, and one for community members who do not have any students in Providence right now.

Why do we want everyone to respond?

With voluntary response surveys, it sometimes happens that only people with really strong opinions participate. It is much more meaningful if we have a complete picture of perceptions and suggestions.

But just to be clear: For each survey, there is a **limit of one response per family**. We realize that may not serve as well where there is more than one child in the school, but we want this to be conducted in the same way as in the past to allow for comparison with previous results

Can my family respond to more than one survey?

If a family has students in both Providence and Plymouth this year, we are asking you to complete each of those surveys. Similarly, any family with students in Plymouth but not in Providence currently is asked to complete both the Plymouth and the Community surveys. Those with students only in Providence have only the Providence survey to do, and those with no students in either school have only the Community survey to take.

When do I take the survey?

The parent survey will be opened on Friday, February 14, and remain open through Saturday, February 29. The survey for parents of Plymouth students and for the community in general will be opened later after notification in the next newsletter.

How do I take the survey?

A free service called Survey Monkey is being used. The results for the three surveys will be collected anonymously. When the survey period is closed, the results will be reported in a summary of the number of respondents, average scores on each item, and so on. What will the Board do with the results?

The Board will look at what is being done well and where we may be able to make changes to address weaknesses or concerns or other suggestions. The results will not be used to evaluate any particular person. A summary of significant findings will be reported in the newsletter after the Board has had time to consider the results.
